



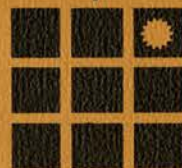

PREFACE

This is the first in a series of curriculum materials on South Dakota and its economy to be prepared for the state Department of Public Instruction by the South Dakota Council on Economic Education. These curriculum materials are designed to instruct the students in the basic concepts of economics and to increase their awareness of their state and its economic, social, and political relationships. These materials will endeavor to demonstrate that people live in an economic world of scarcity and their responses to that scarcity are conditioned by the political institutions which govern them, the social climate in which they live and the cultural backgrounds of those to whom they relate.

The materials project is being funded by a grant from the Department of Public Instruction to the South Dakota Council on Economic Education. Other publications to follow include a junior high curriculum on the South Dakota economy and an annotated bibliography of books, manuals, games, films, and study aids available for instruction in economics education. This bibliography will be keyed to the Social Studies Curriculum Guide K-12 published by the State Department of Public Instruction.

South Dakota in Maps was prepared by Dr. Calvin A. Kent, Executive Director of the Council. He was assisted by Terry Ohnstad, Research Assistant. 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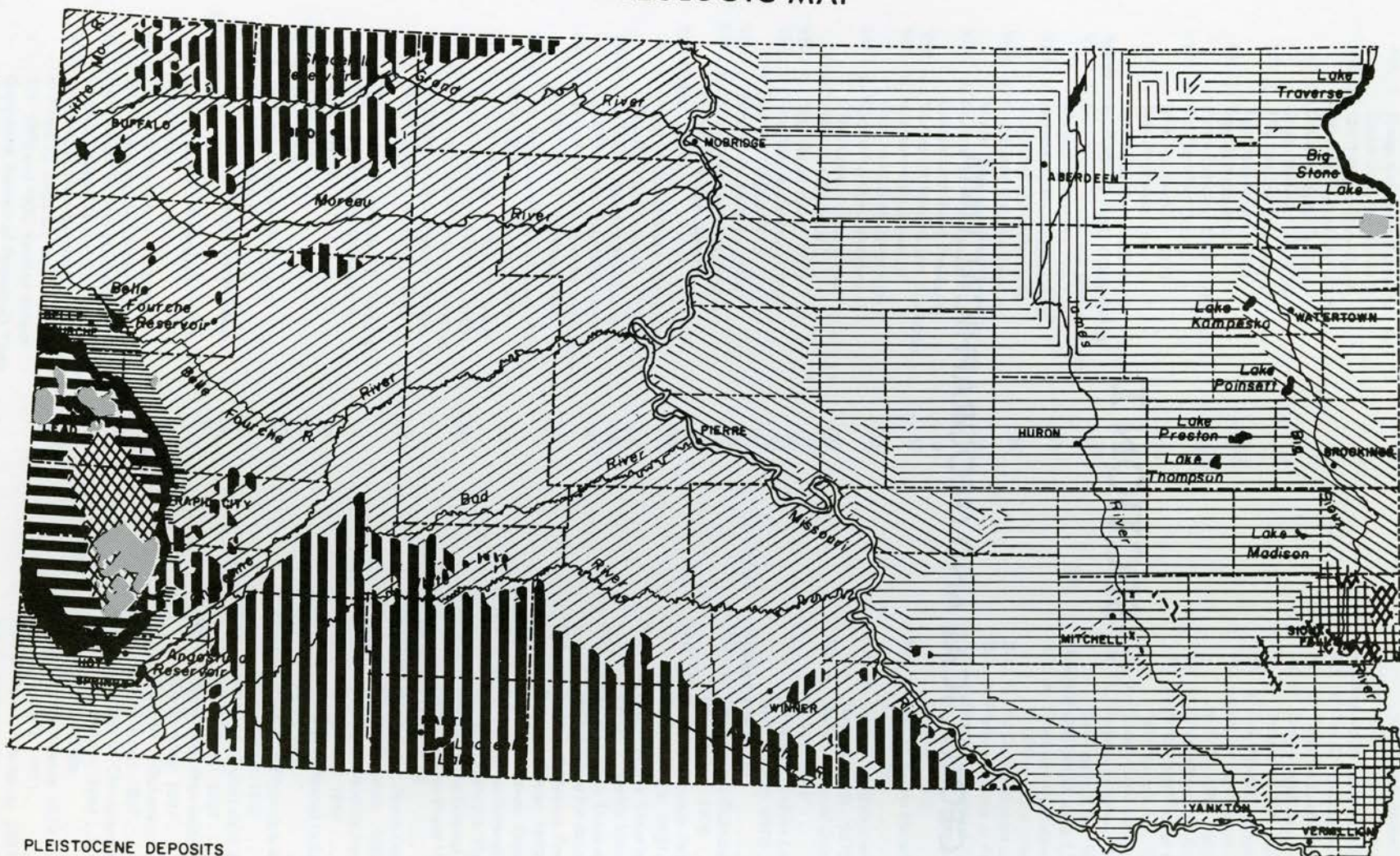

GEOGRAPHICAL NAMES

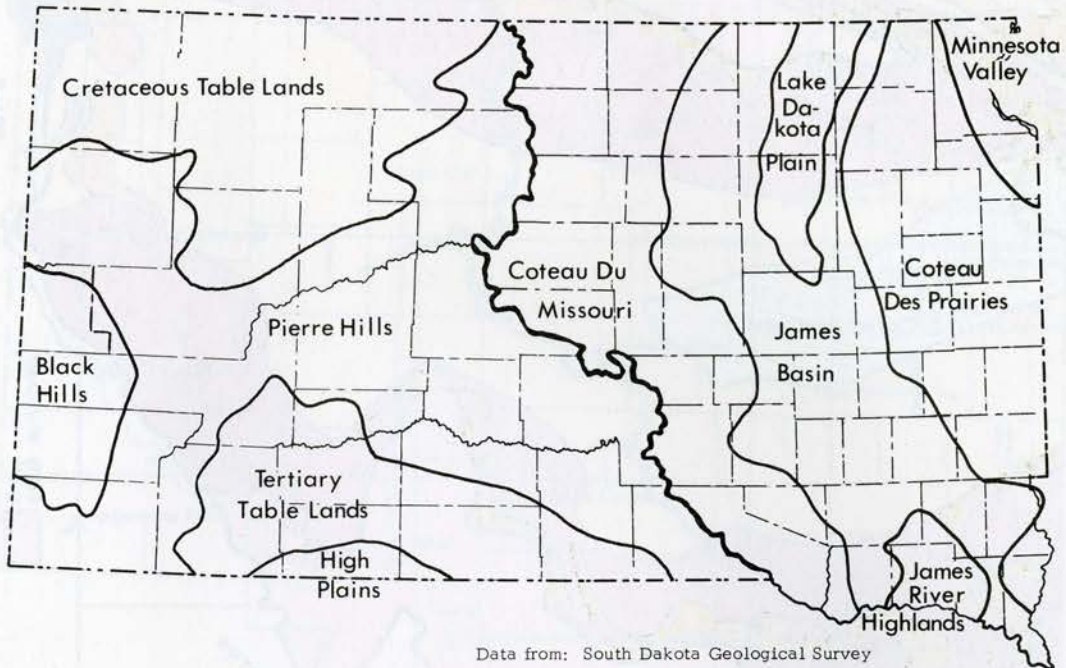

MAJOR SOIL GROUPS

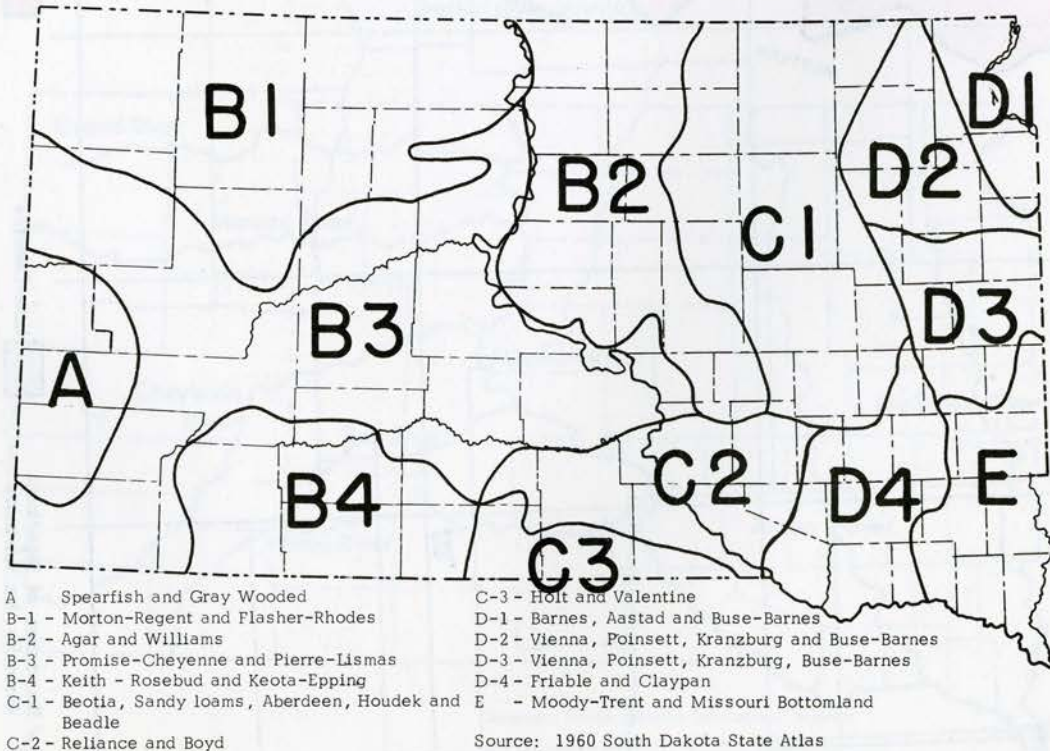
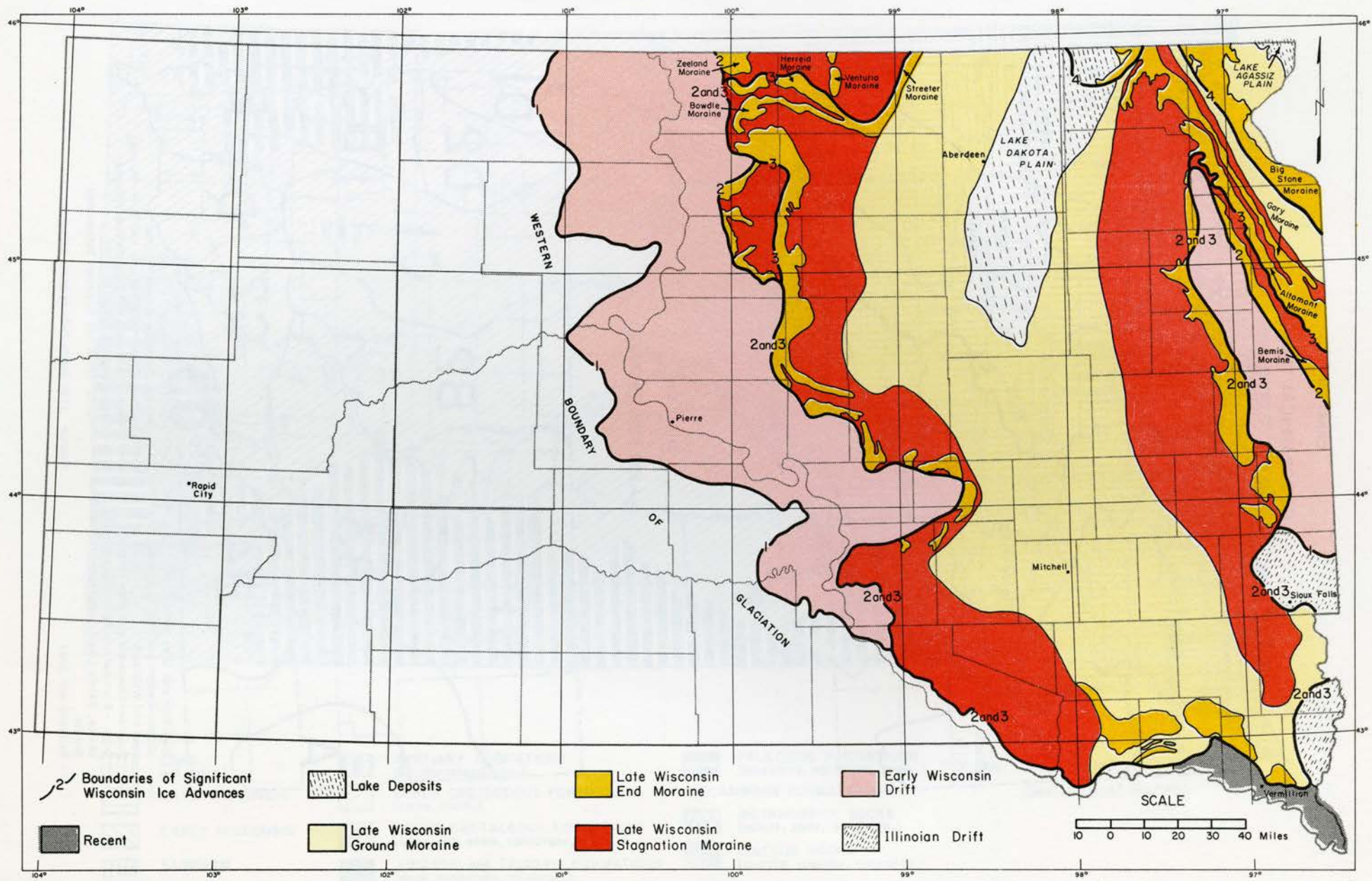

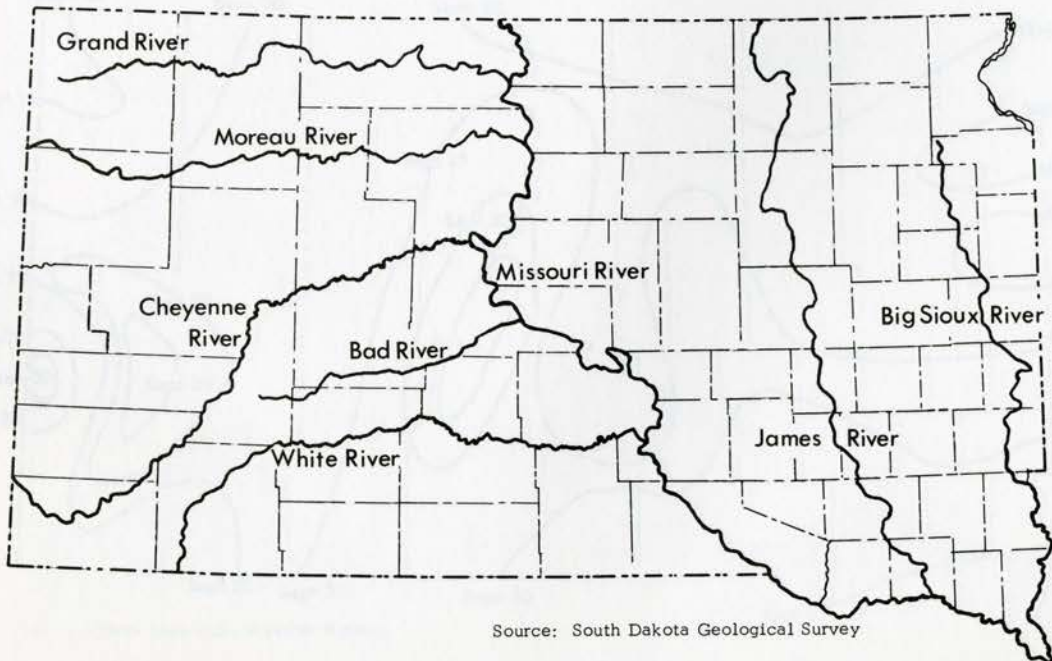

GENERALIZED GLACIAL MAP

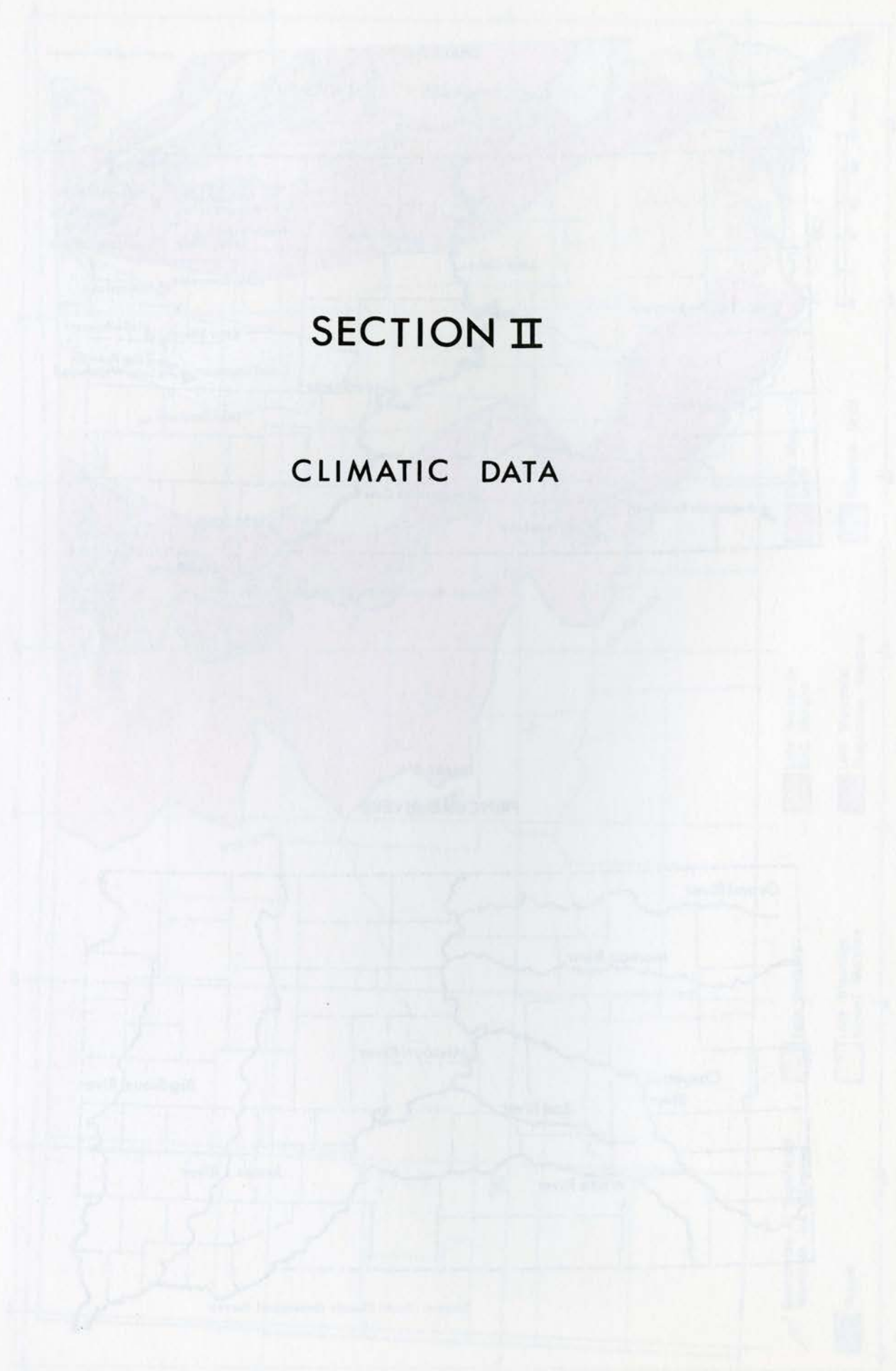

(INCHES)

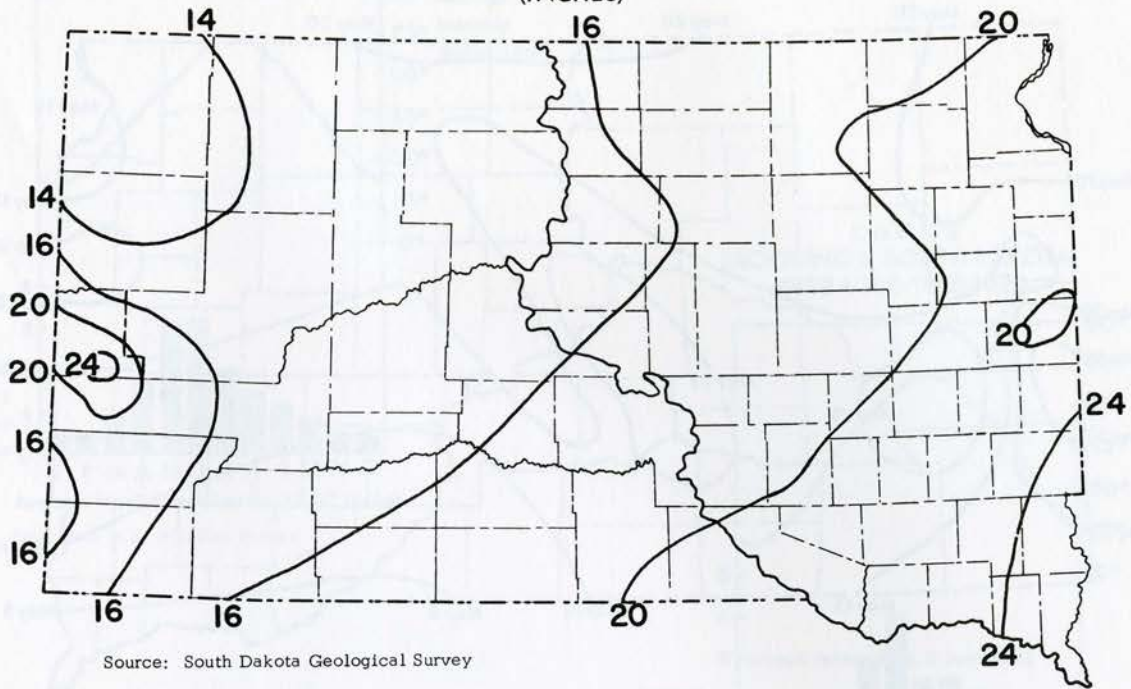

AVERAGE DATE OF FIRST FALL FROST

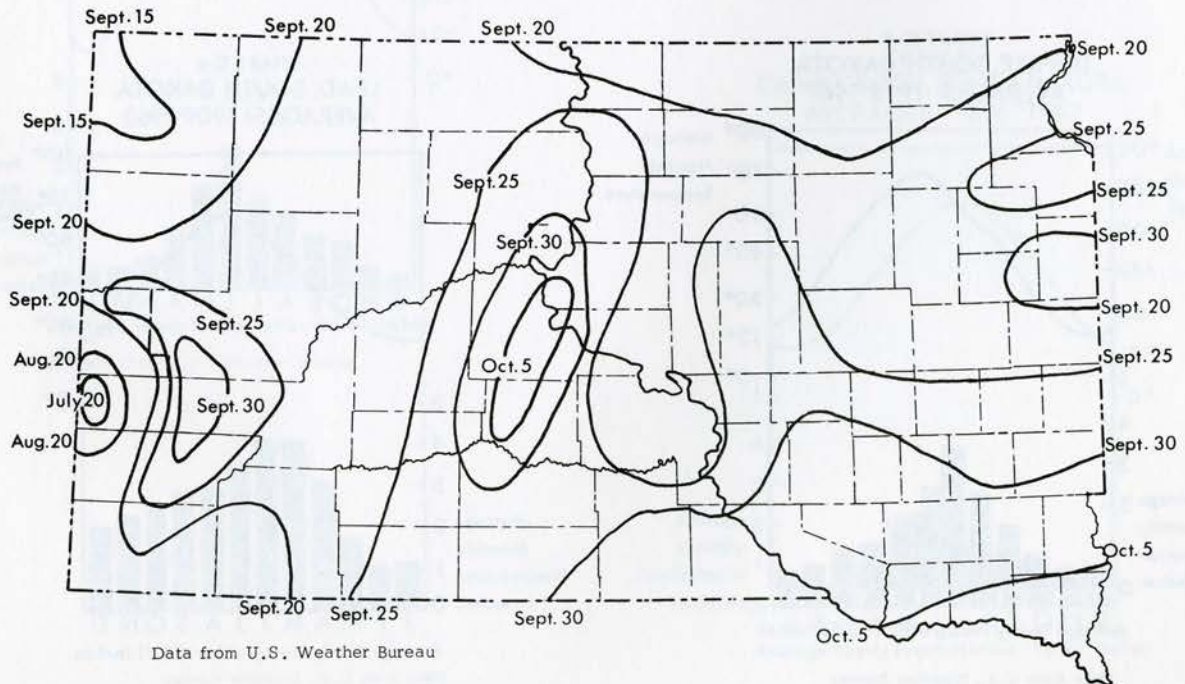

AVERAGE DATE OF LAST SPRING FROST

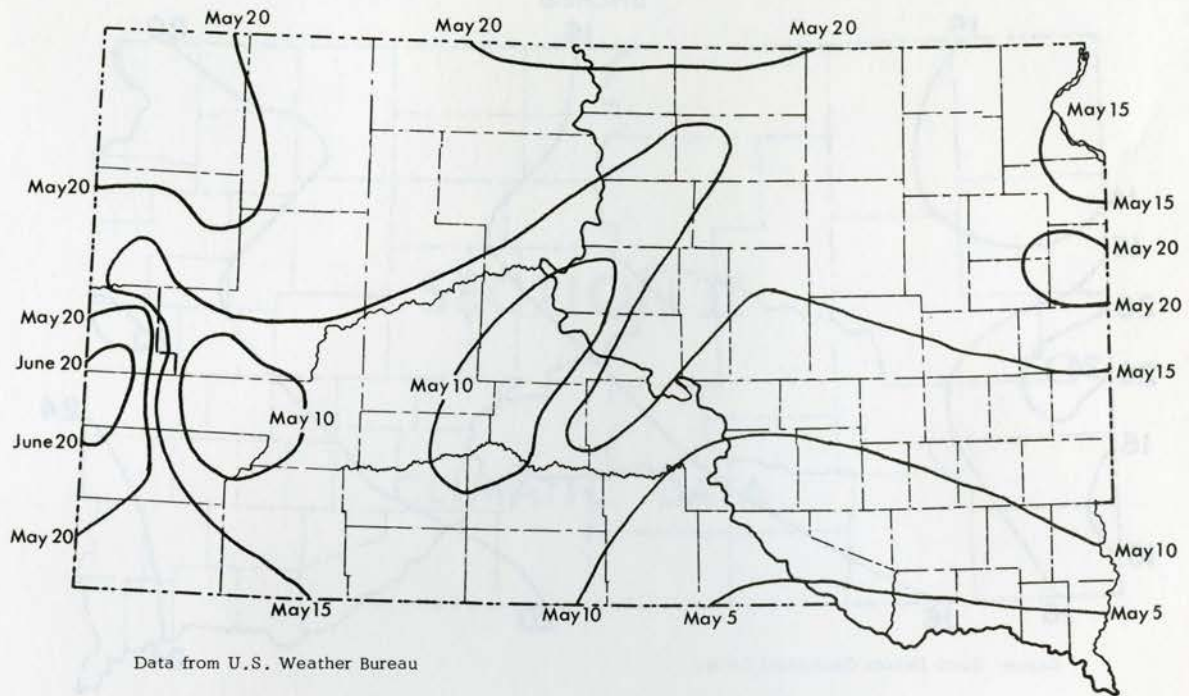
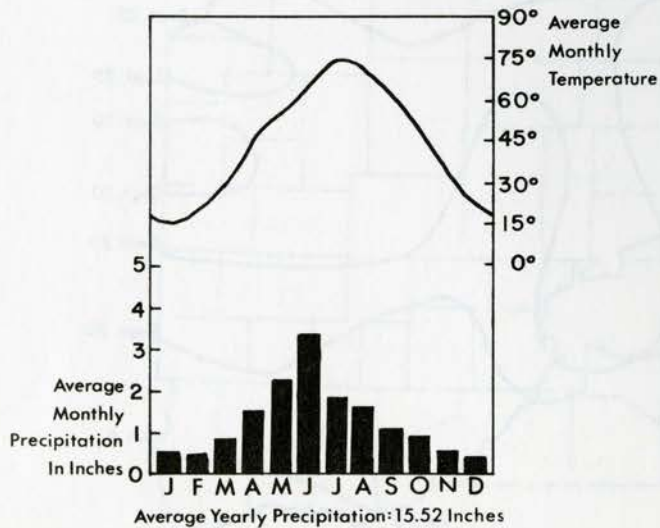
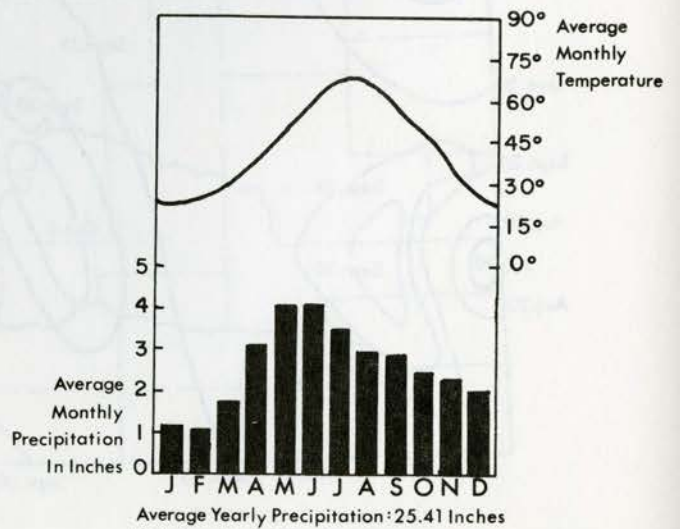

AVERAGES: 1933-1965

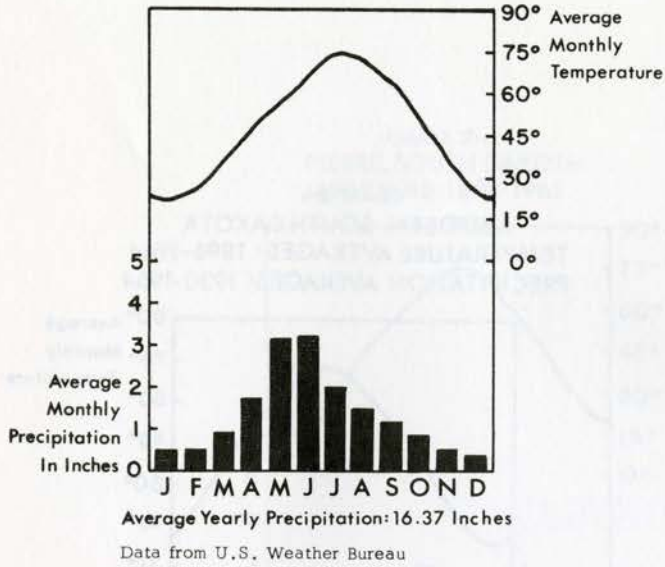

AVERAGES: 1893-1970

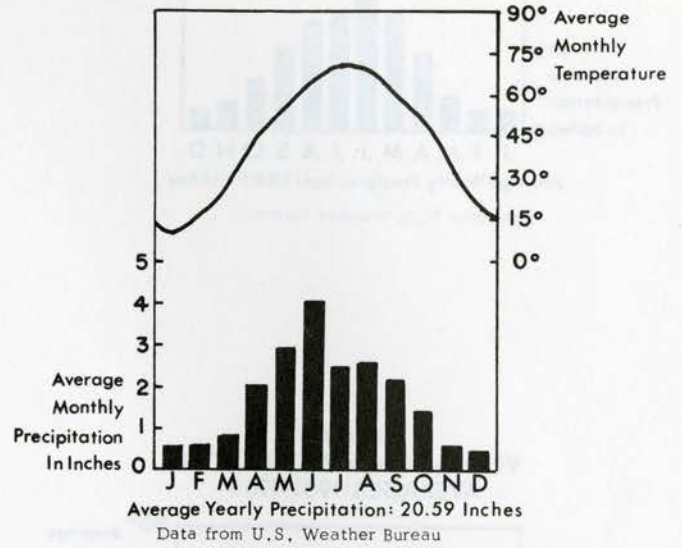

AVERAGES: 1927-1965

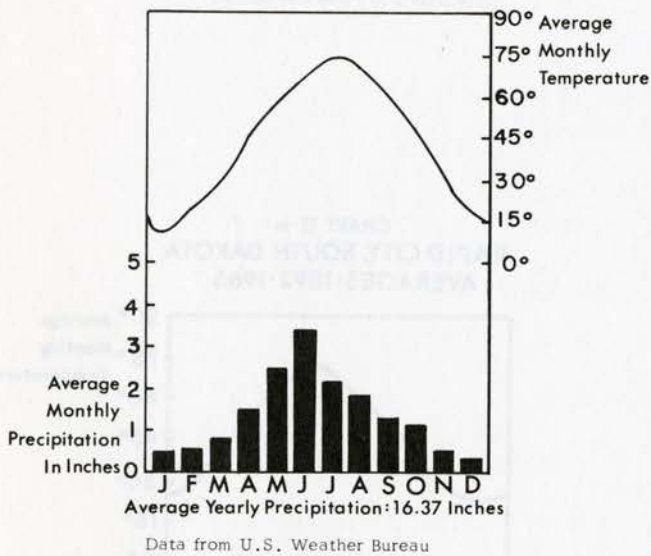

AVERAGES: 1896-1967

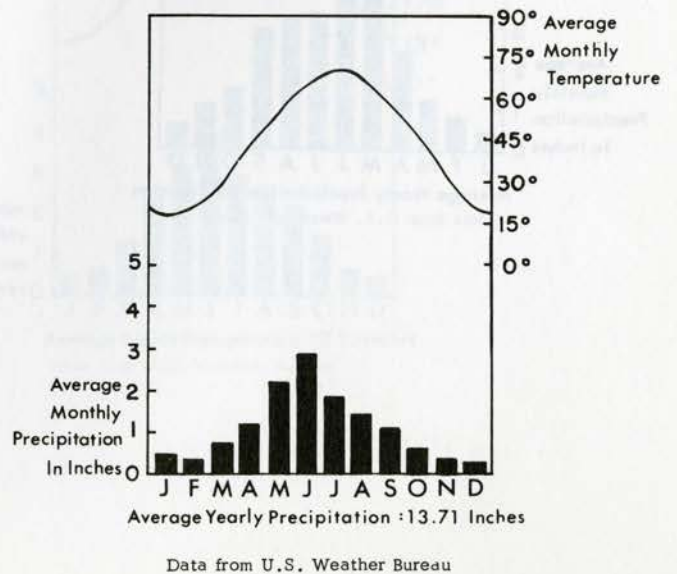

AVERAGES: 1892-1963

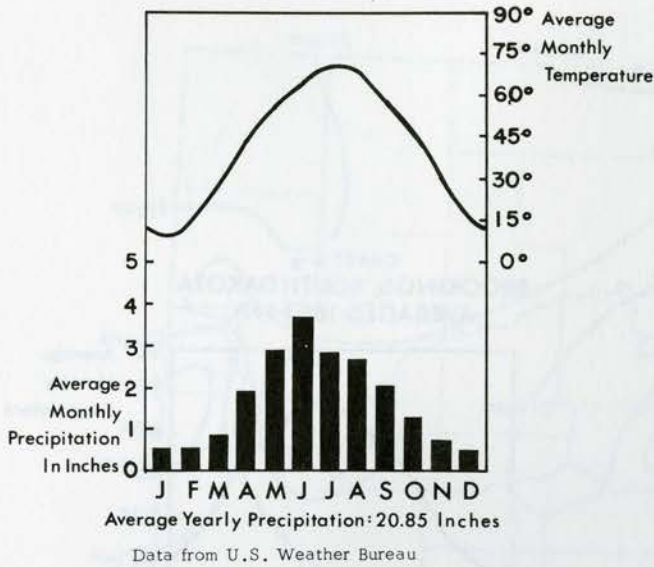


CHART II-k

PRECIPITATION AVERAGES: 1930-1964

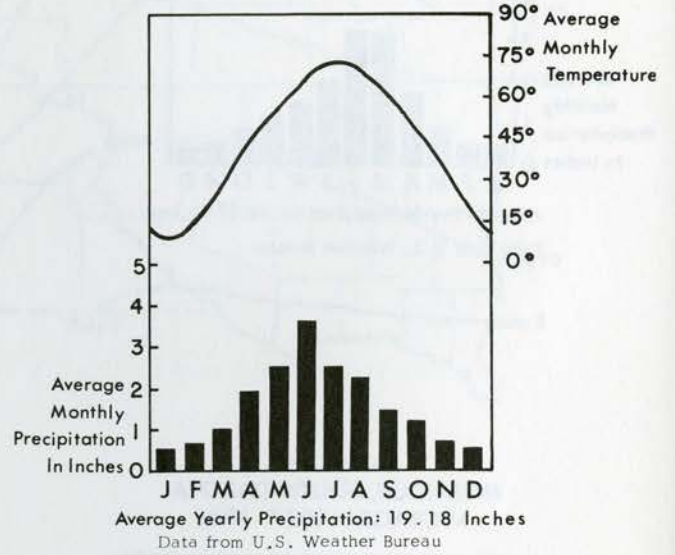

AVERAGES: 1901-1965

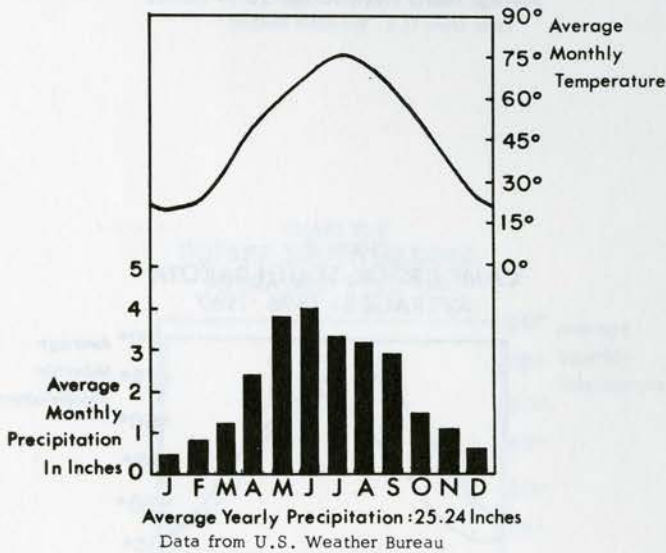

AVERAGES: 1892-1965

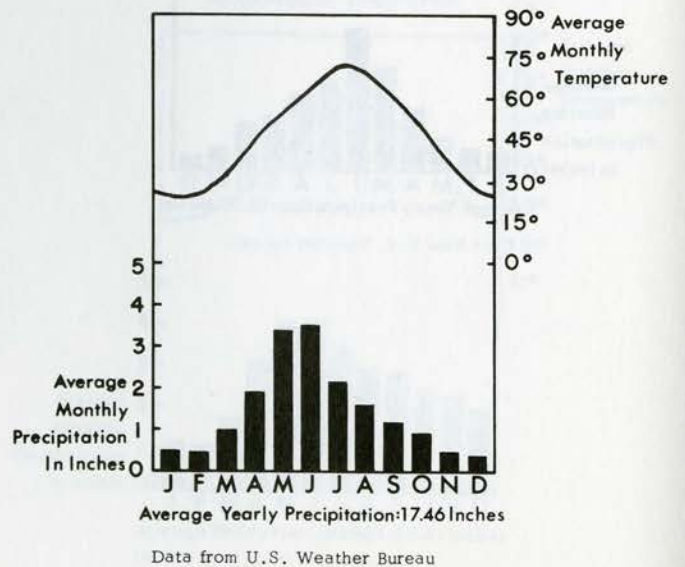
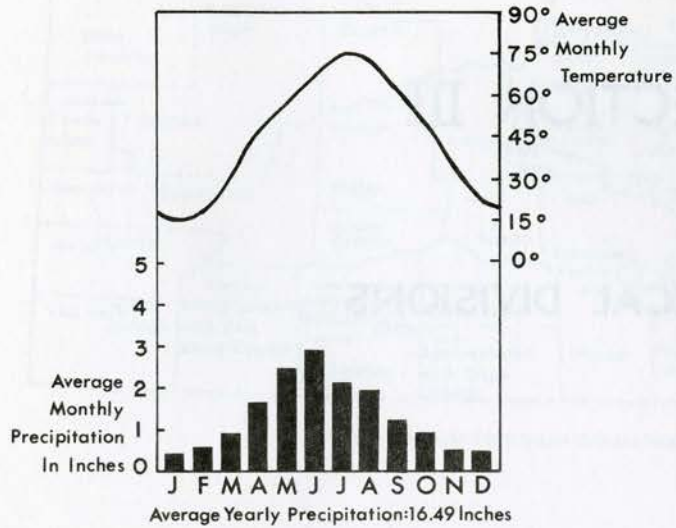
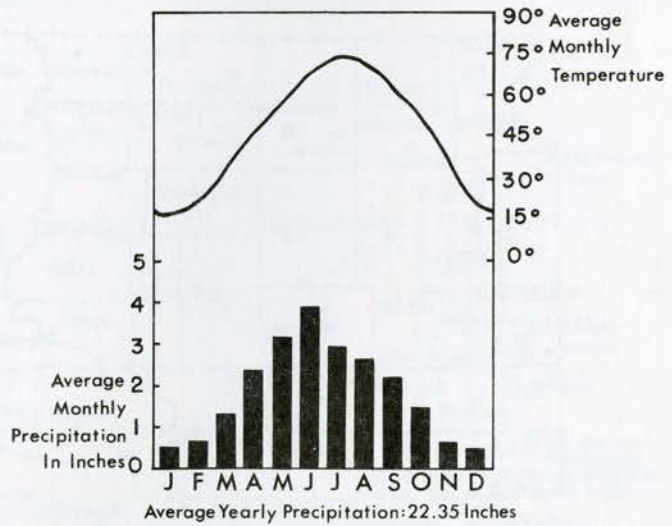


CHART II-n

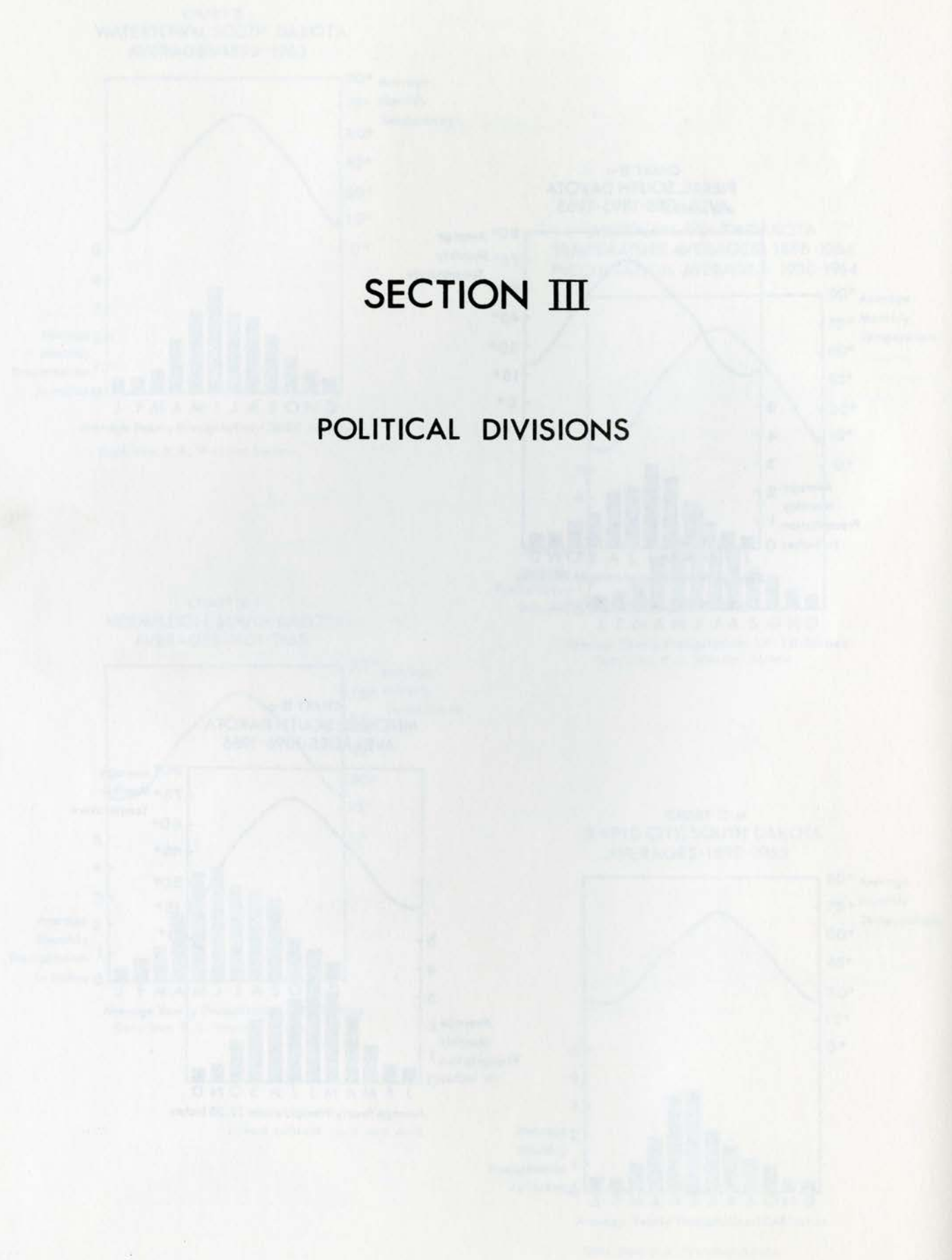

SOUTH DAKOTA IN 1970

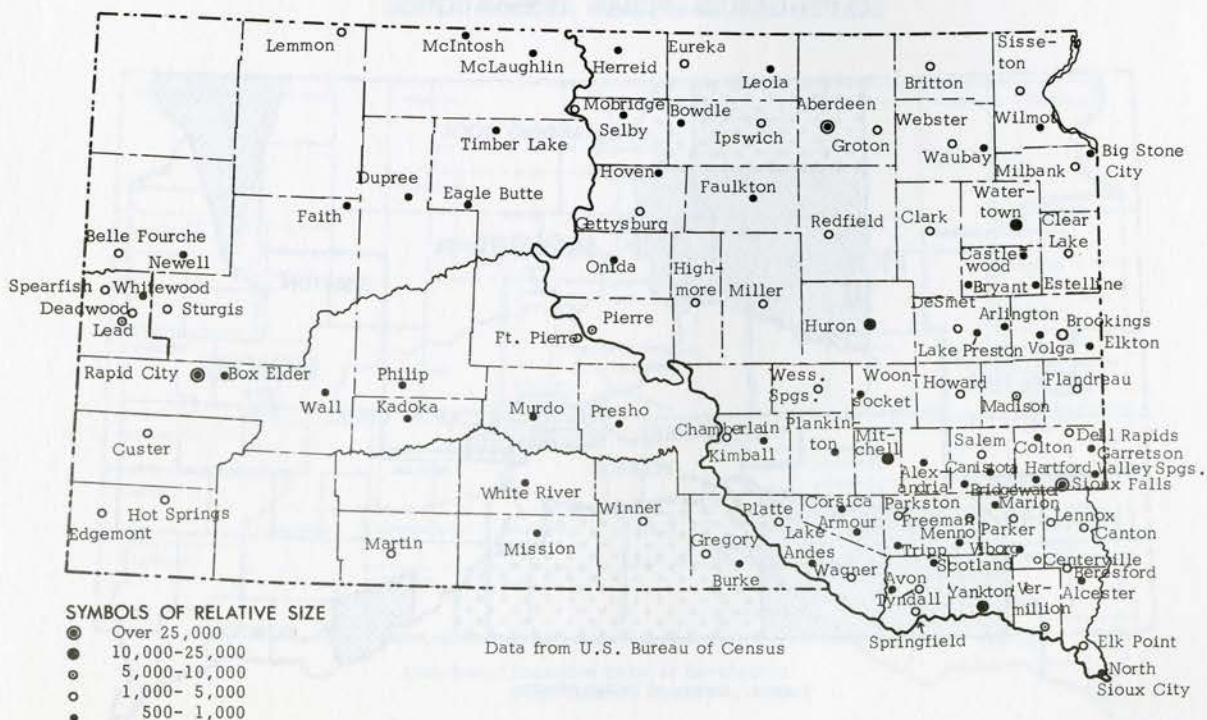

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS OF SOUTH DAKOTA

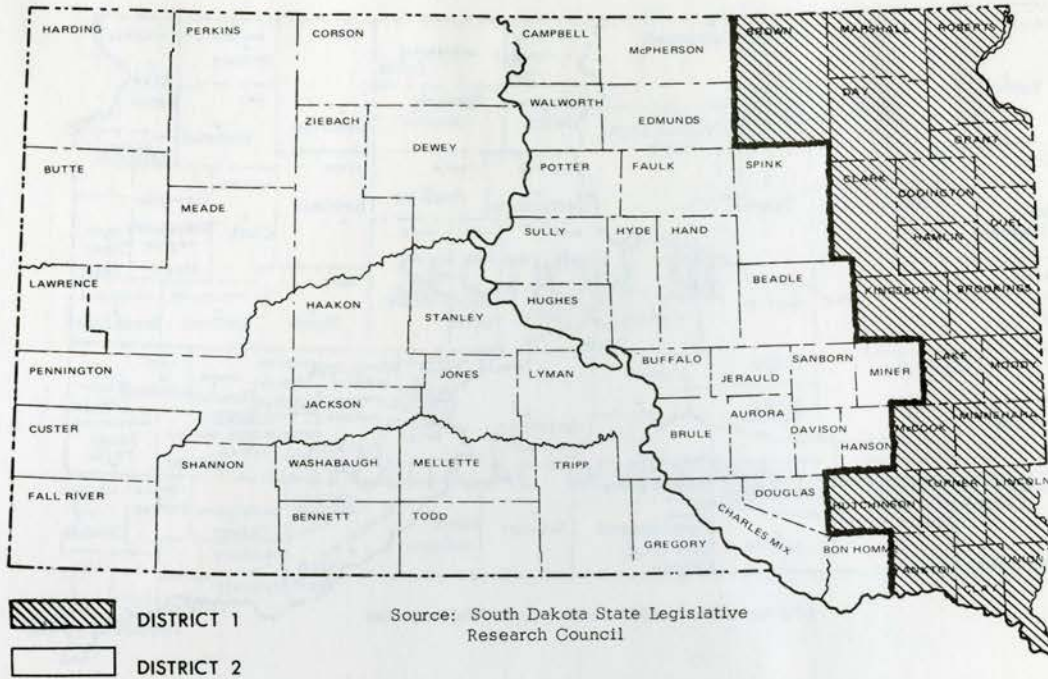

SOUTH DAKOTA INDIAN RESERVATIONS

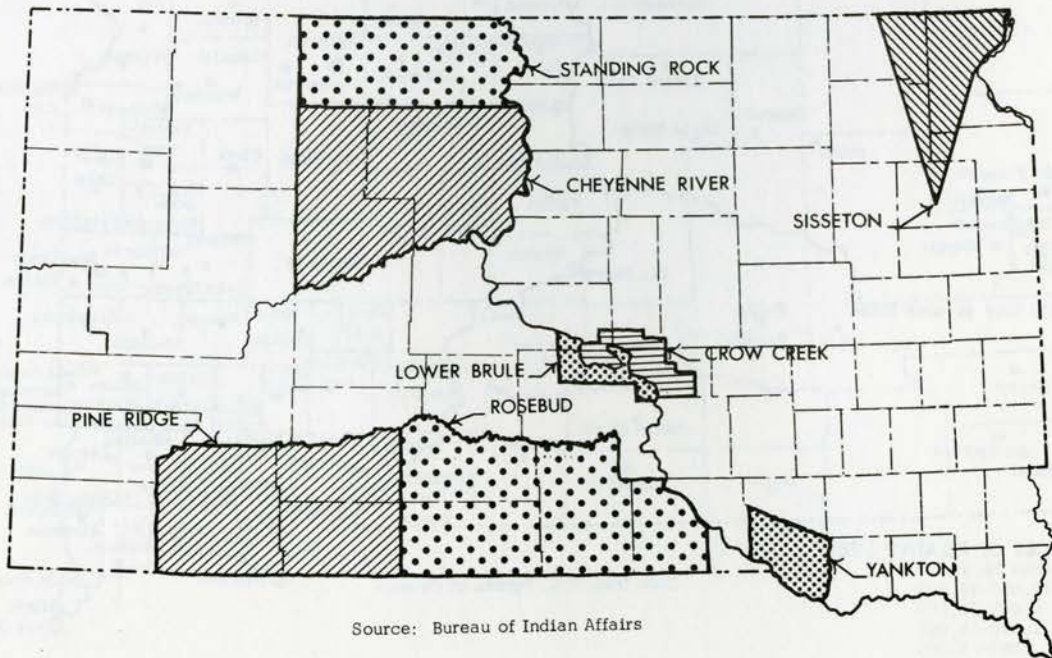
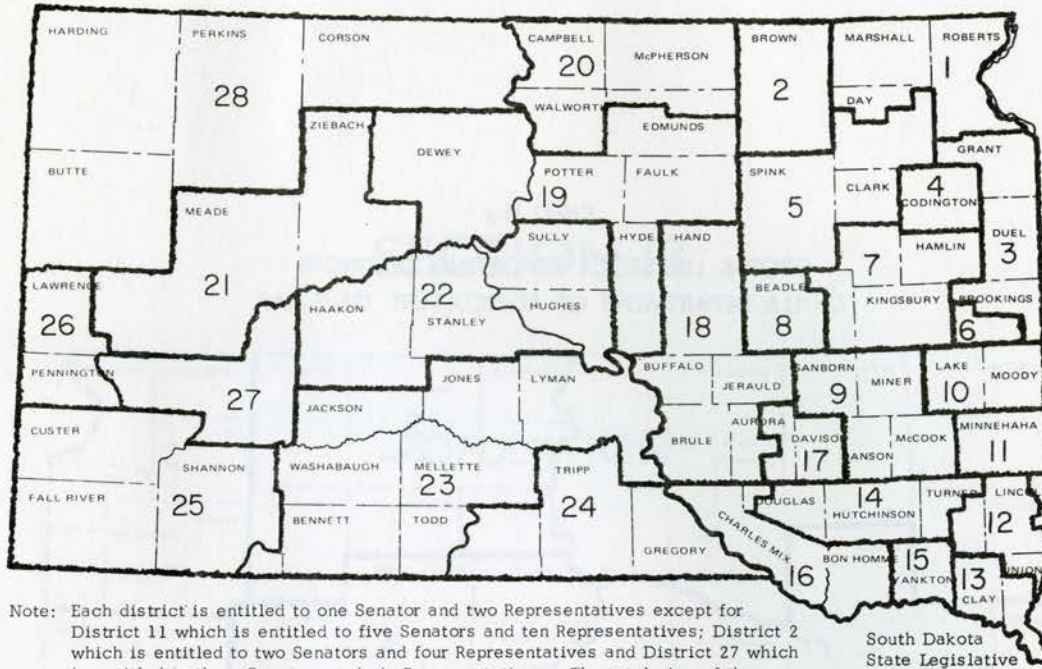

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

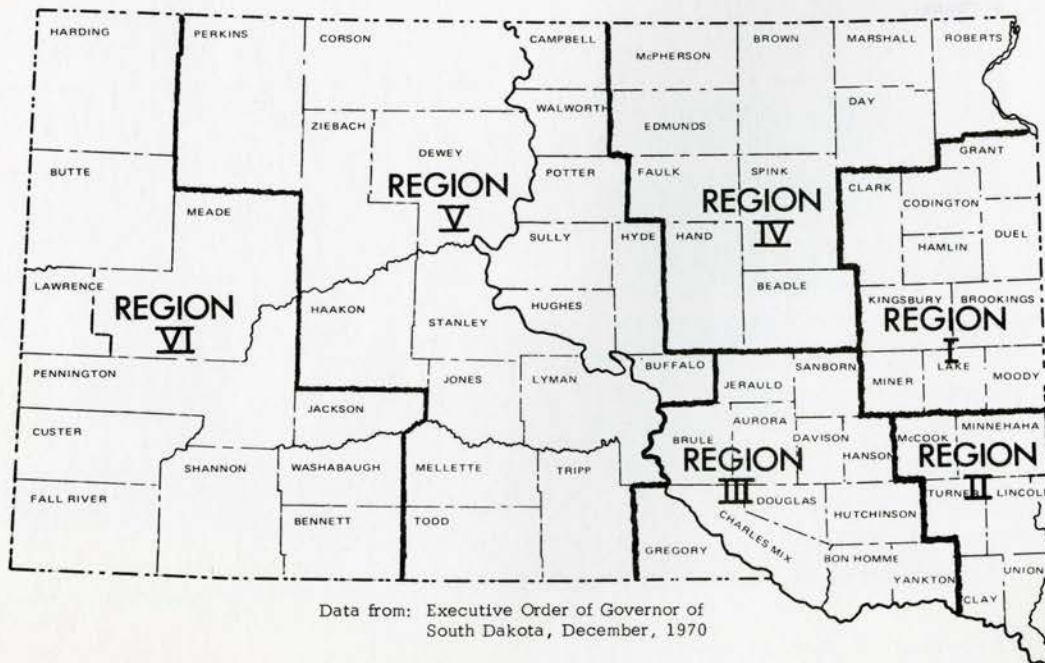

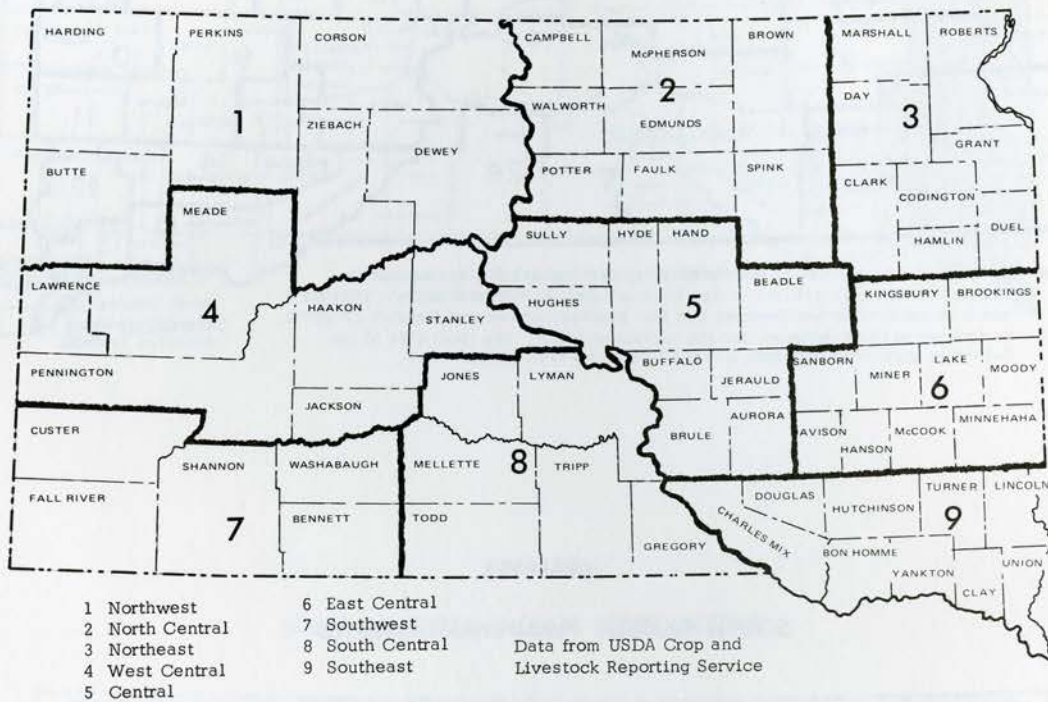
SOUTH DAKOTA PLANNING DISTRICTS

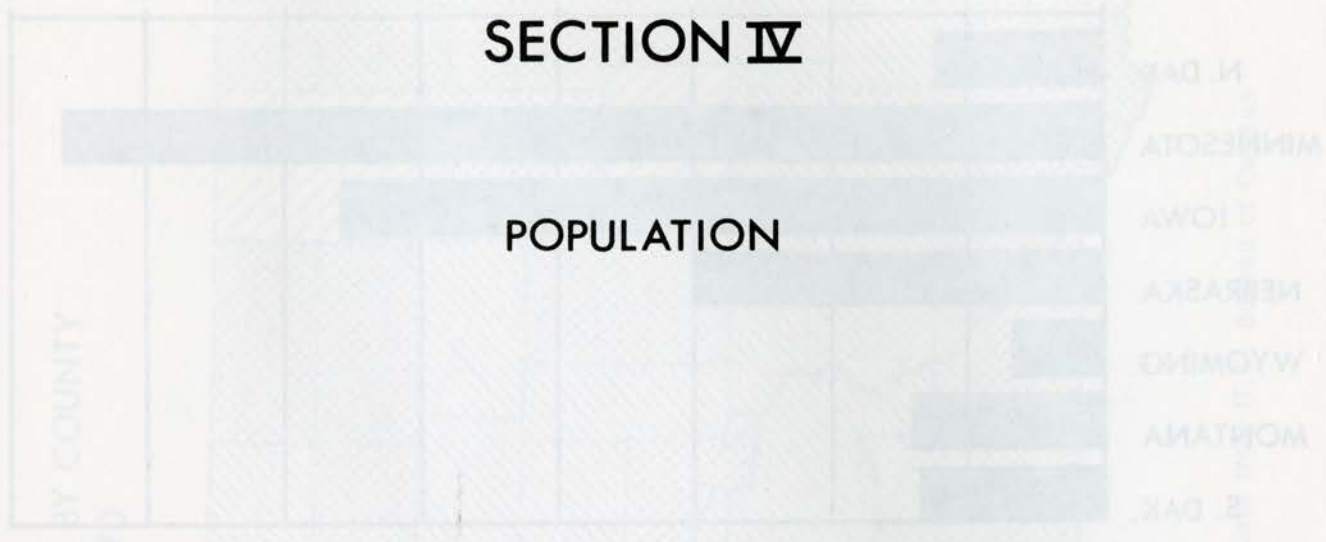
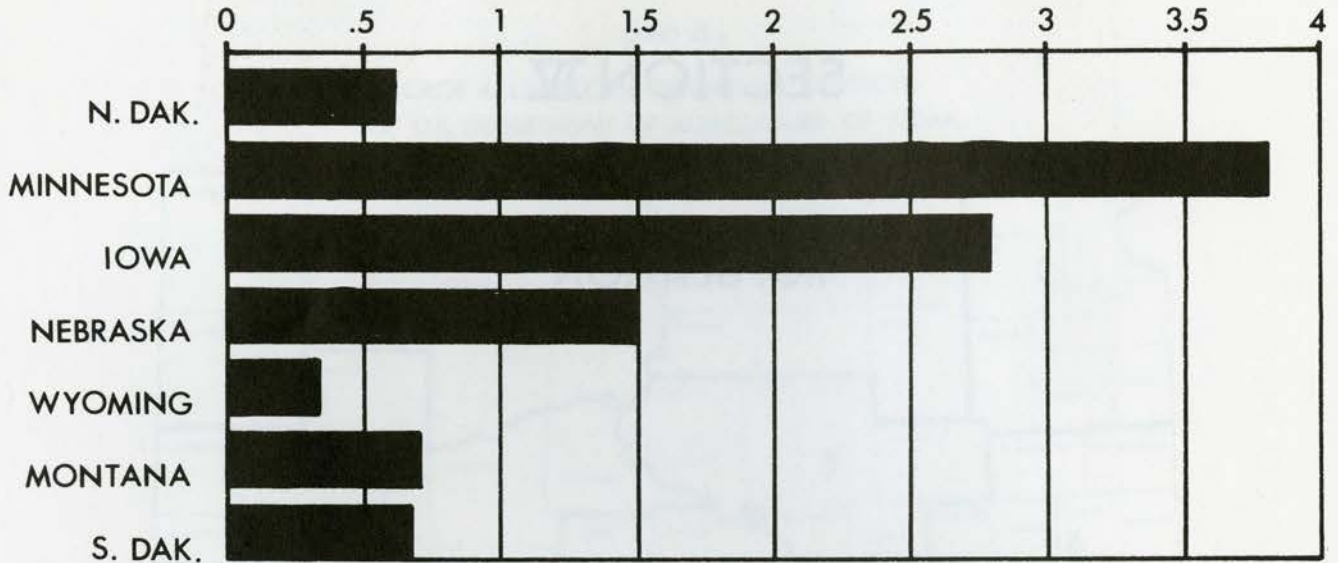

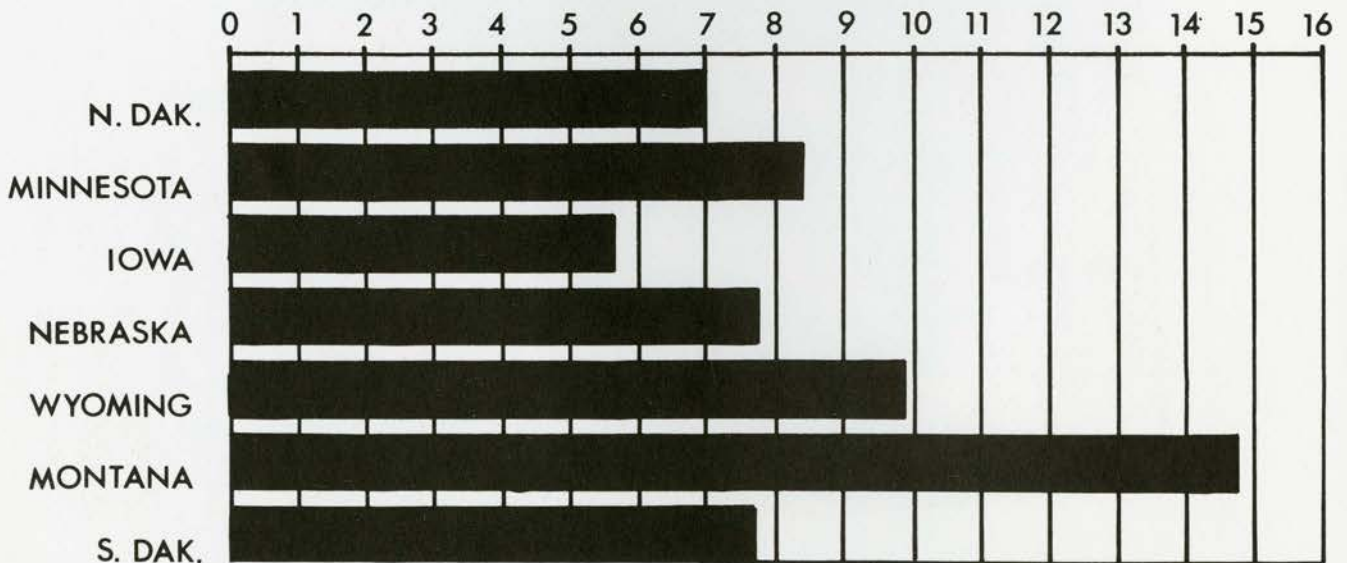
POPULATION

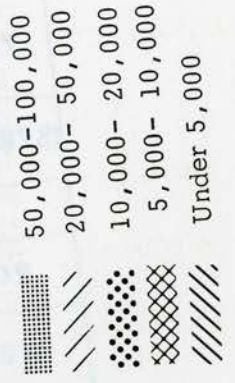
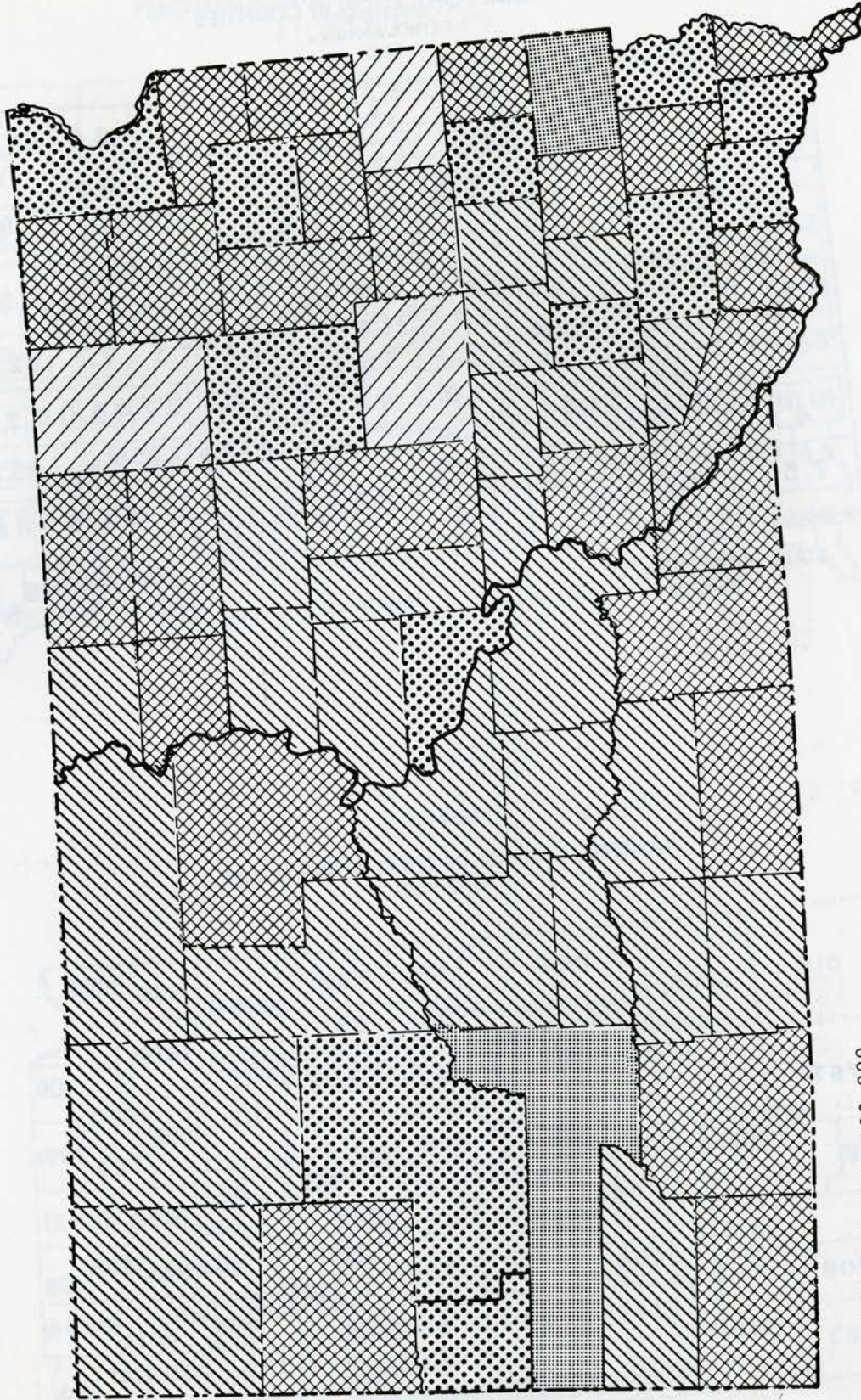
AREA OF SOUTH DAKOTA & NEIGHBORING STATES

1970

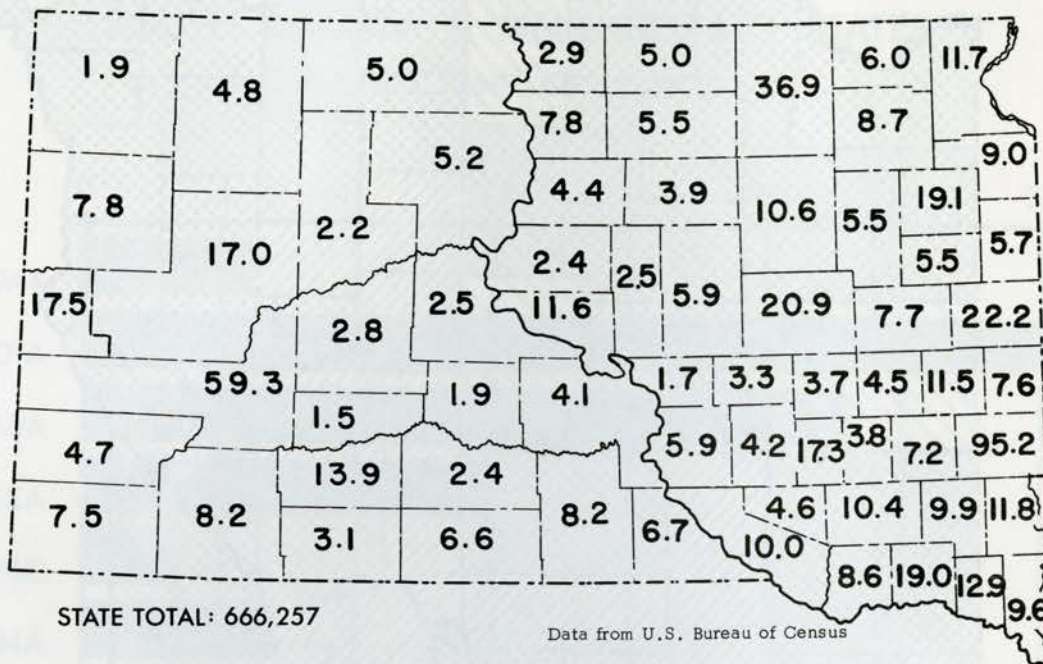

1960-1970

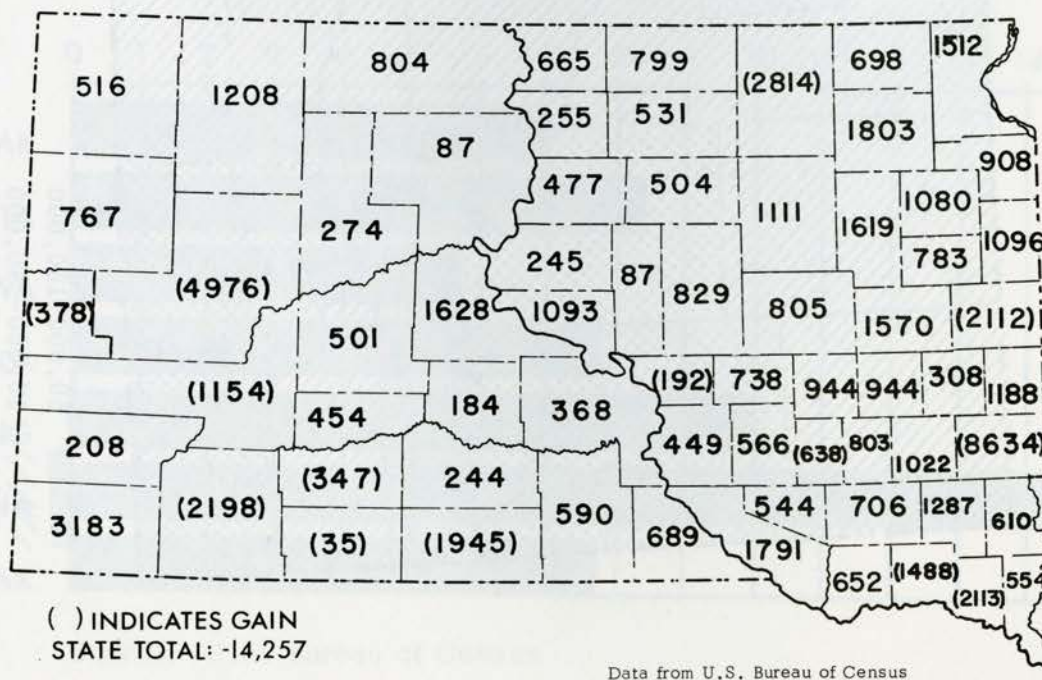

1960-1970

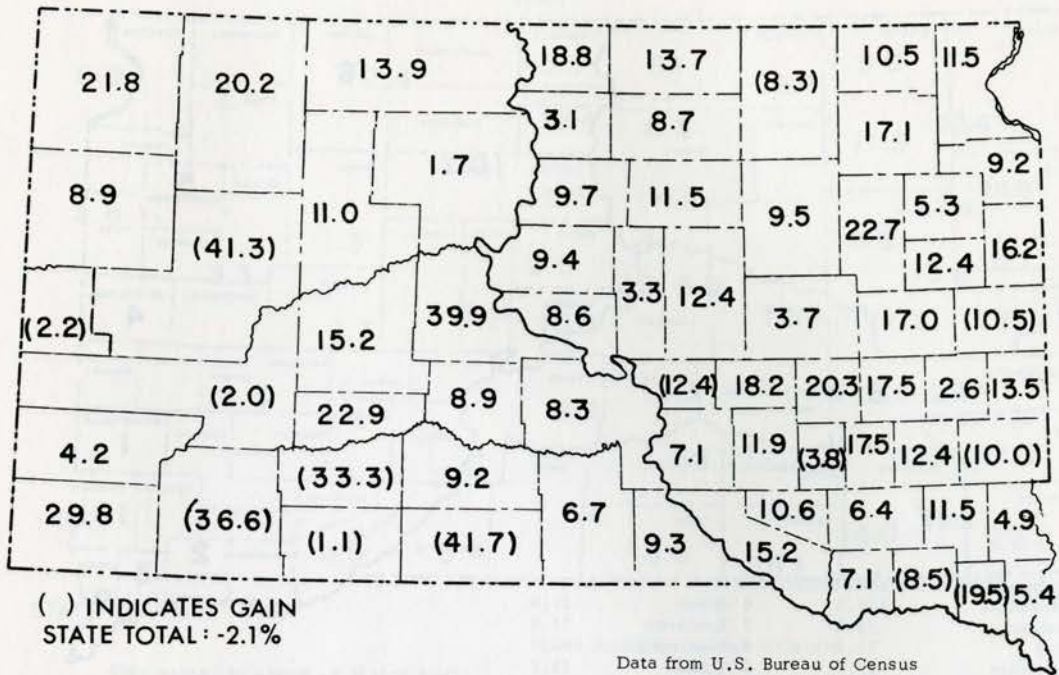
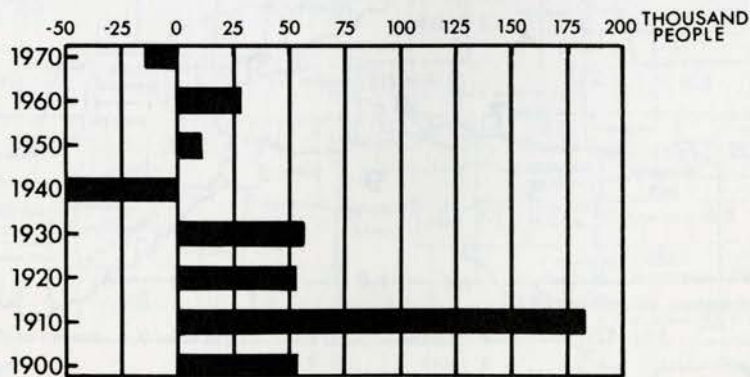


CHART IVg.

1970

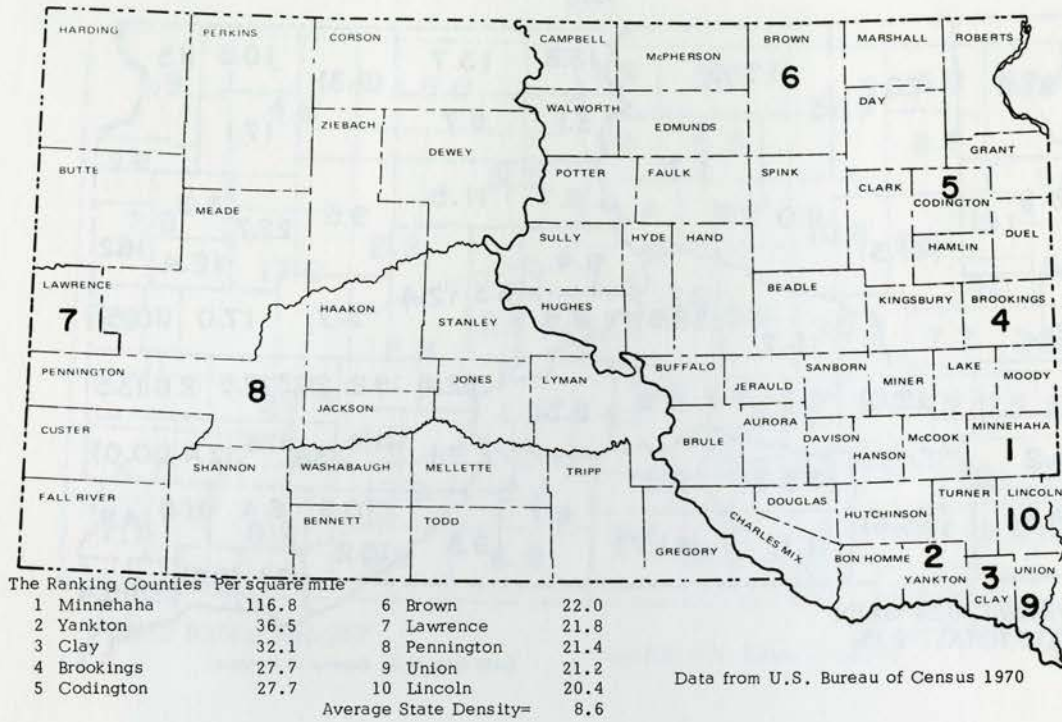

1970

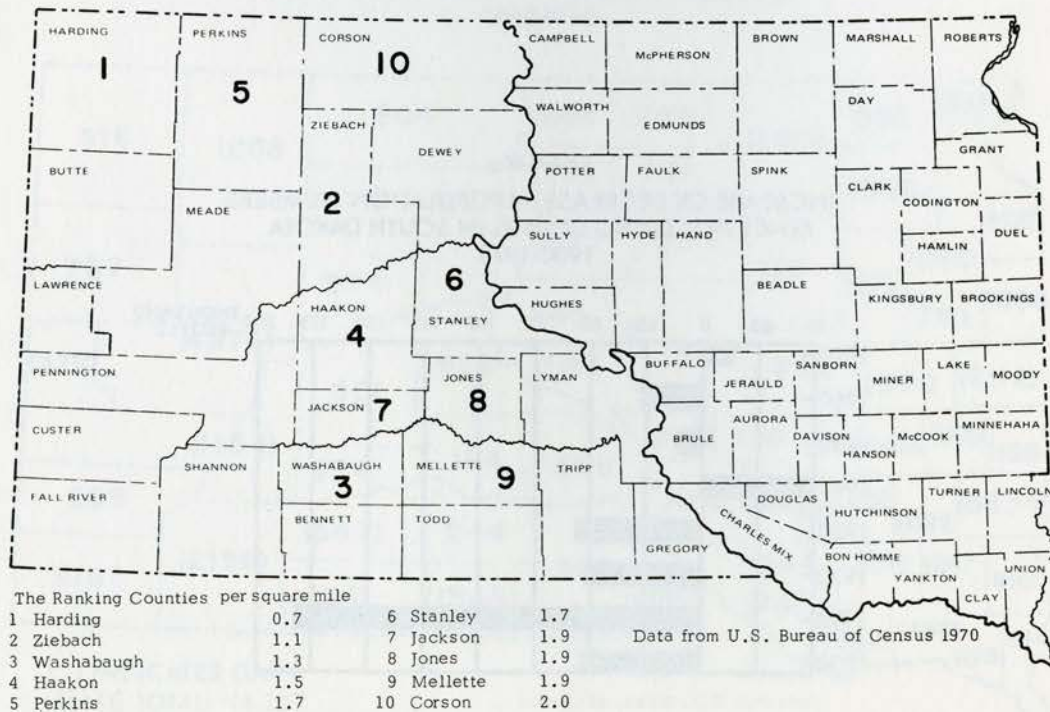


CHART IV j.

1950

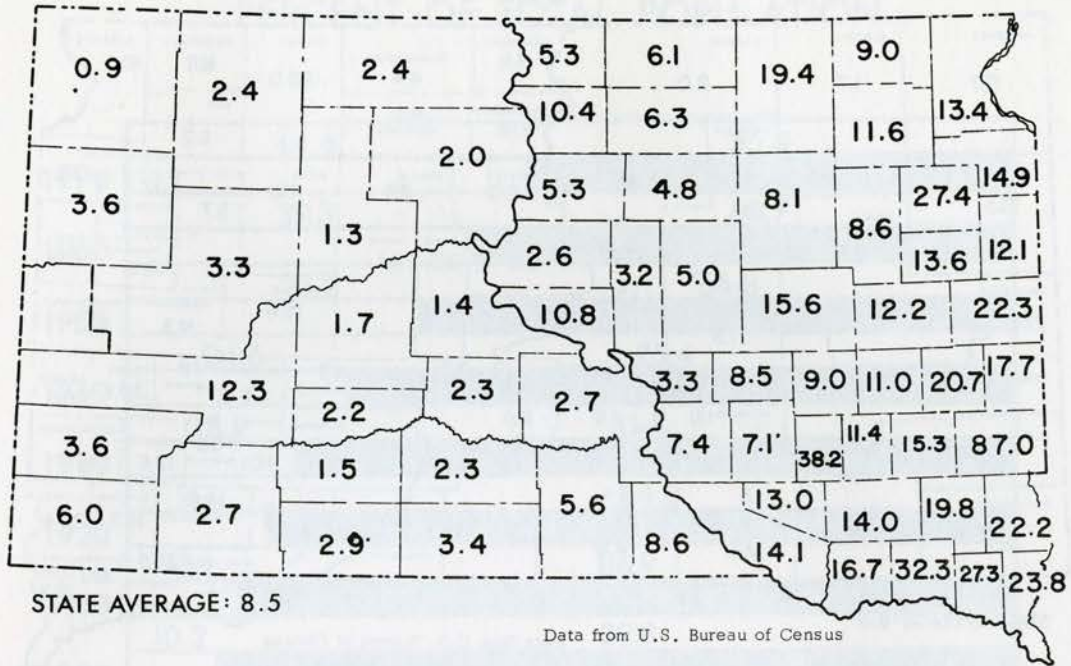

1960

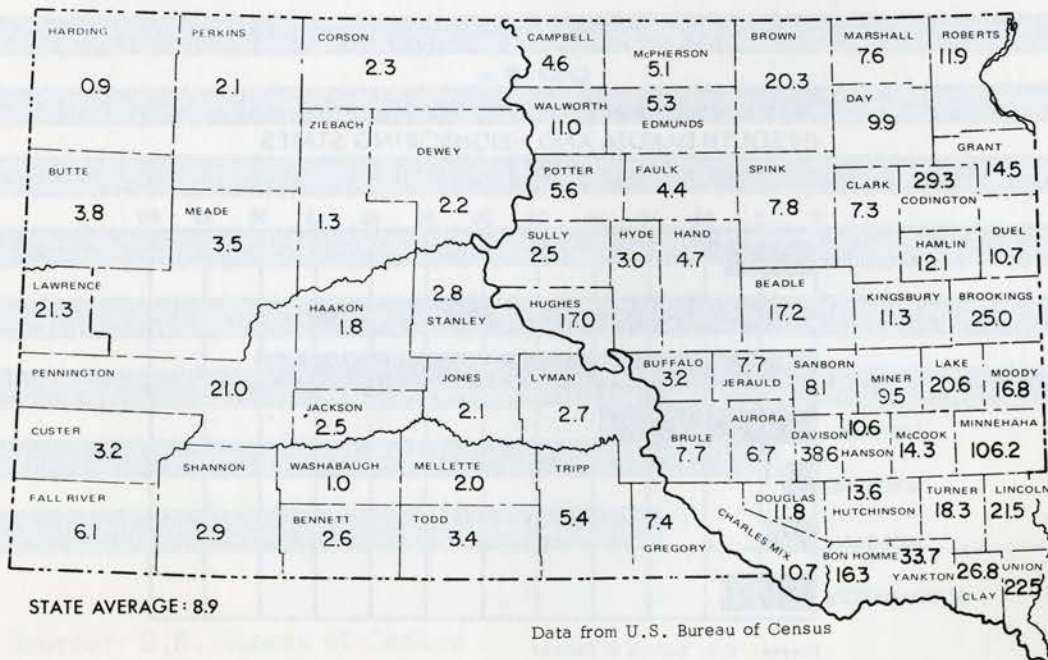

1970

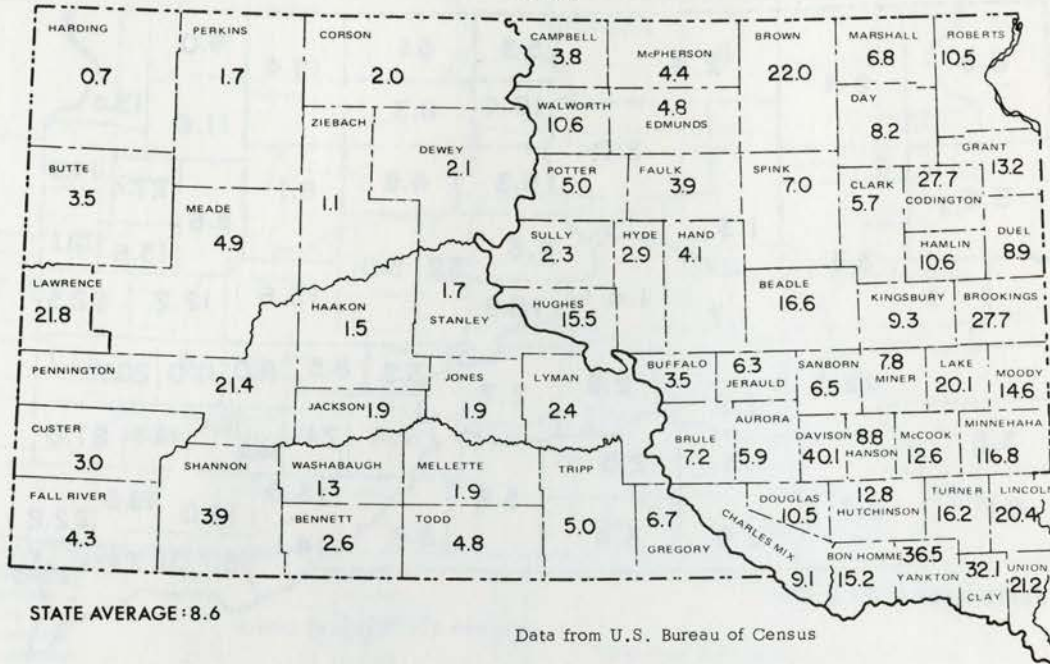
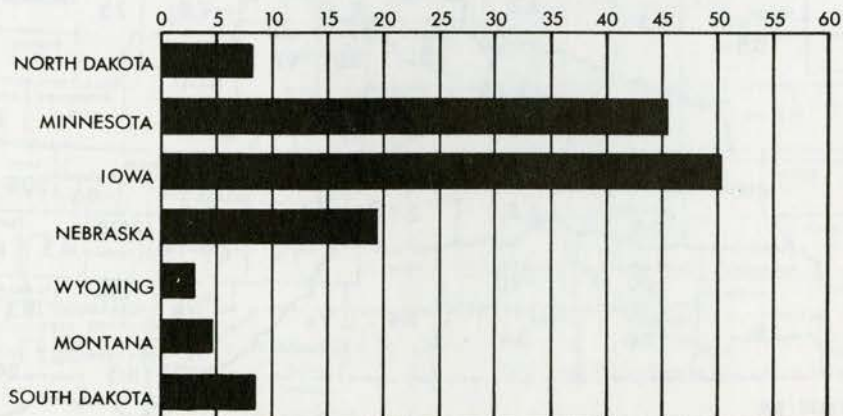


CHART IV m.

PERCENT OF TOTAL POPULATION

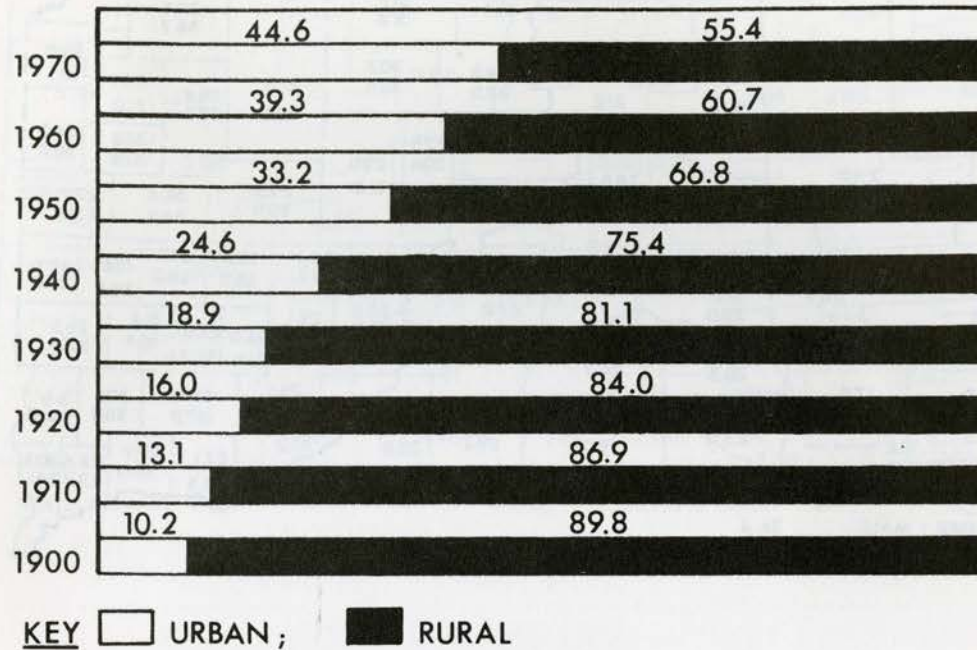
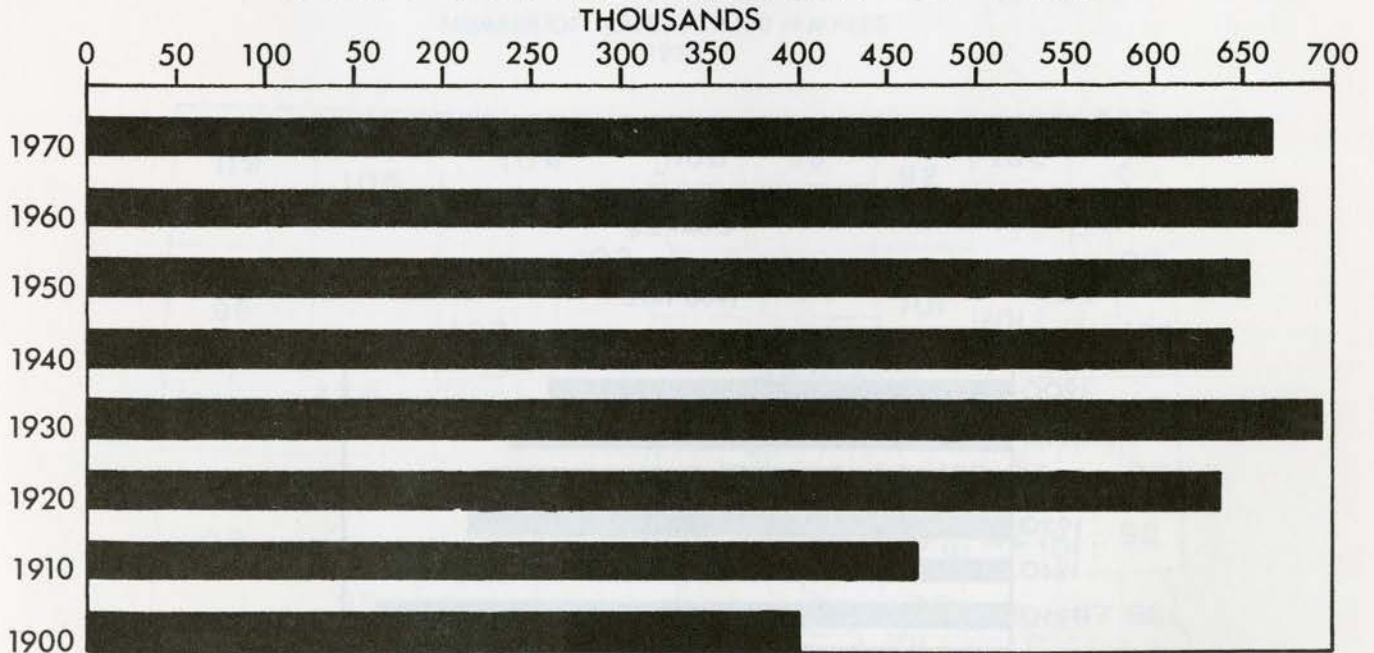

SOUTH DAKOTA, 1970

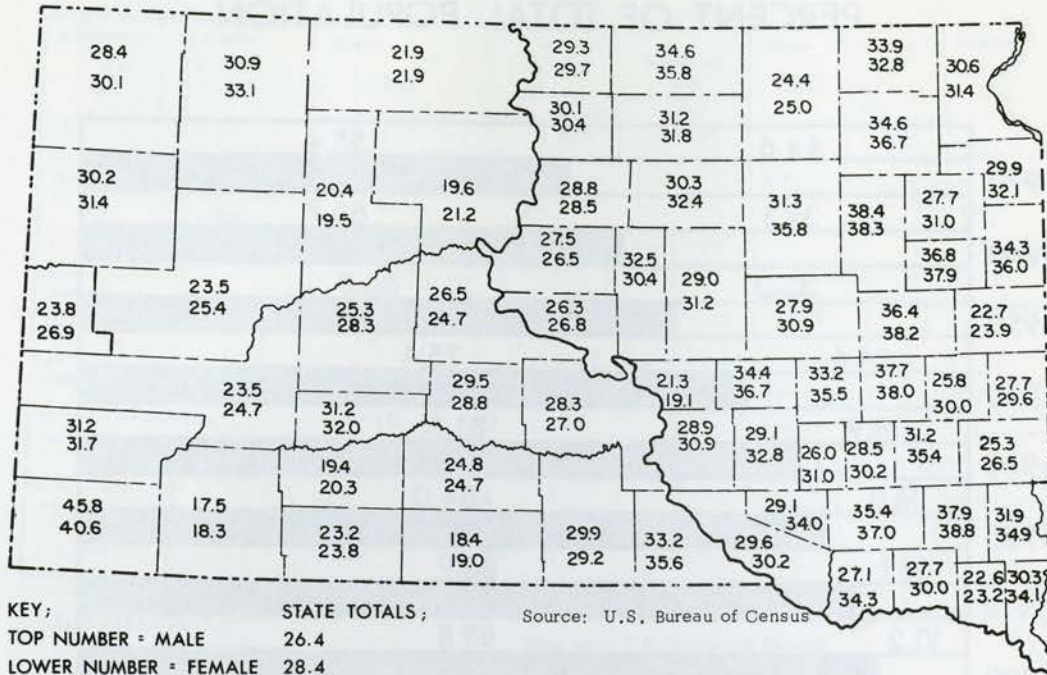
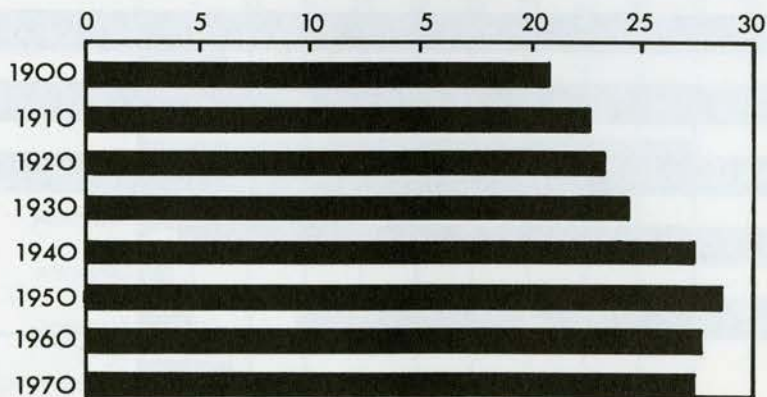

1970

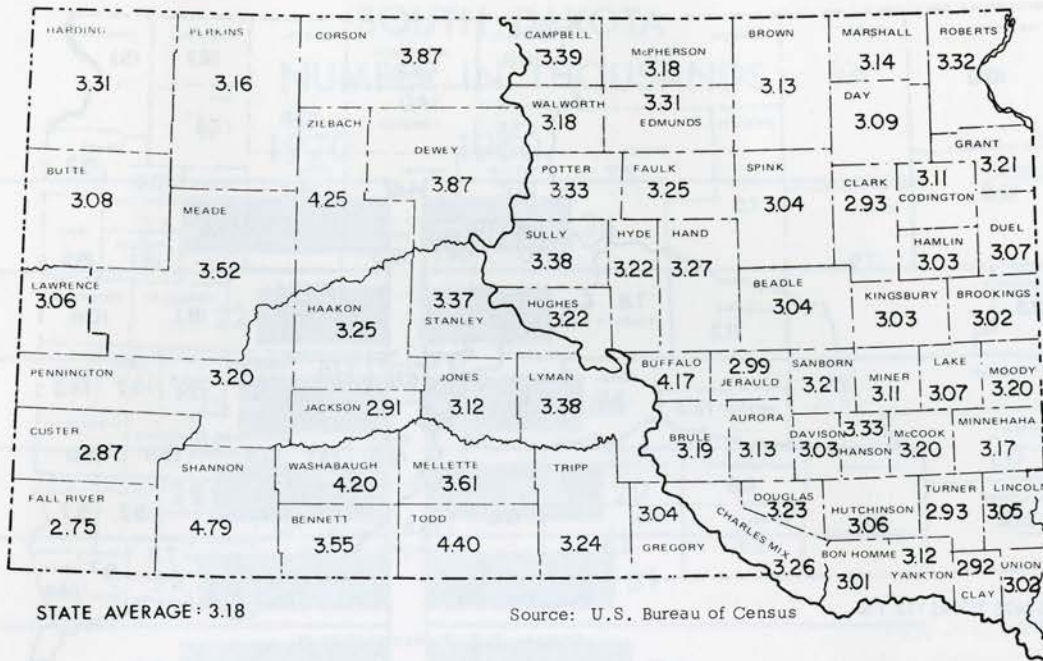

1970

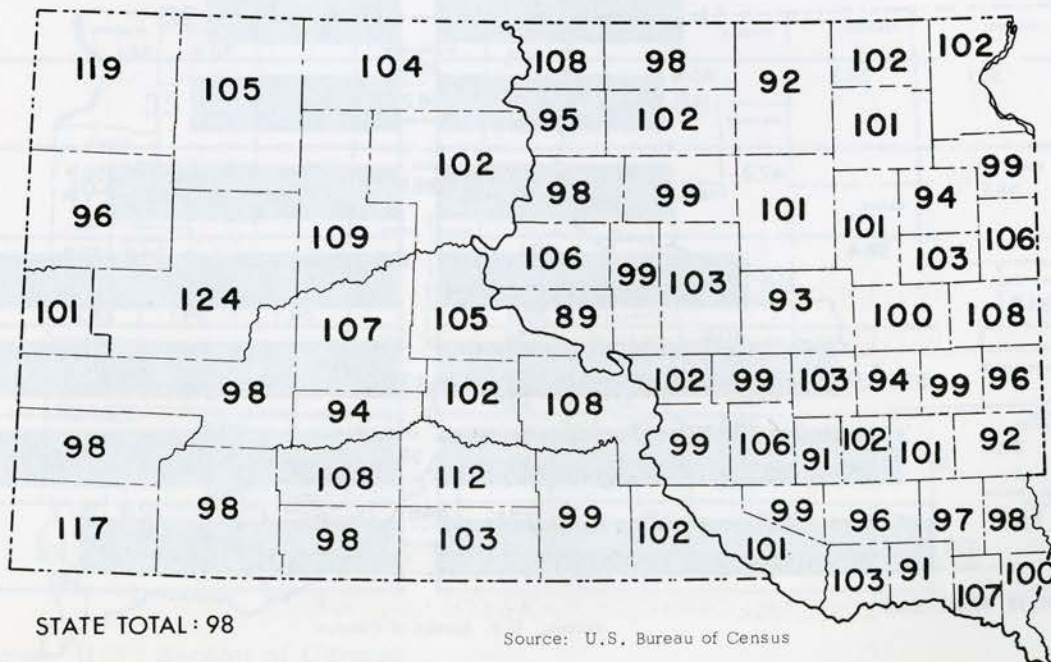

1970

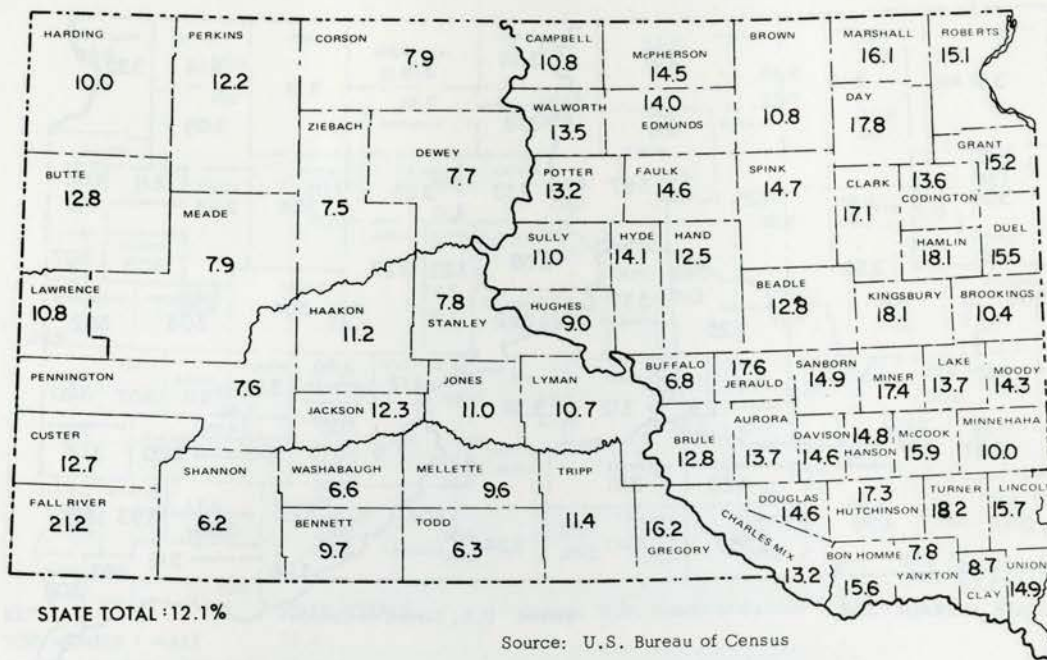

1970

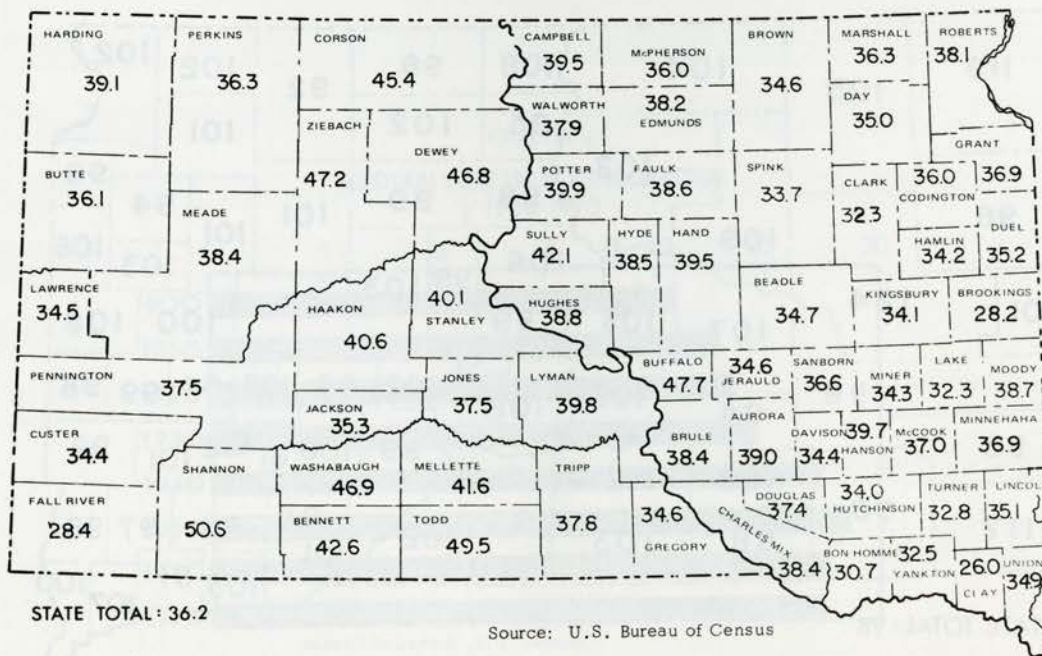
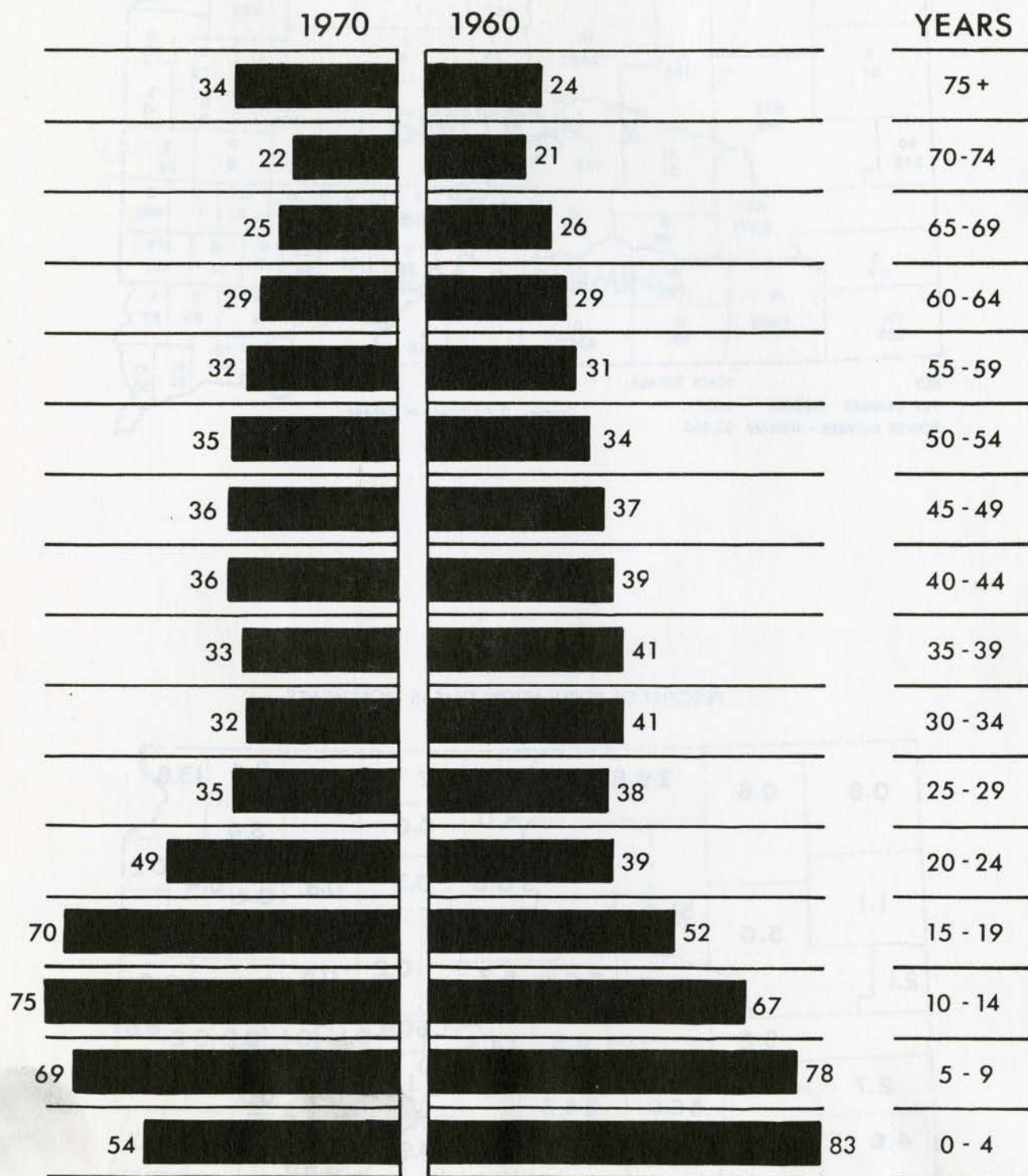

TOTAL INDIAN & NEGRO POPULATION

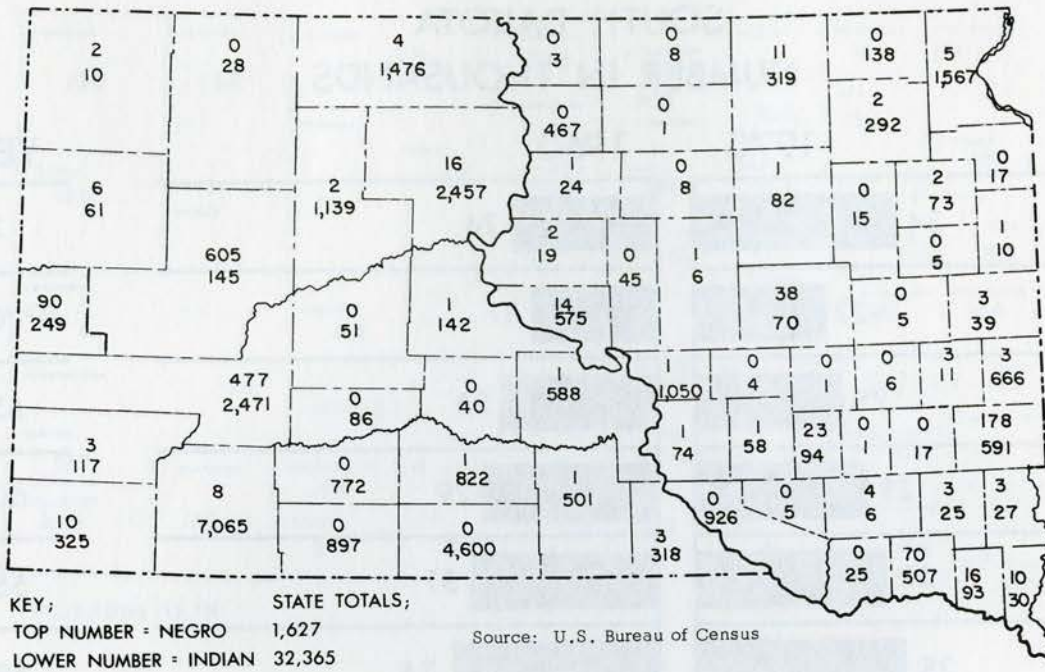
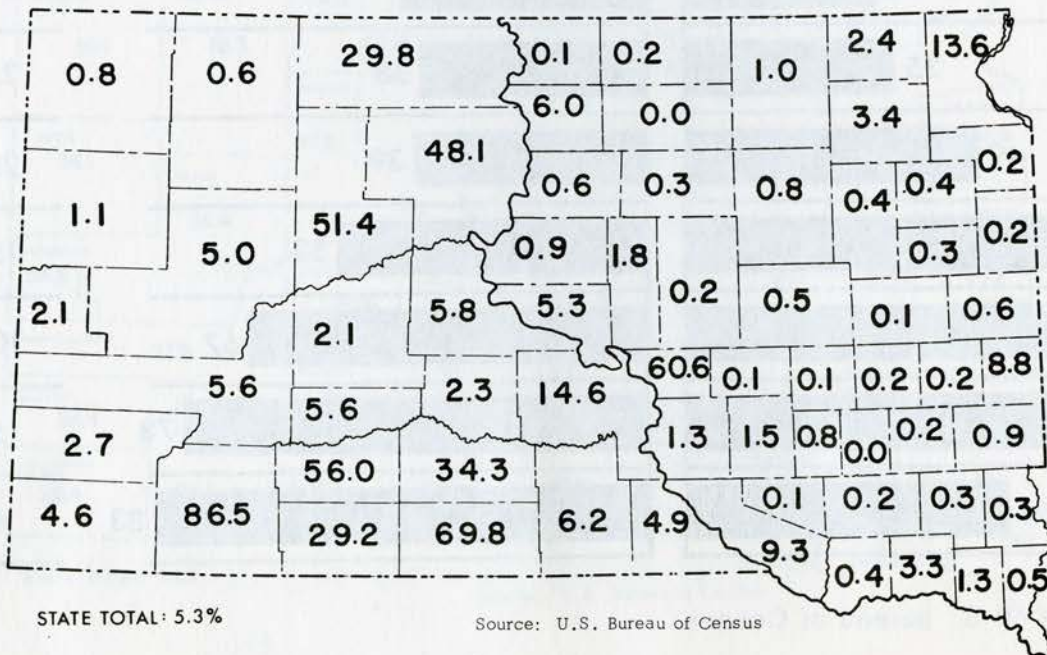

1970



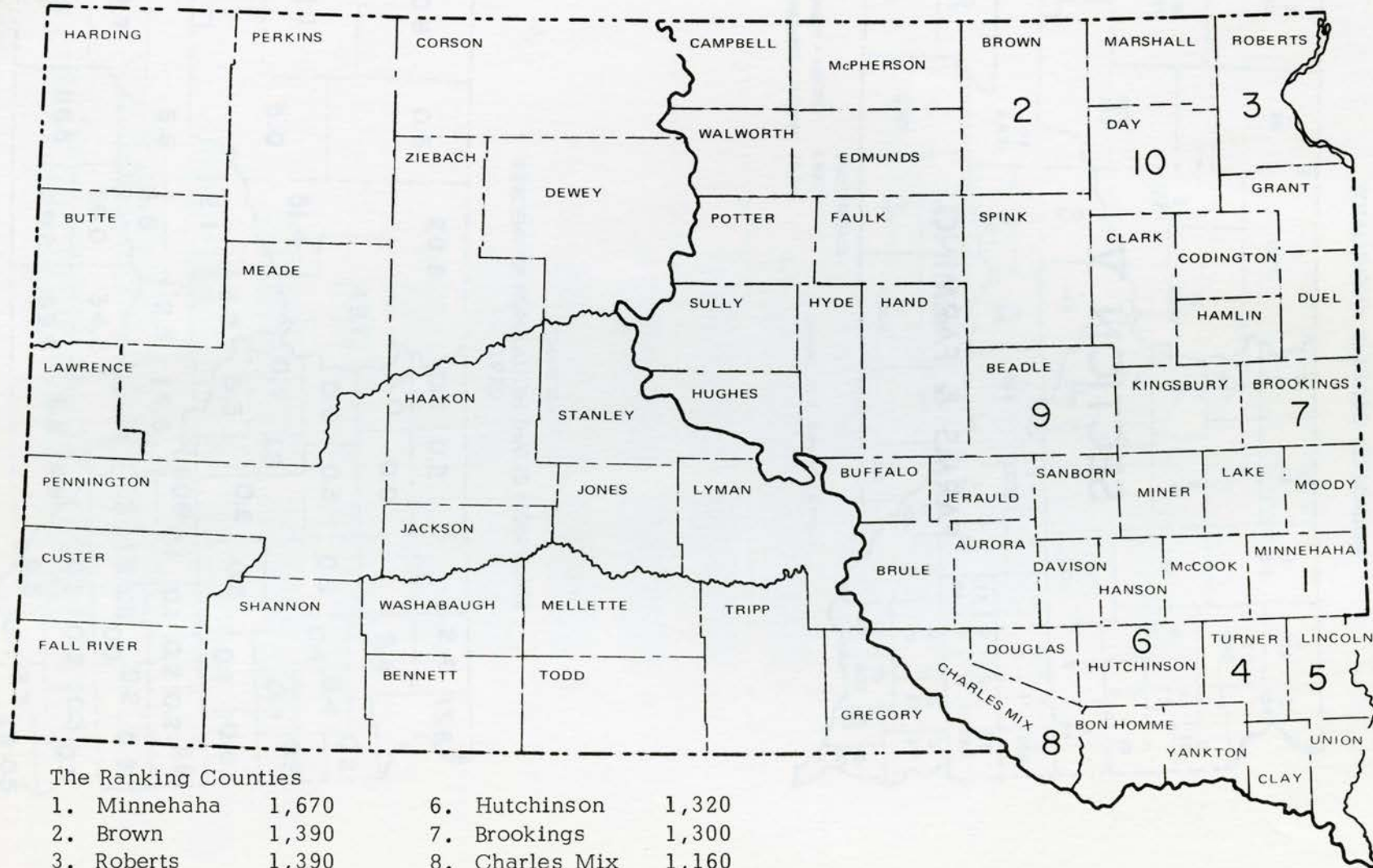

NUMBER OF FARMS (THOUSANDS)**

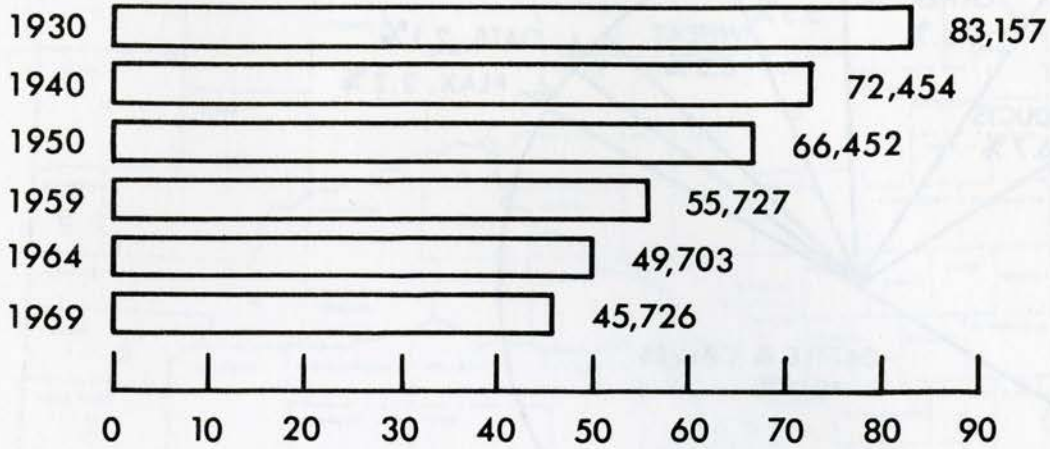
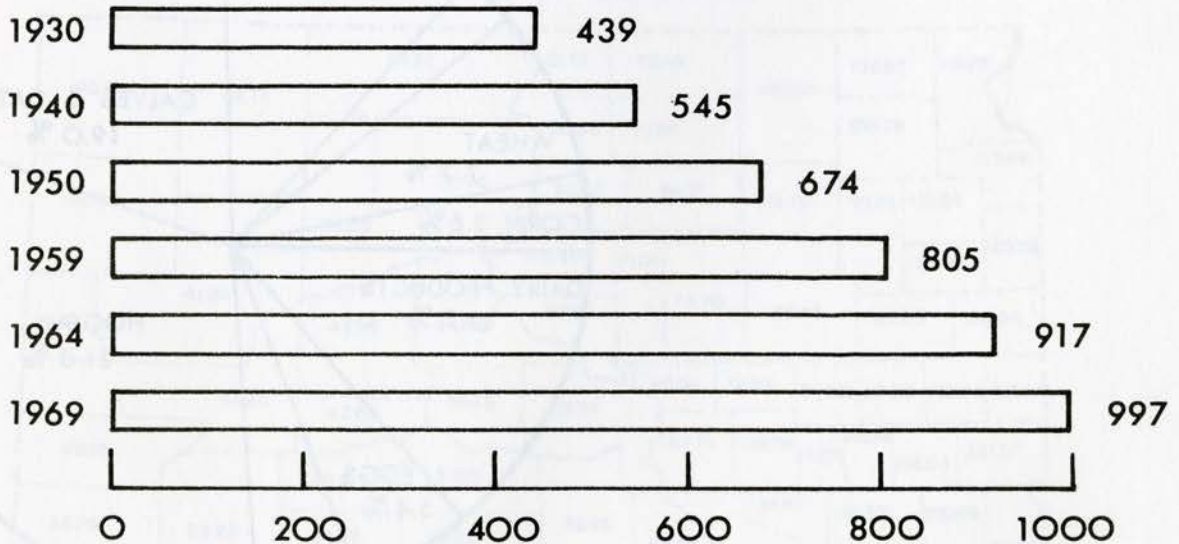

 BY COMMODITIES — 1969

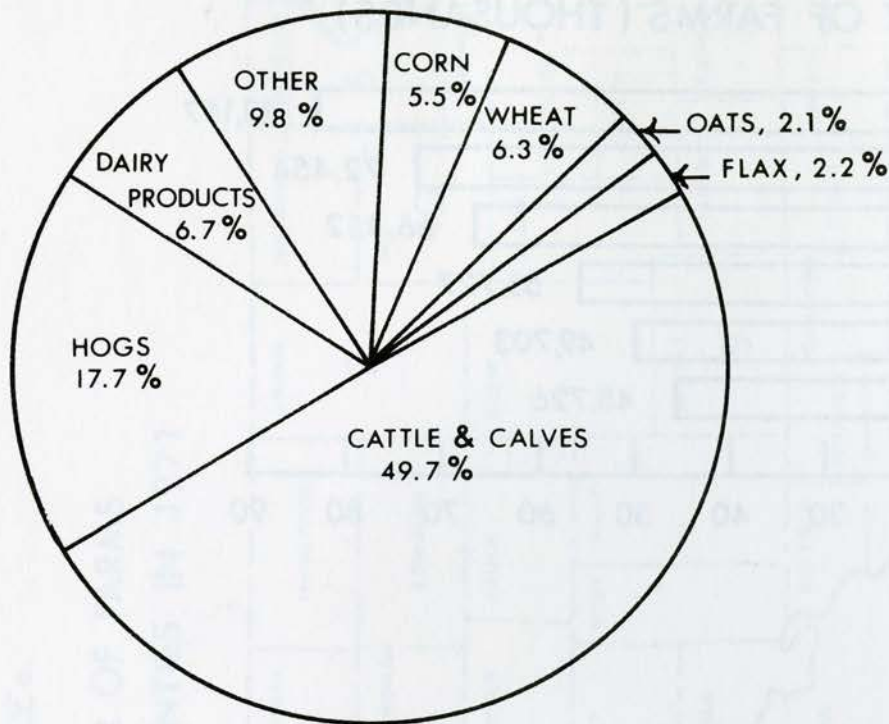
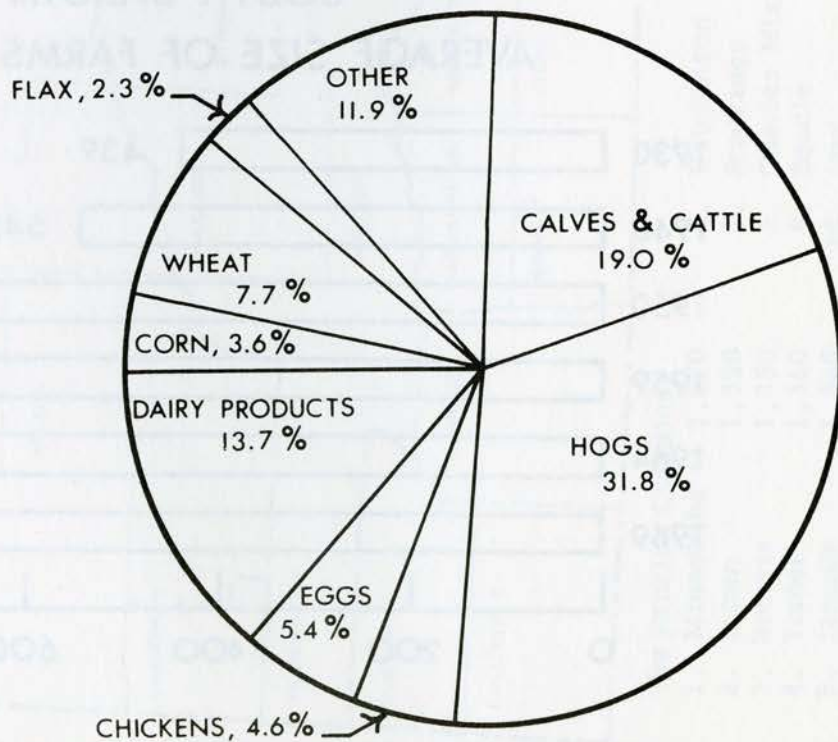


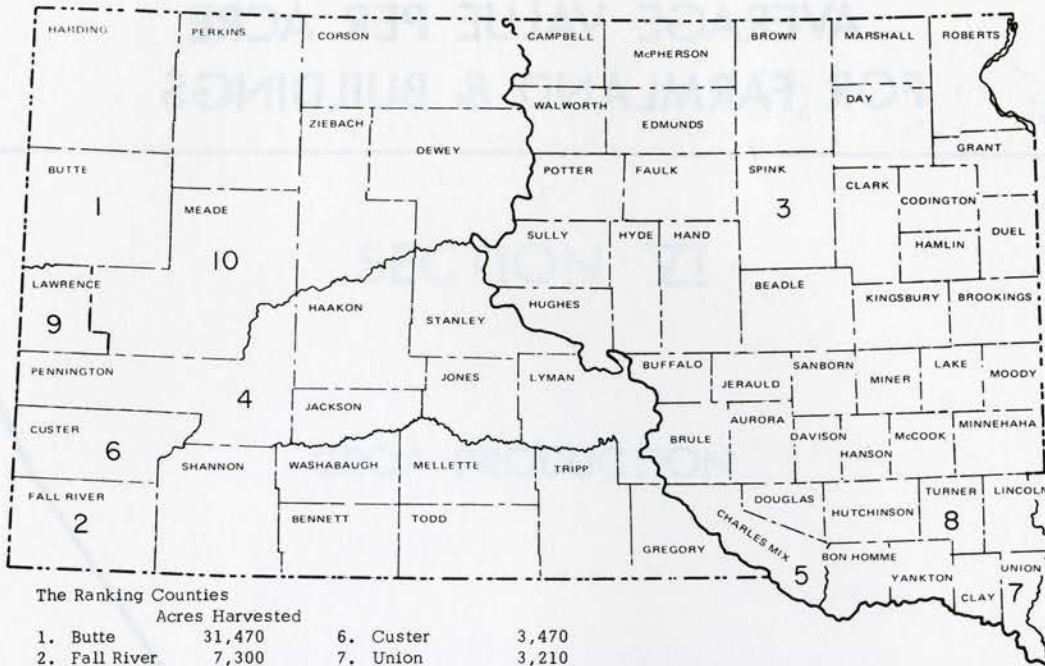

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1970



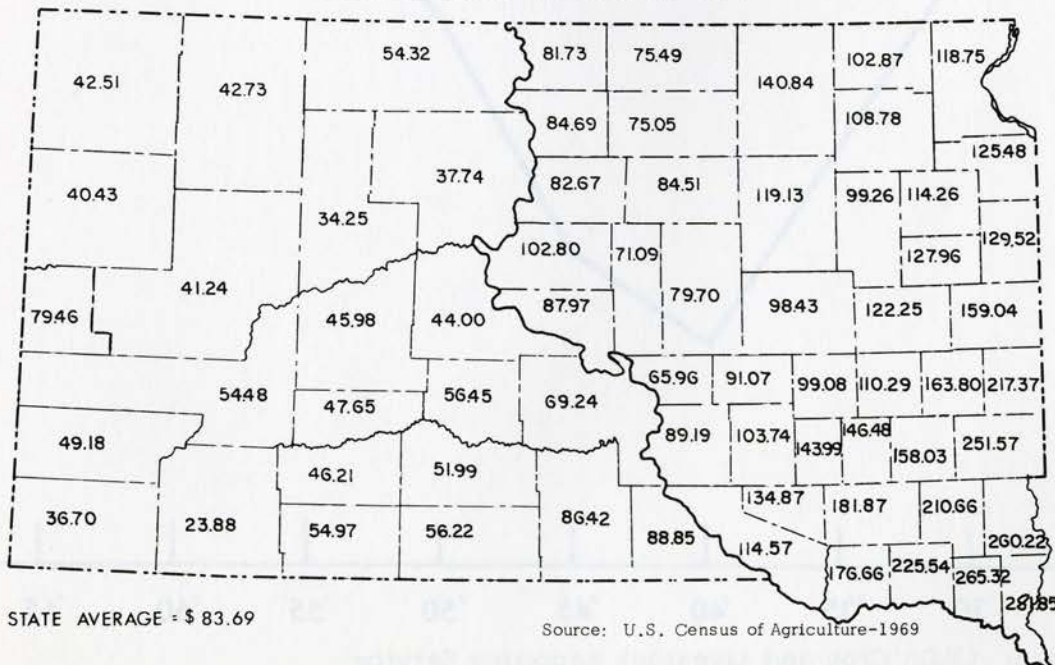

DOLLAR VALUE PER ACRE IN 1969



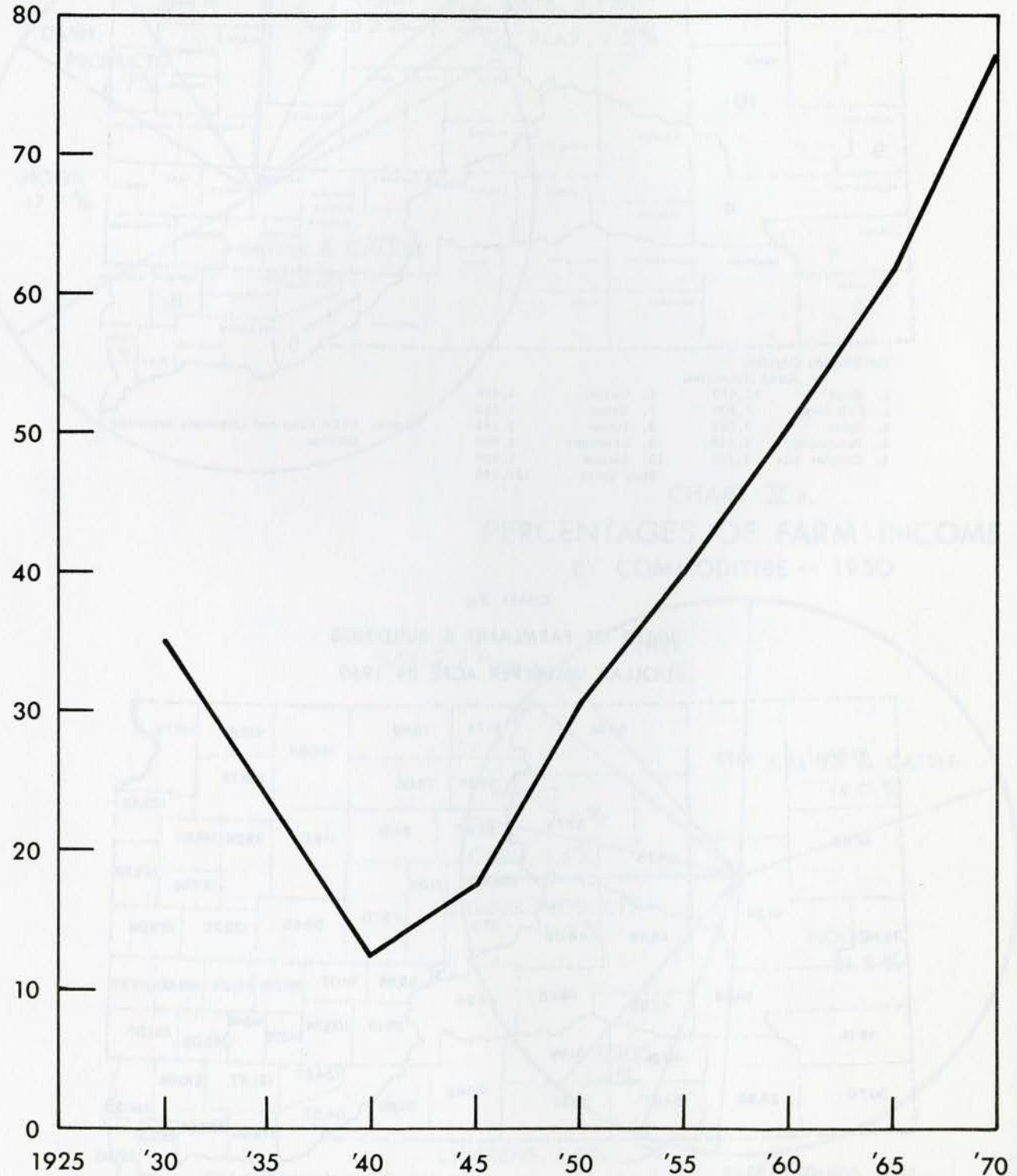

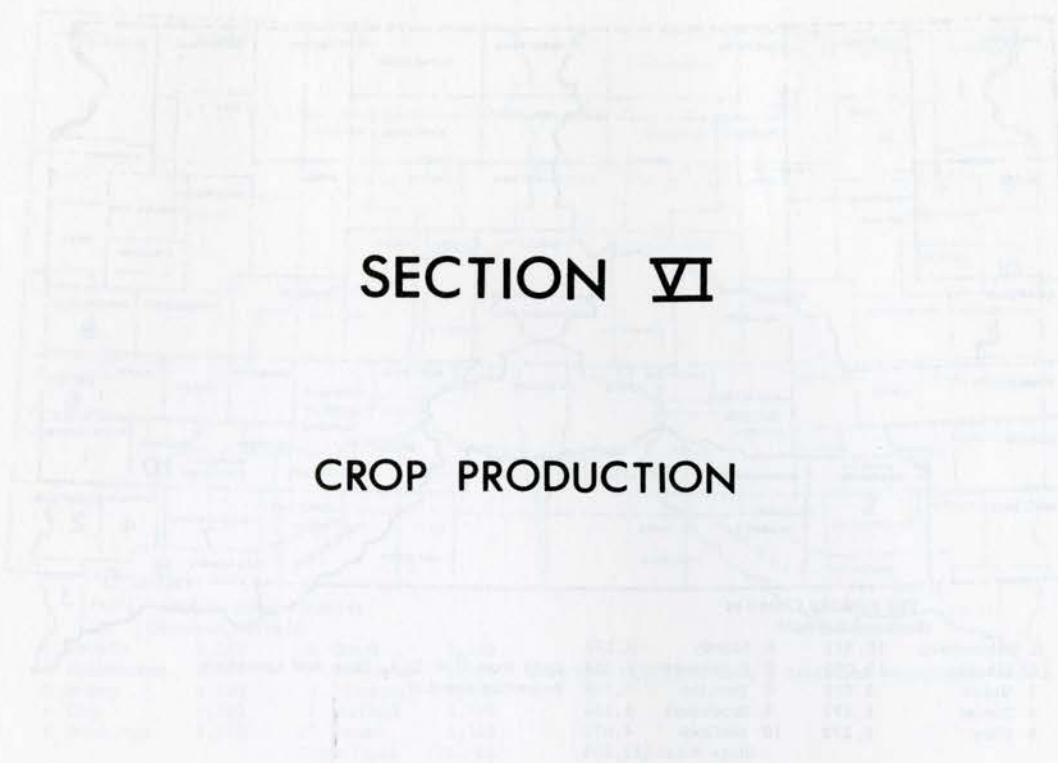
SOUTH DAKOTA AVERAGE VALUE PER ACRE FOR FARMLAND & BUILDINGS

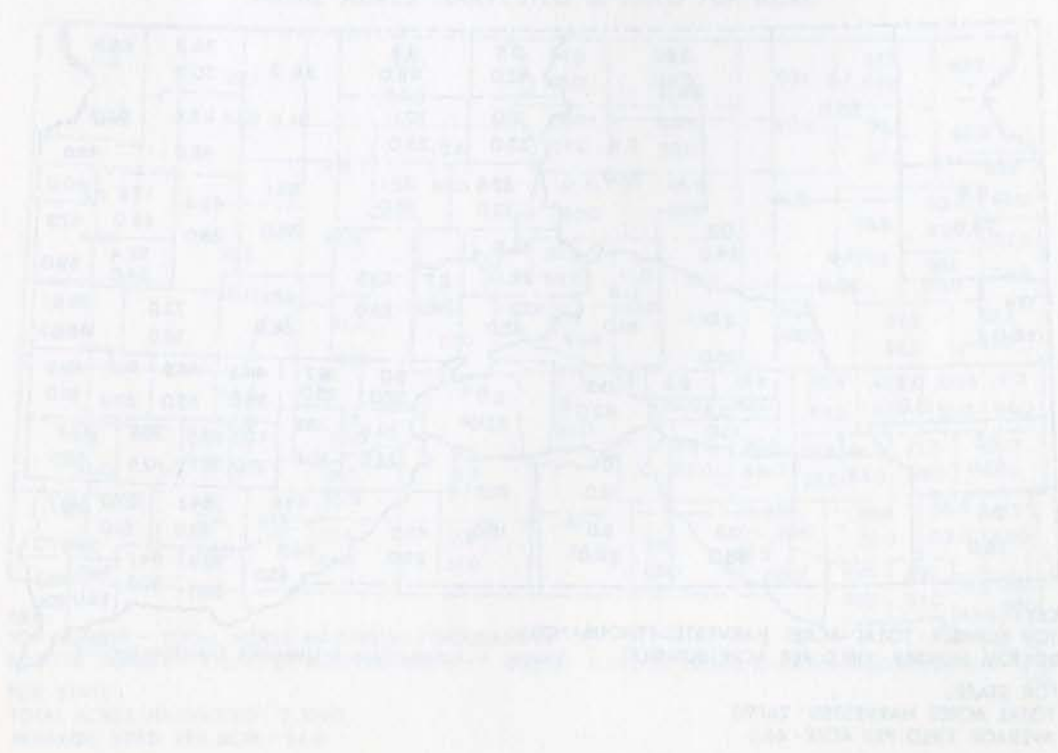
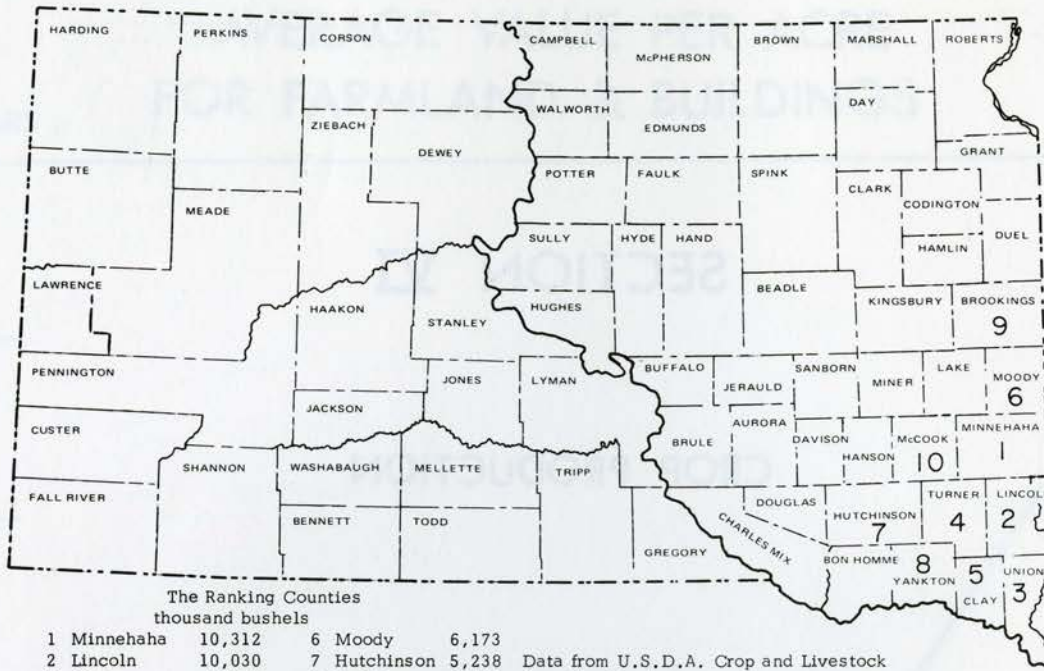

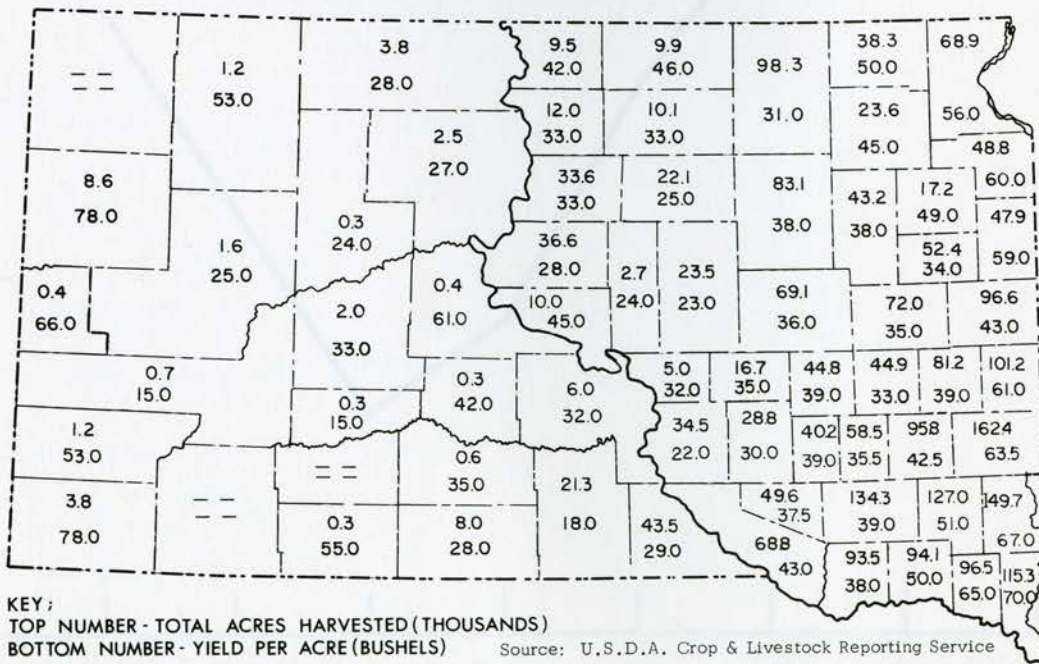

TOTAL ACRES HARVESTED & YIELD PER ACRE

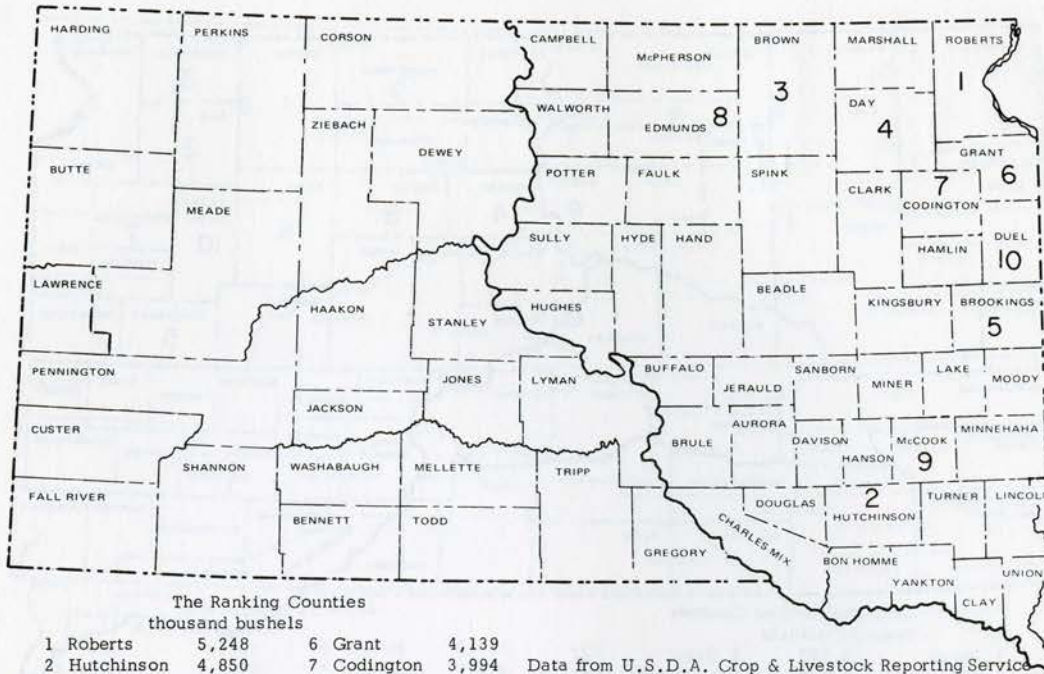

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971



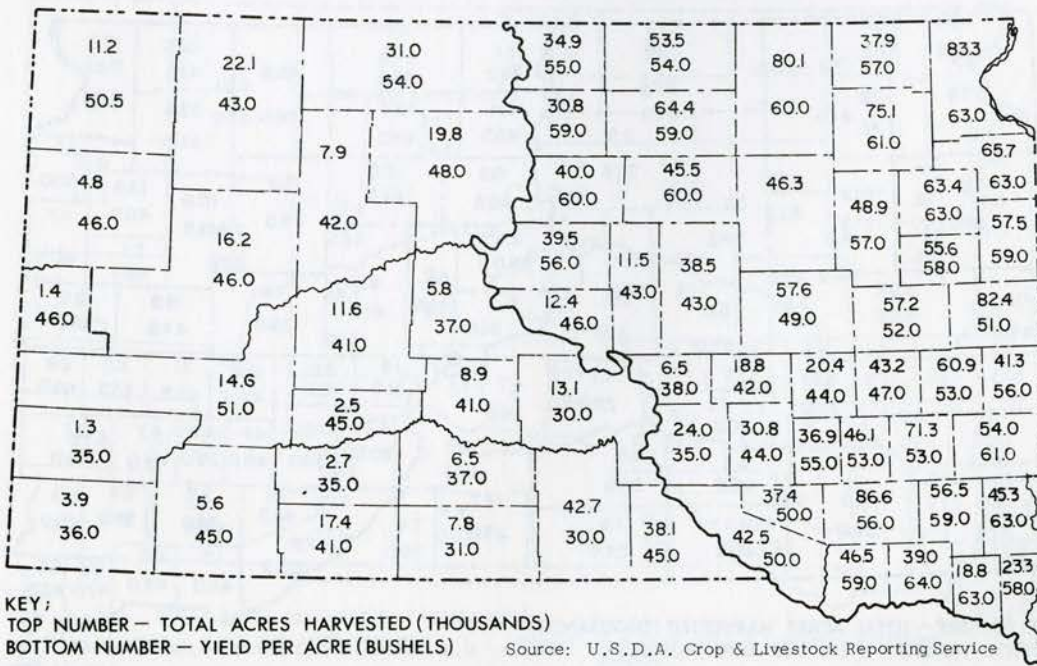

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

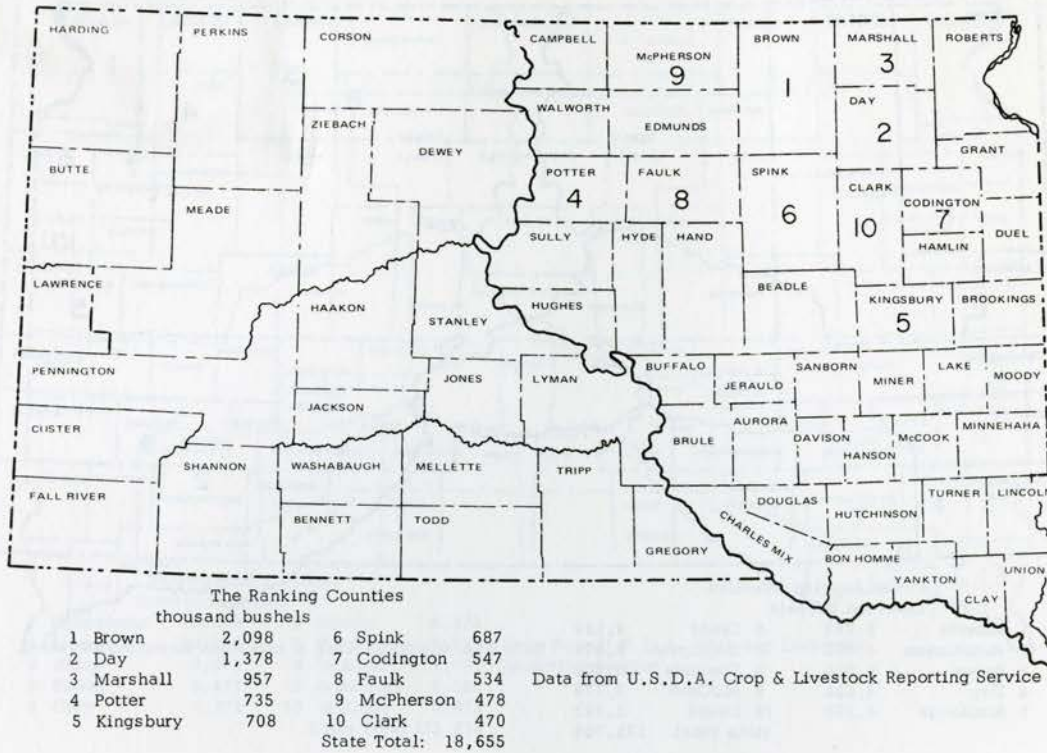
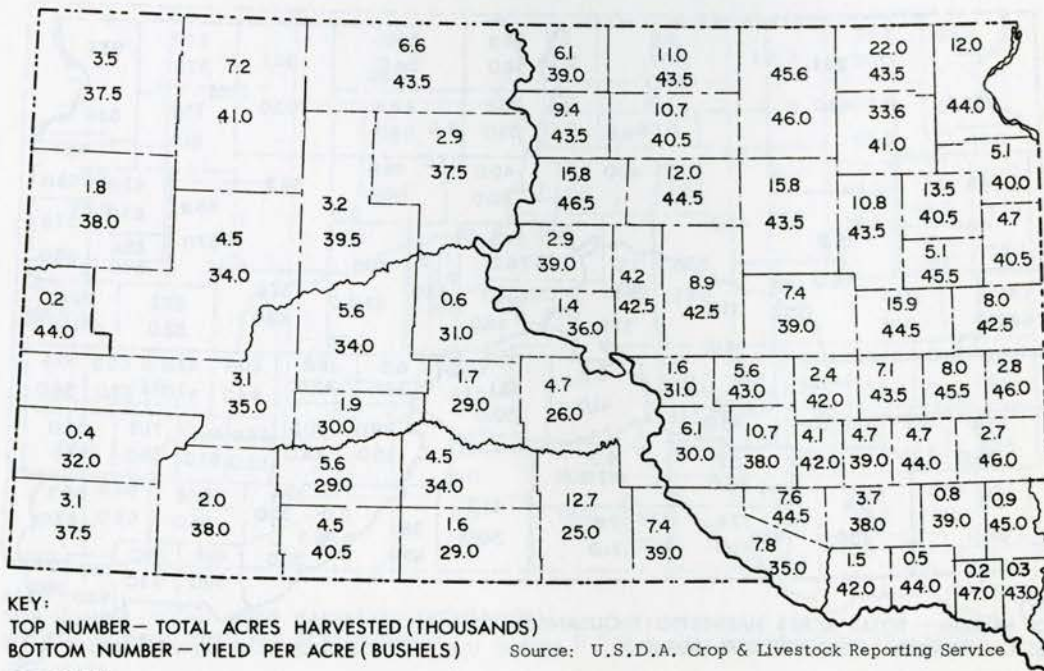

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

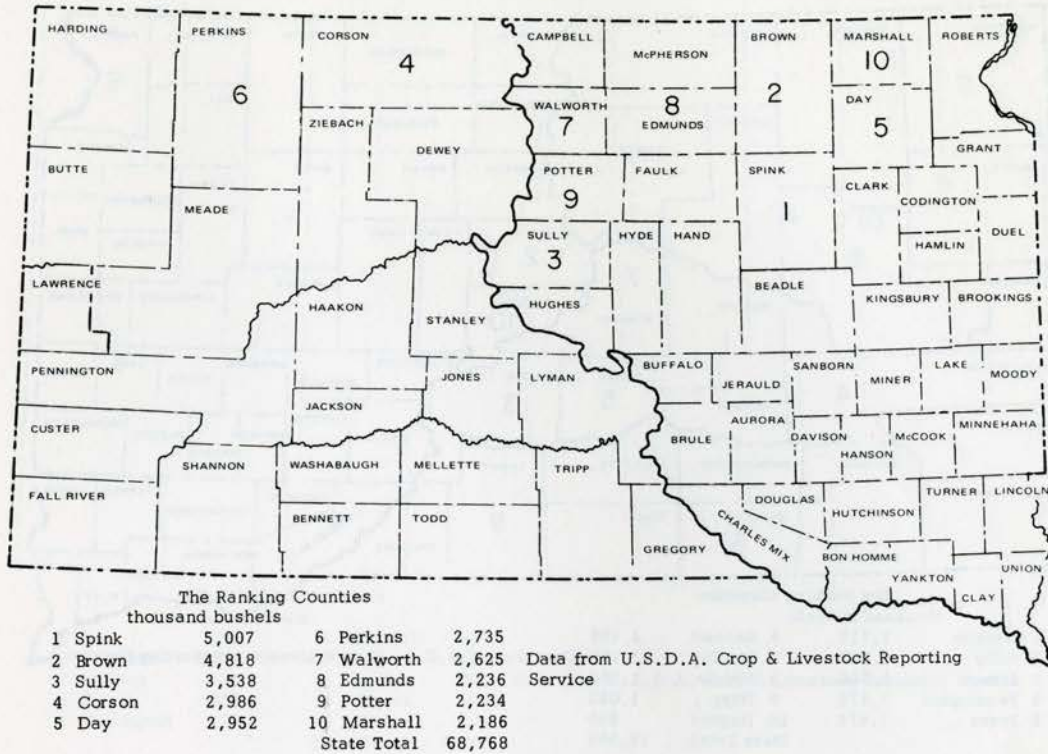

TOTAL ACRES HARVESTED & YIELD PER ACRE

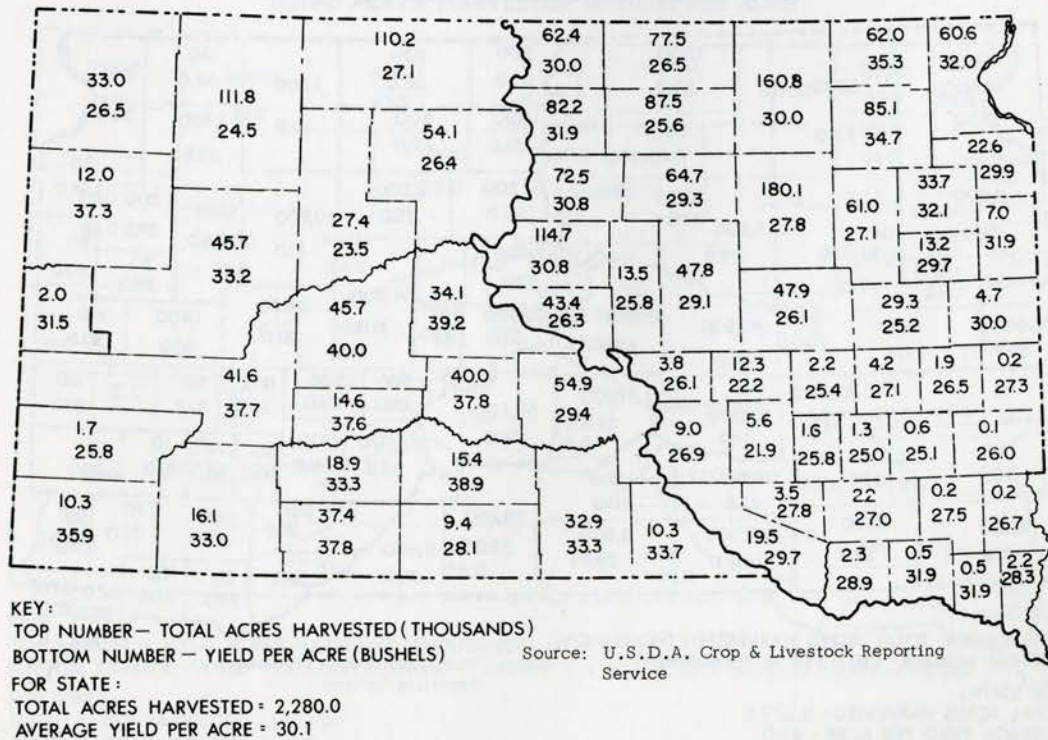
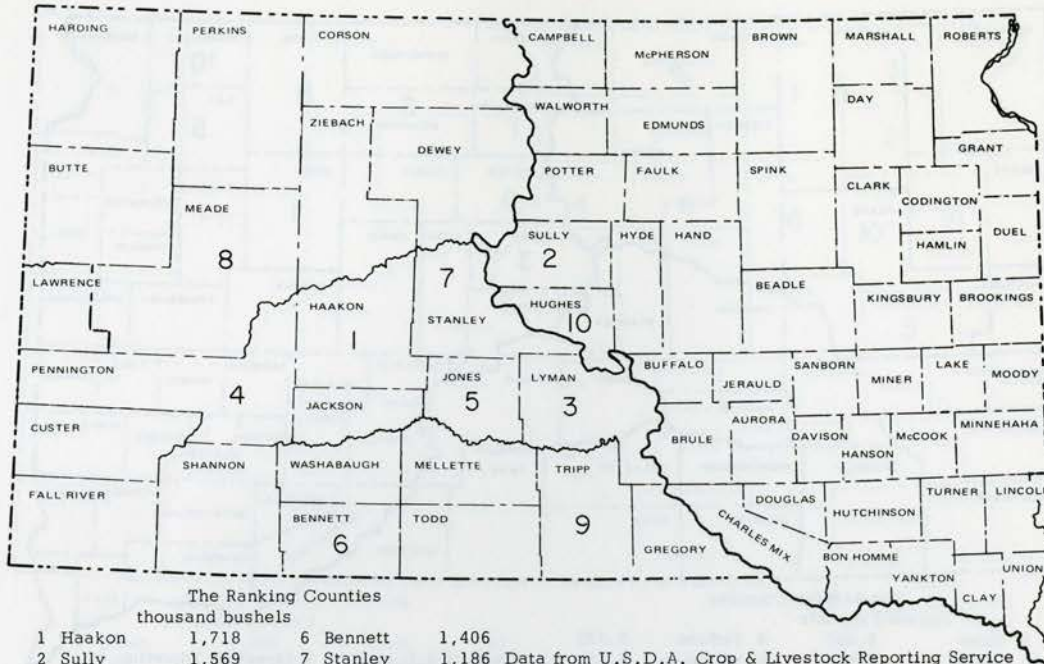

THE TEN TOP COUNTIES IN 1971



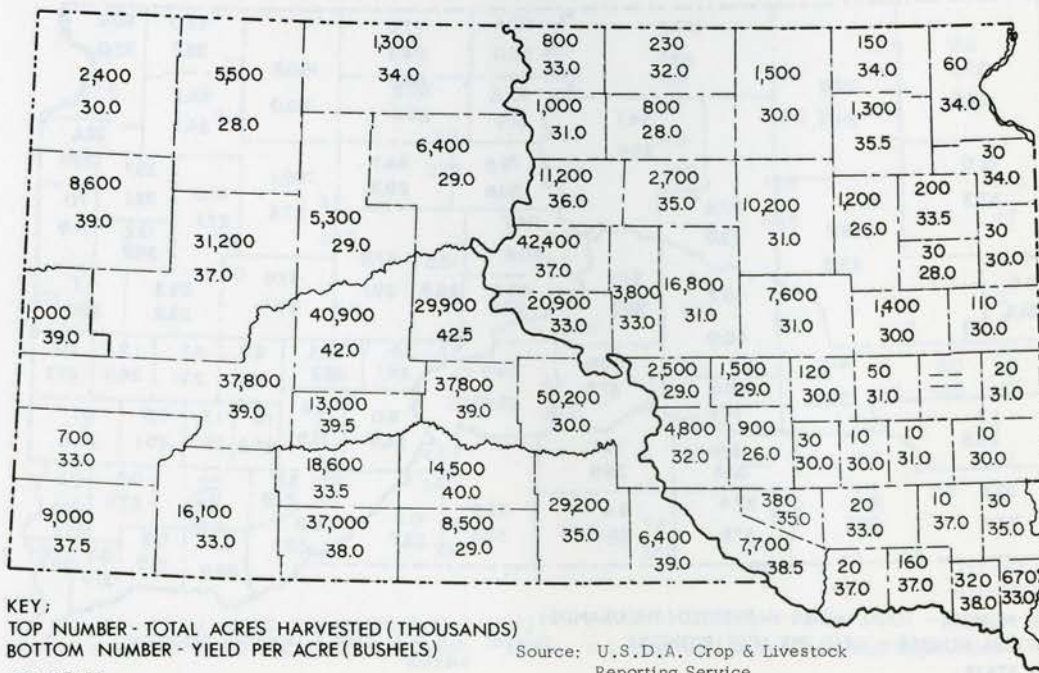

TOTAL ACRES HARVESTED & YIELD PER ACRE



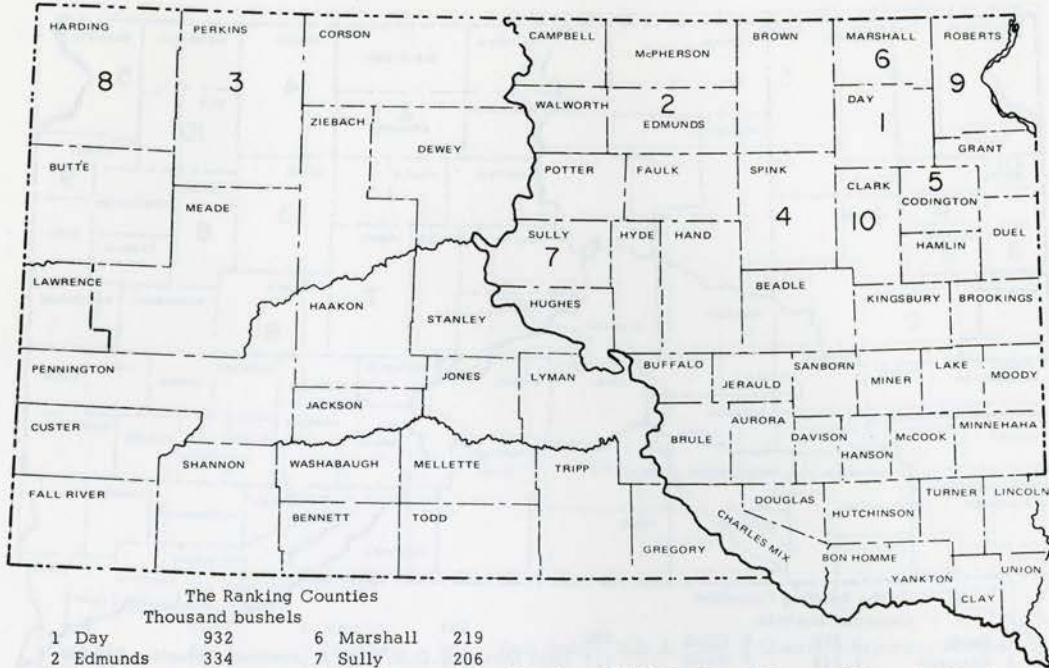

THE TEN TOP COUNTIES IN 1971



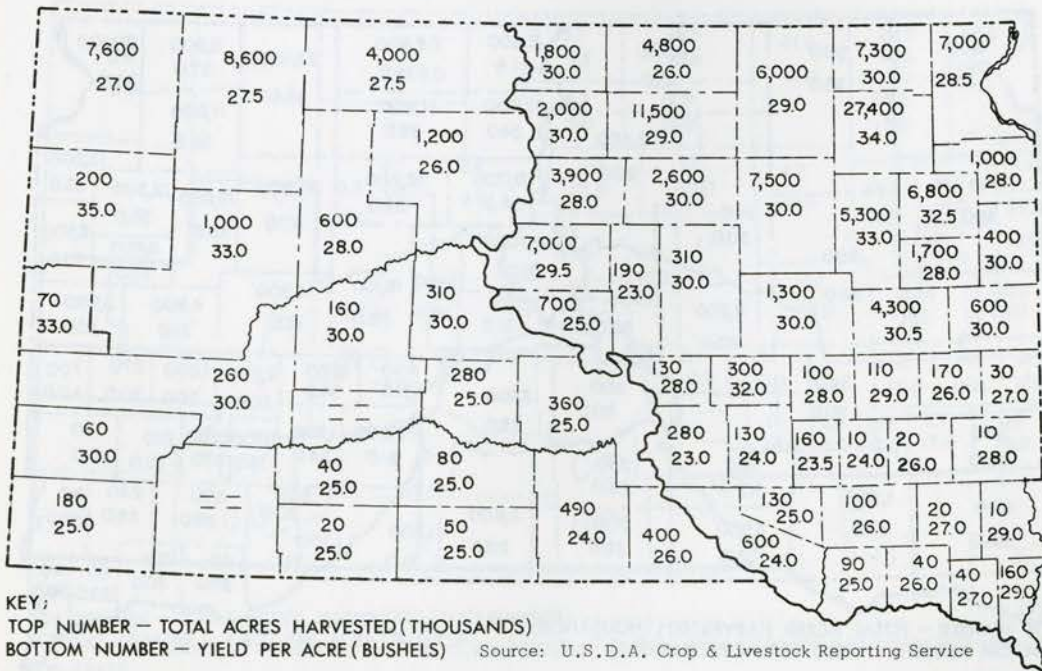

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

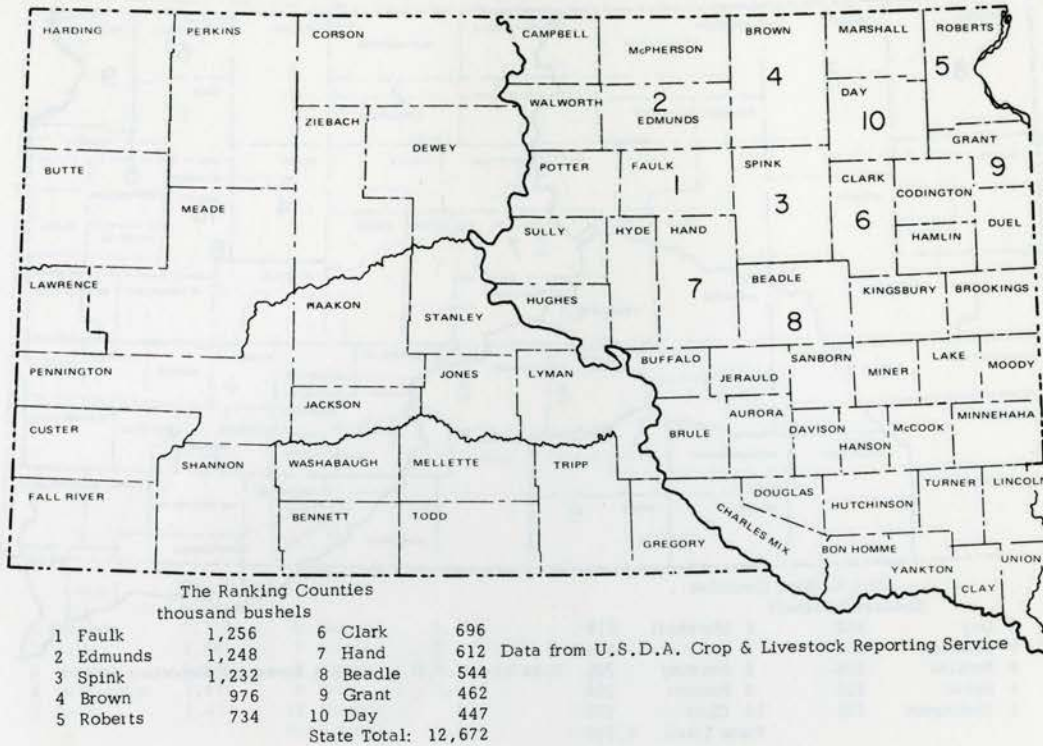
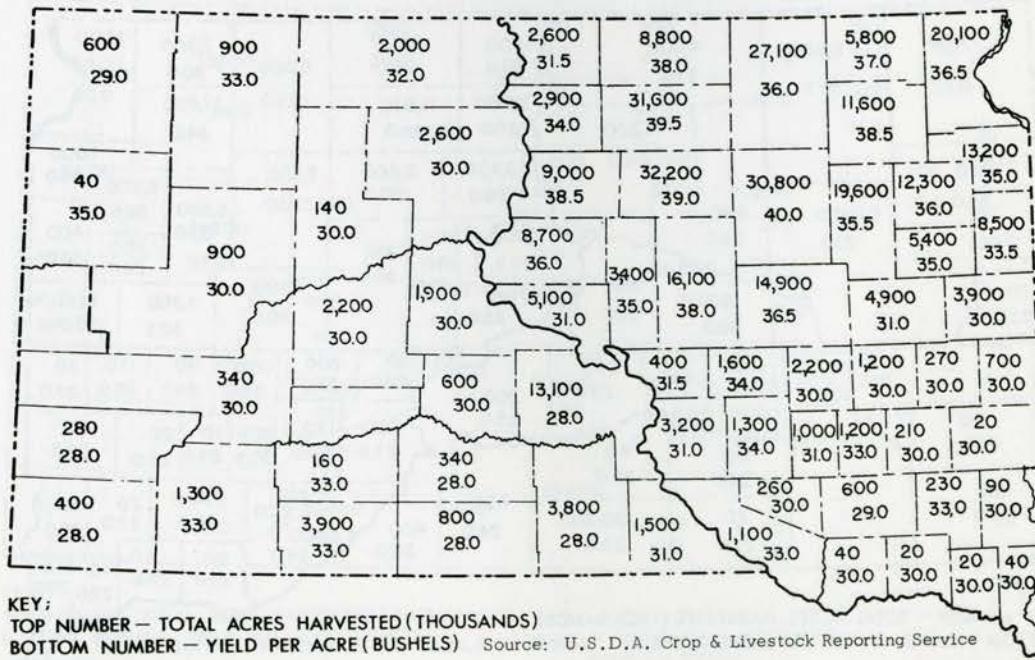

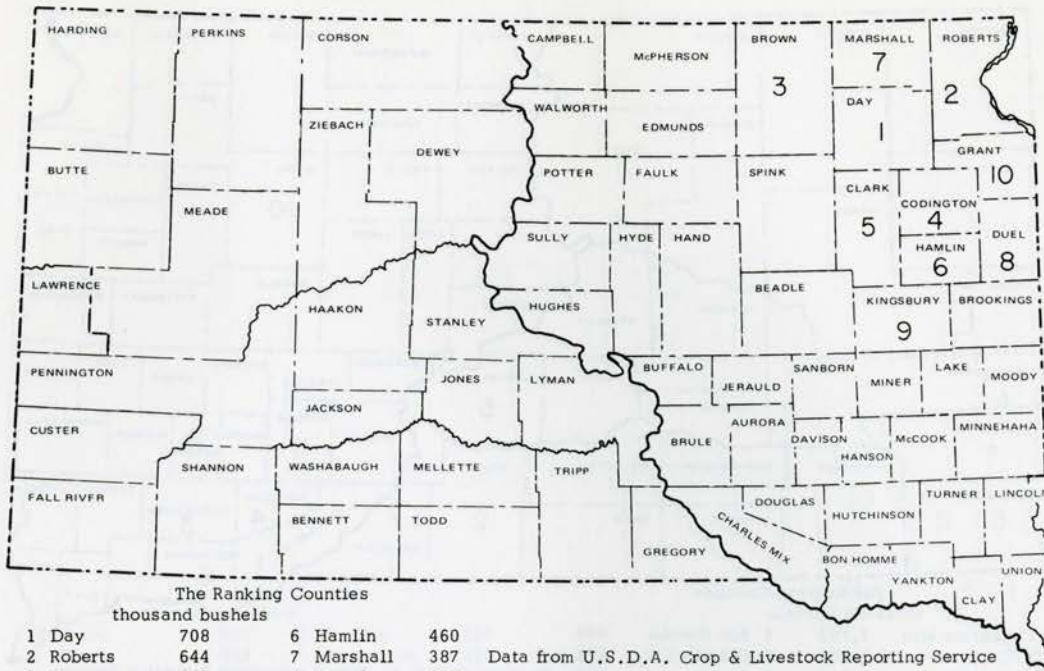
RYE PRODUCTION IN 1971

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

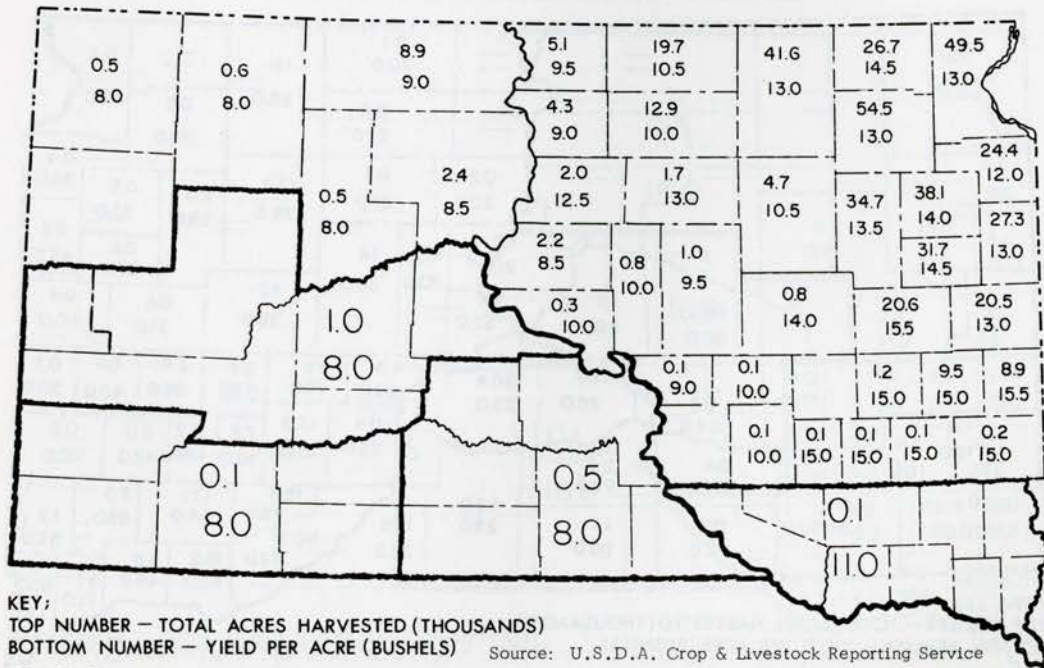

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

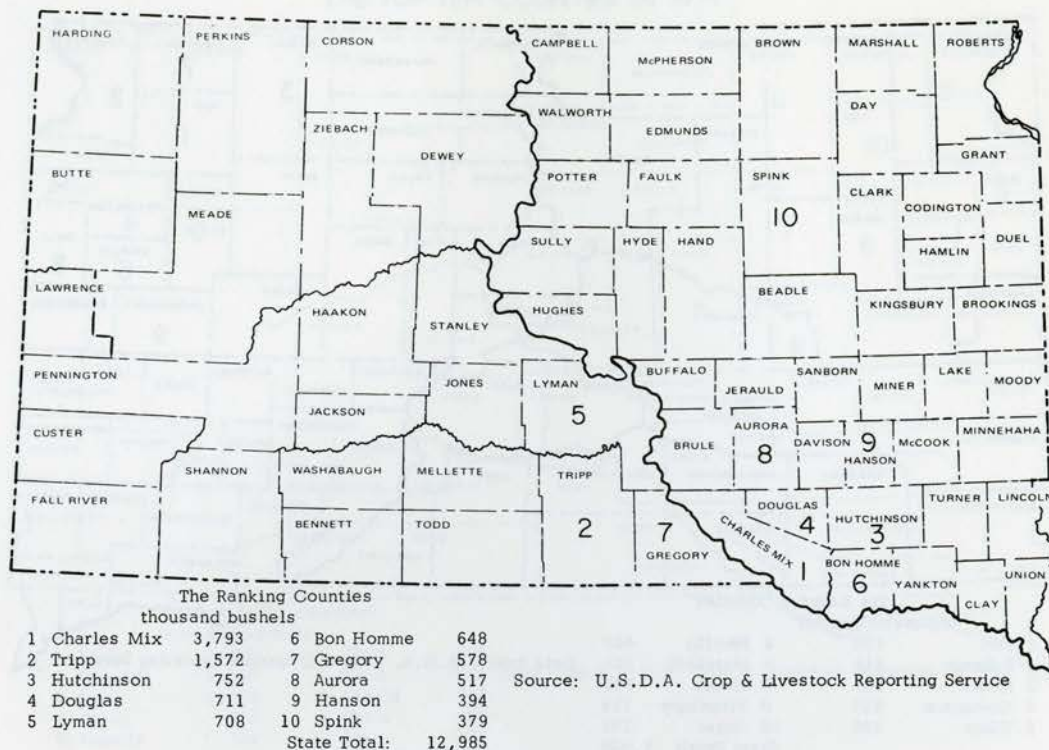

TOTAL ACRES HARVESTED & YIELD PER ACRE

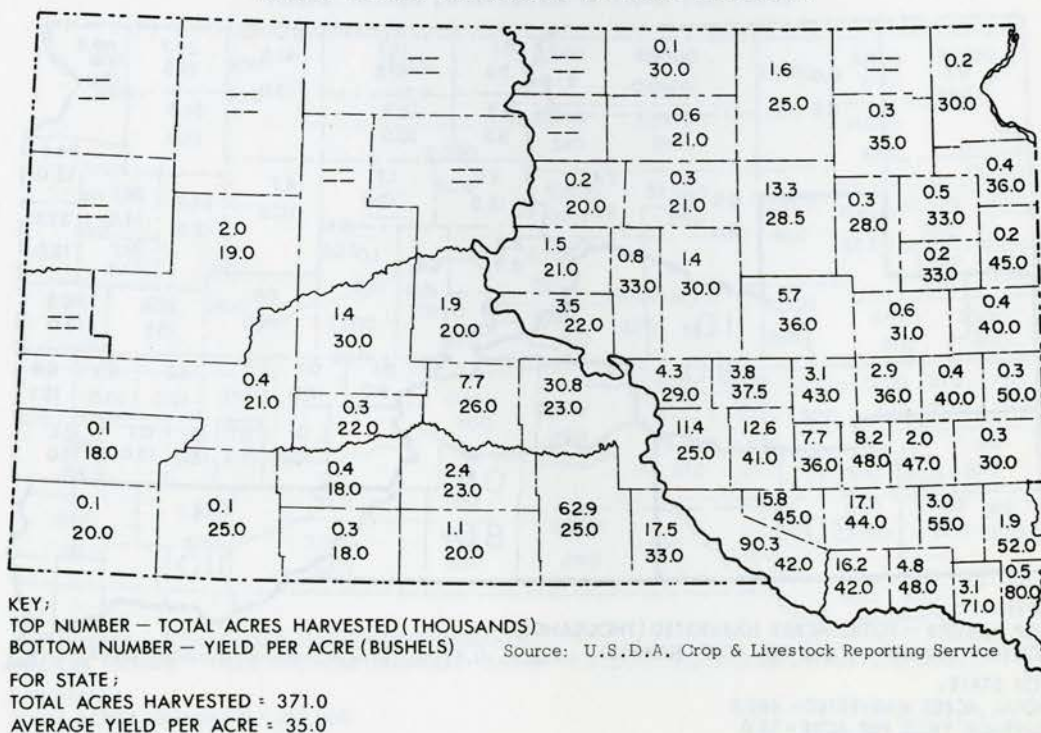

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN 1971

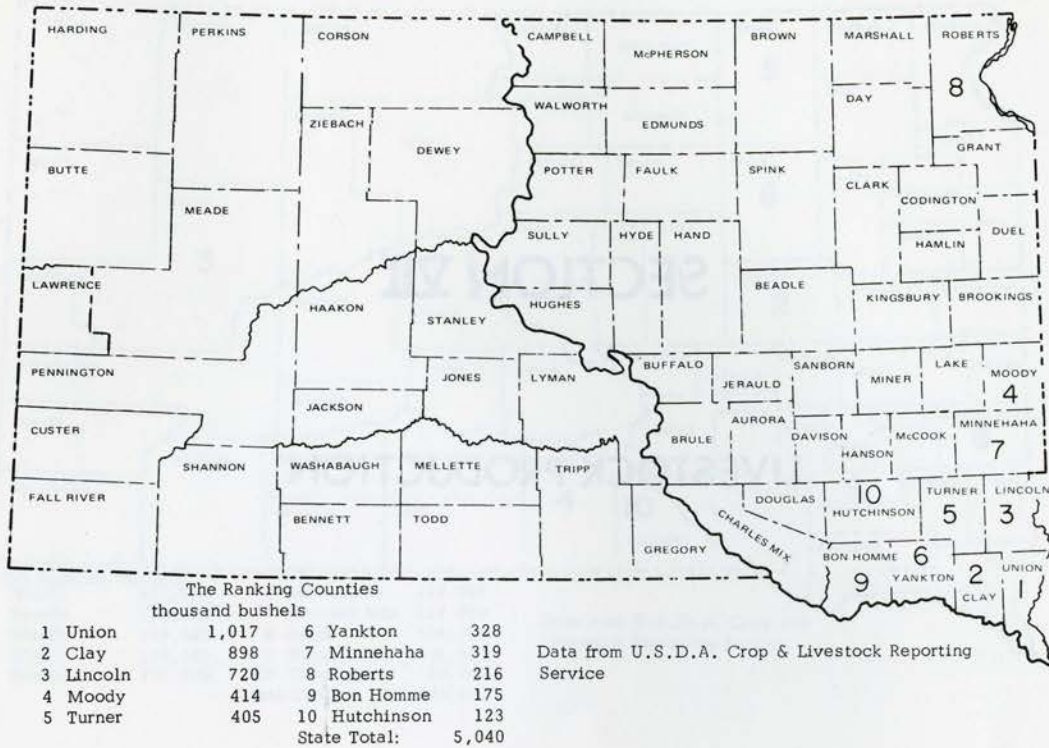
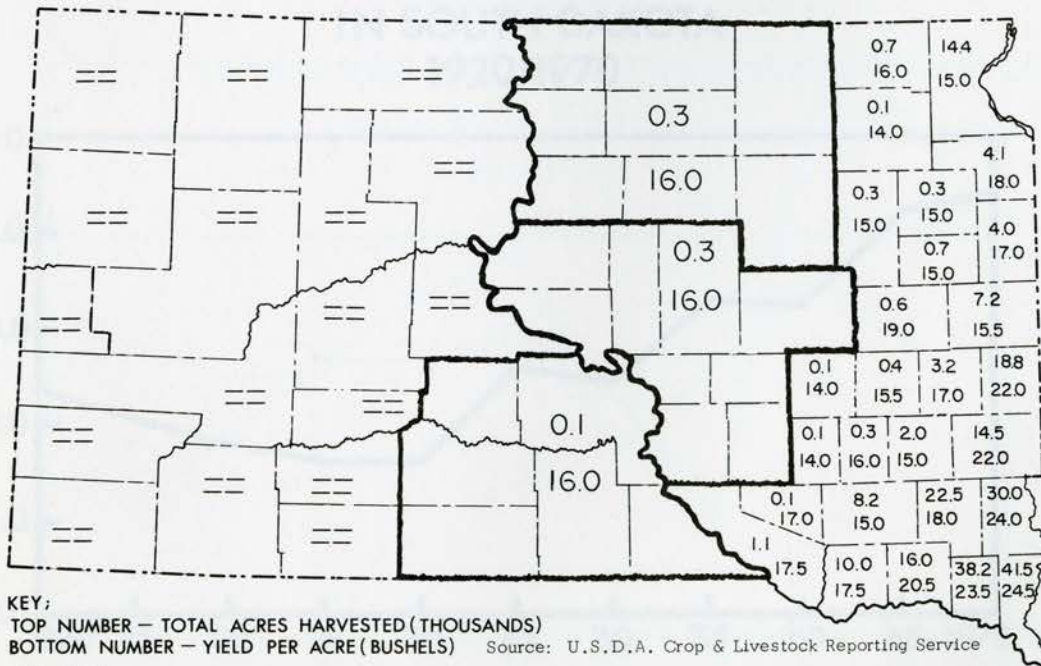

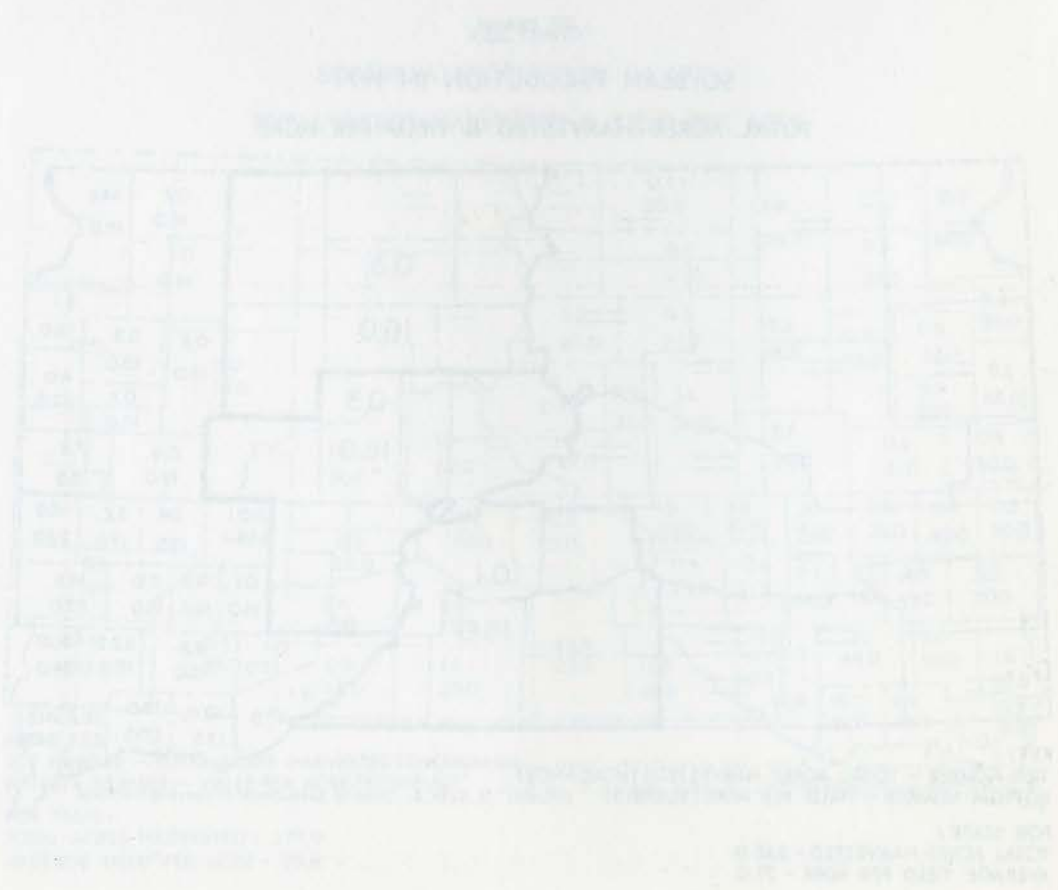

 1972**

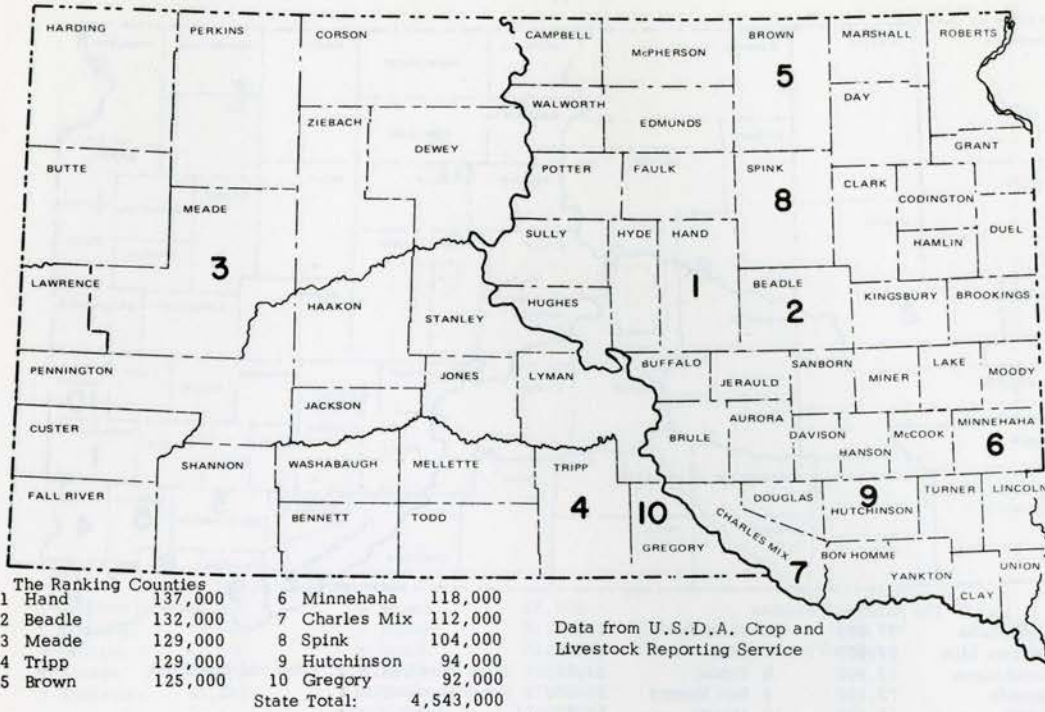
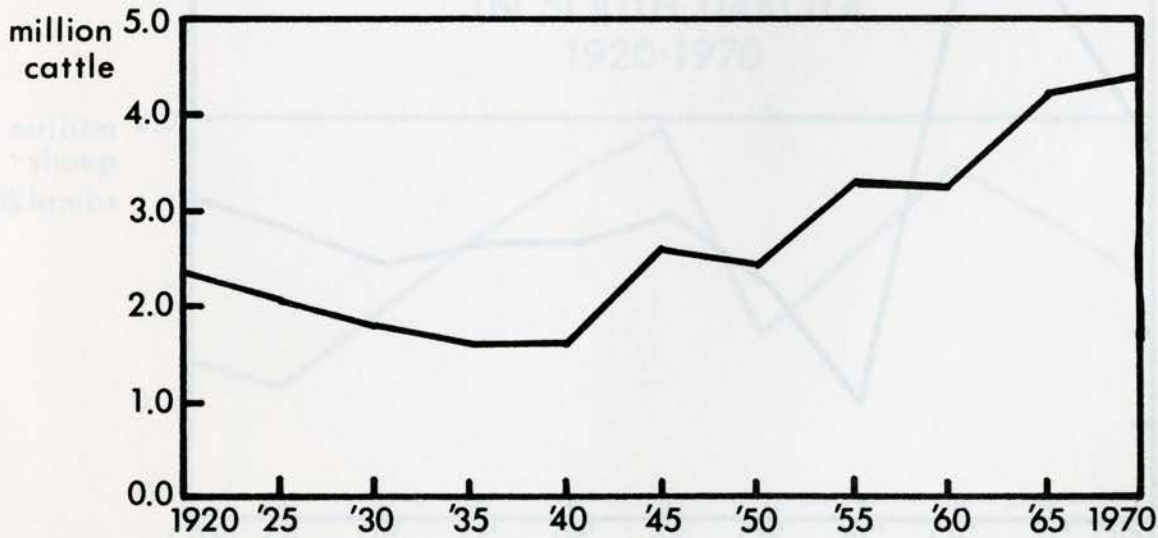


CHART VII b.

1971

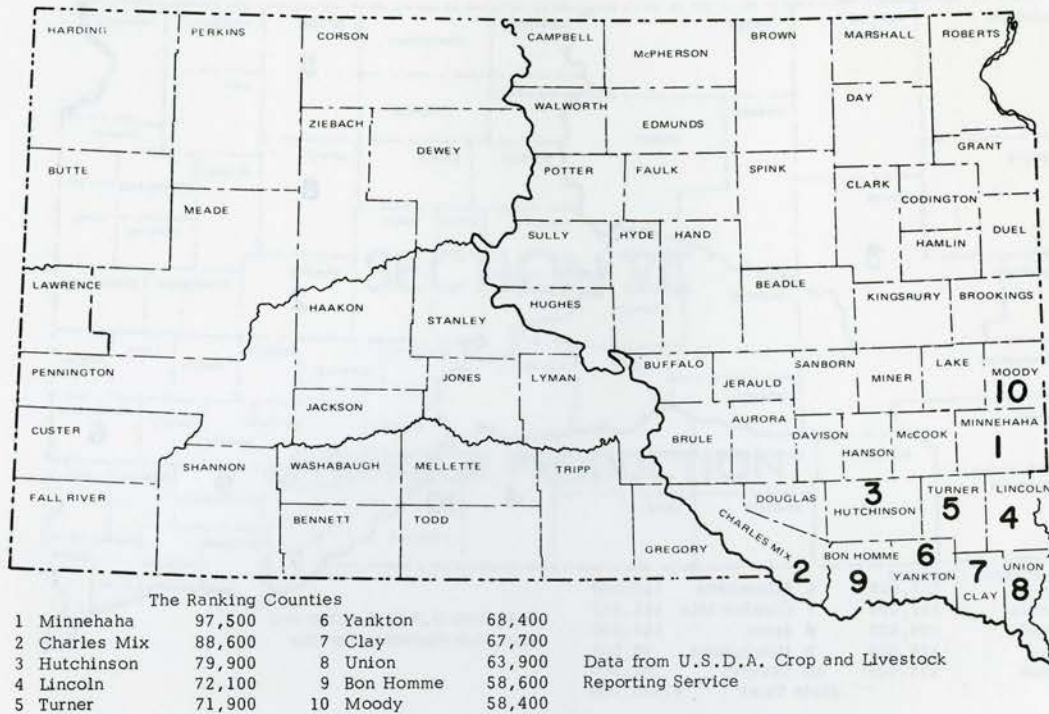
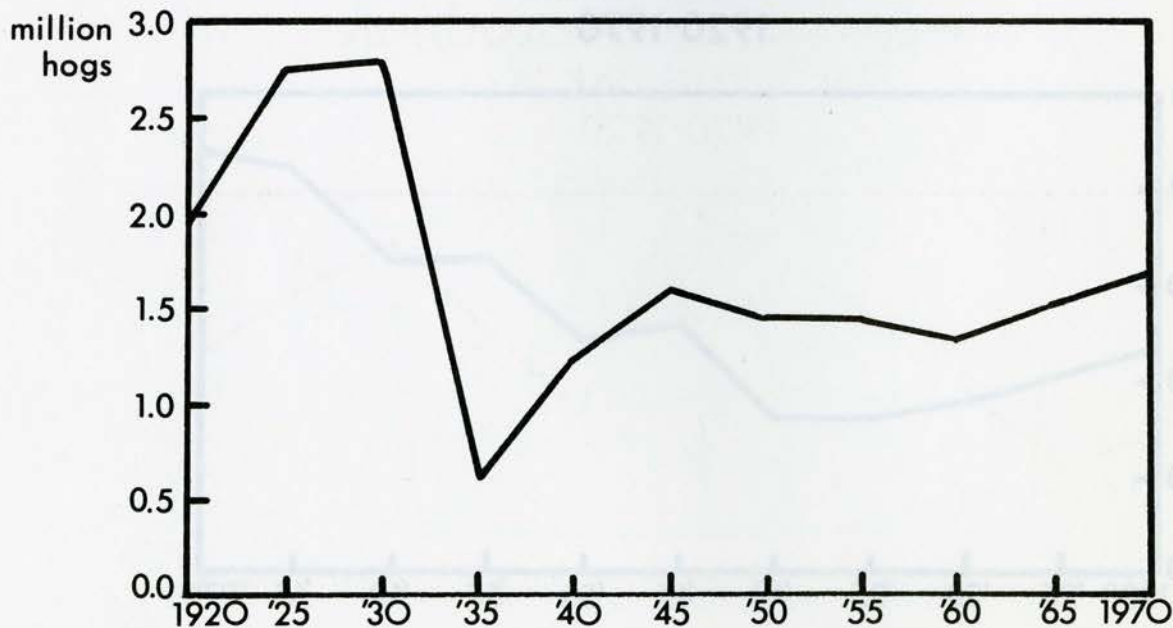

THE TOP TEN COUNTIES IN SHEEP AND LAMB PRODUCTION 1972

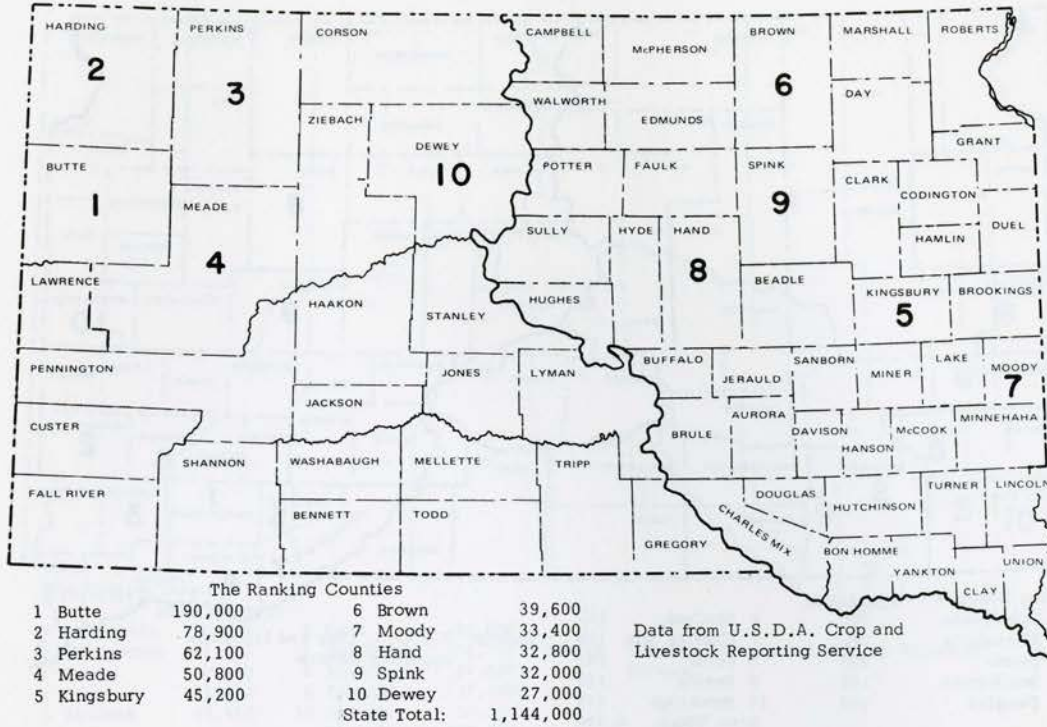
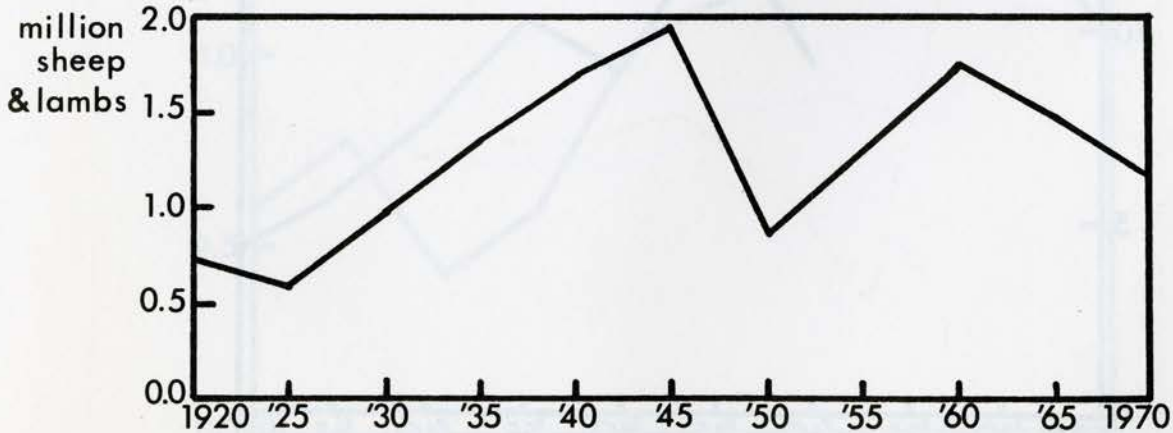


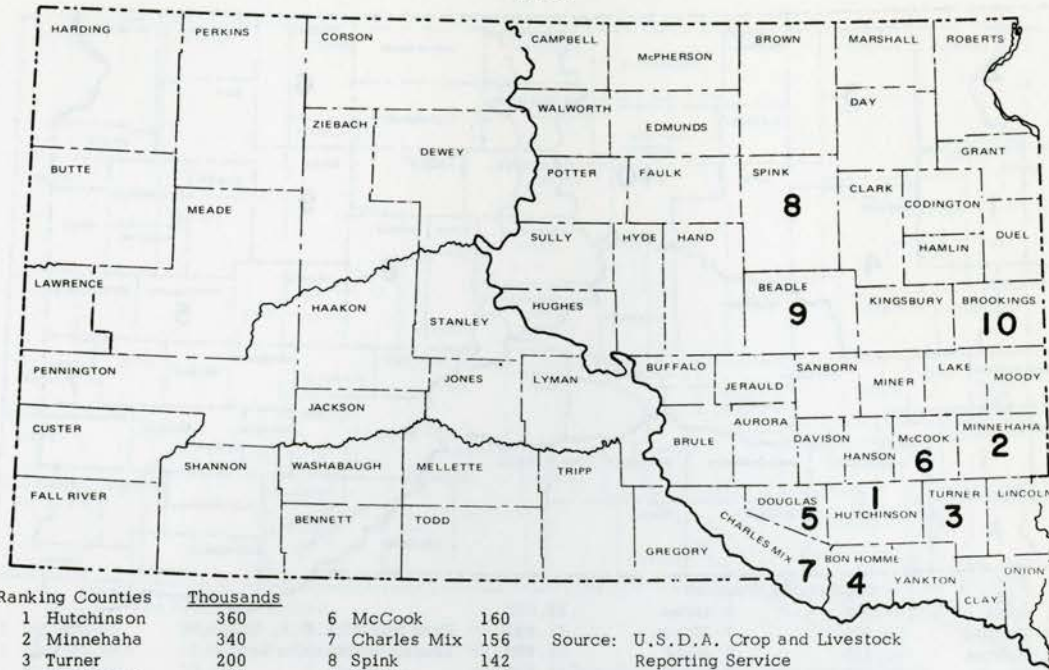

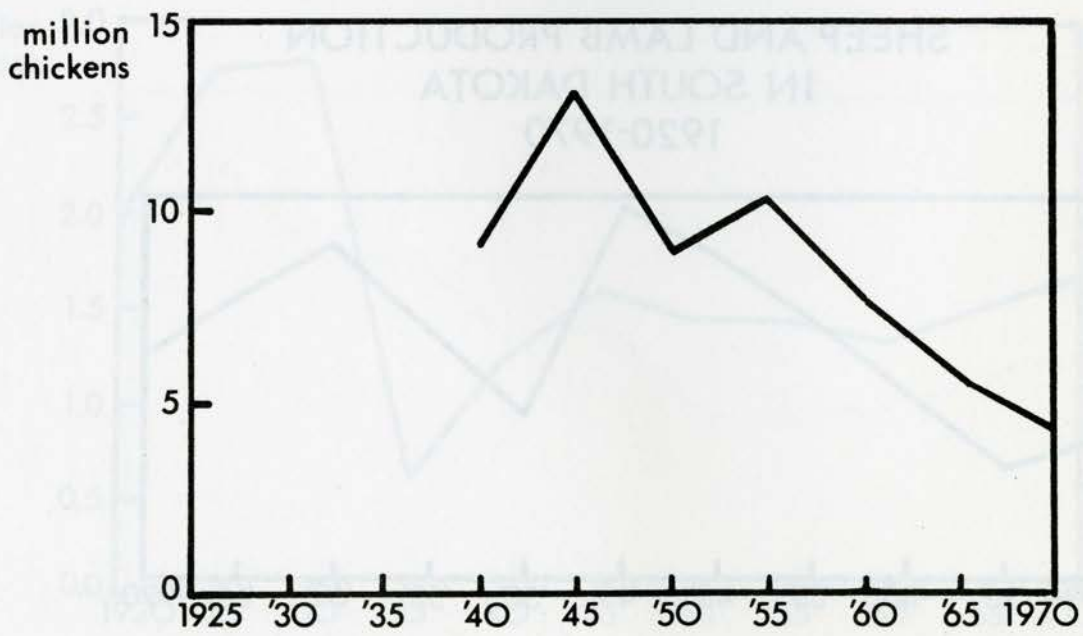

 1971

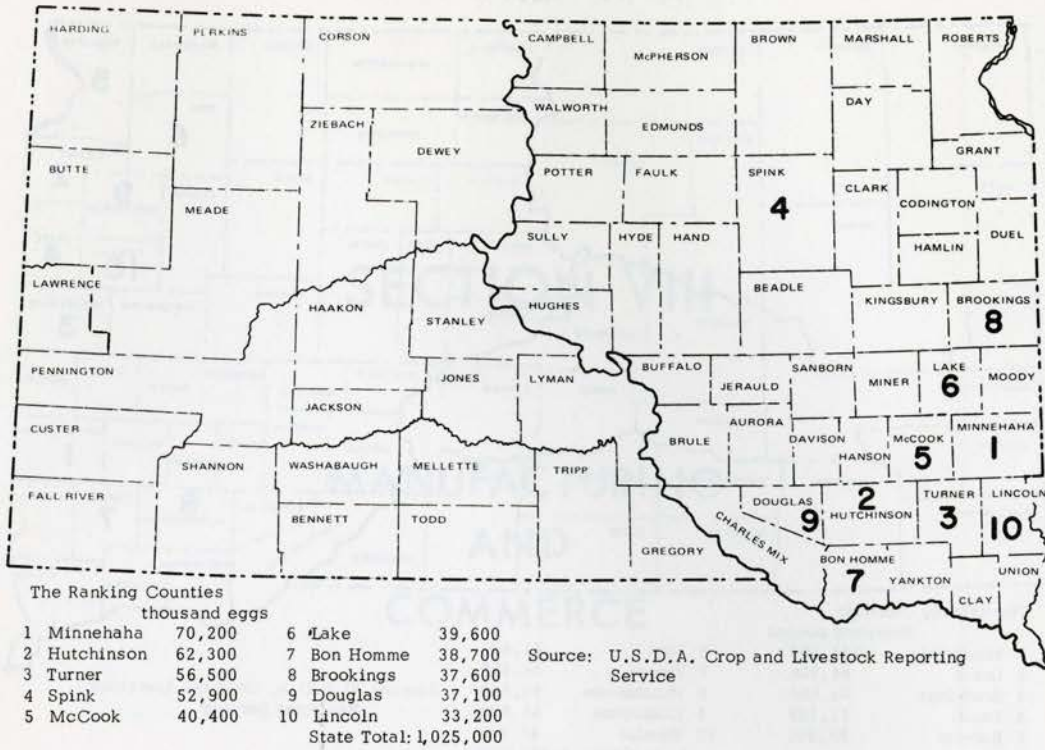

 1925-1970

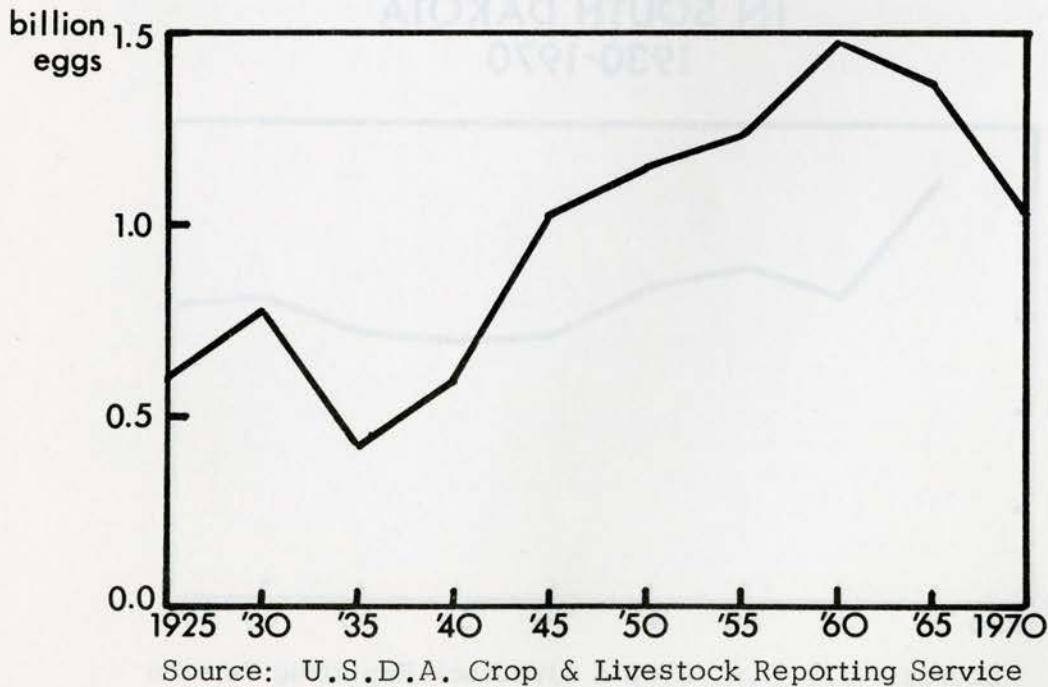
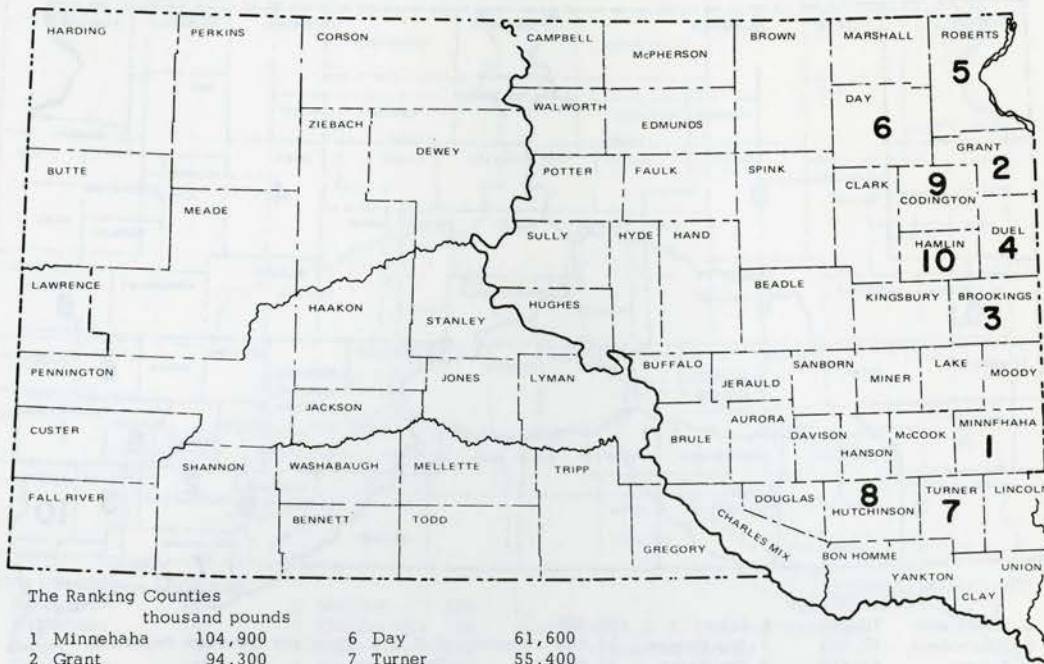

 1971**

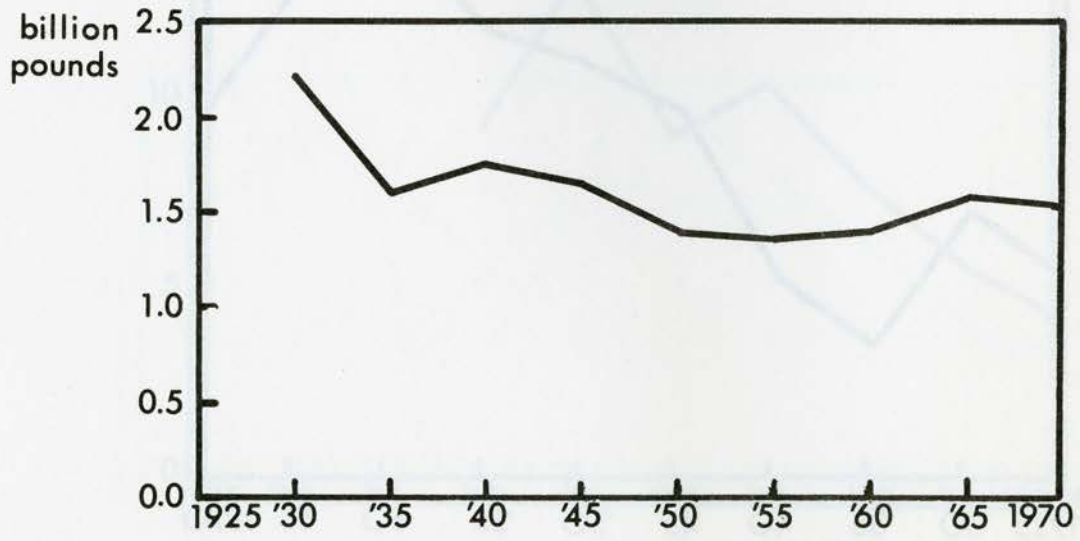

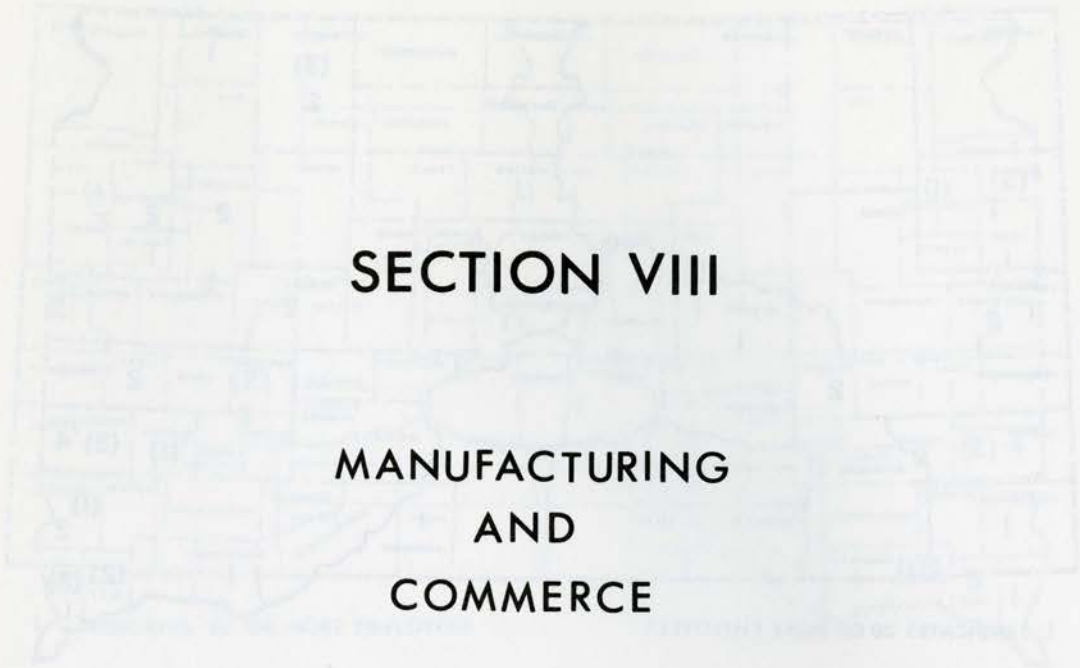

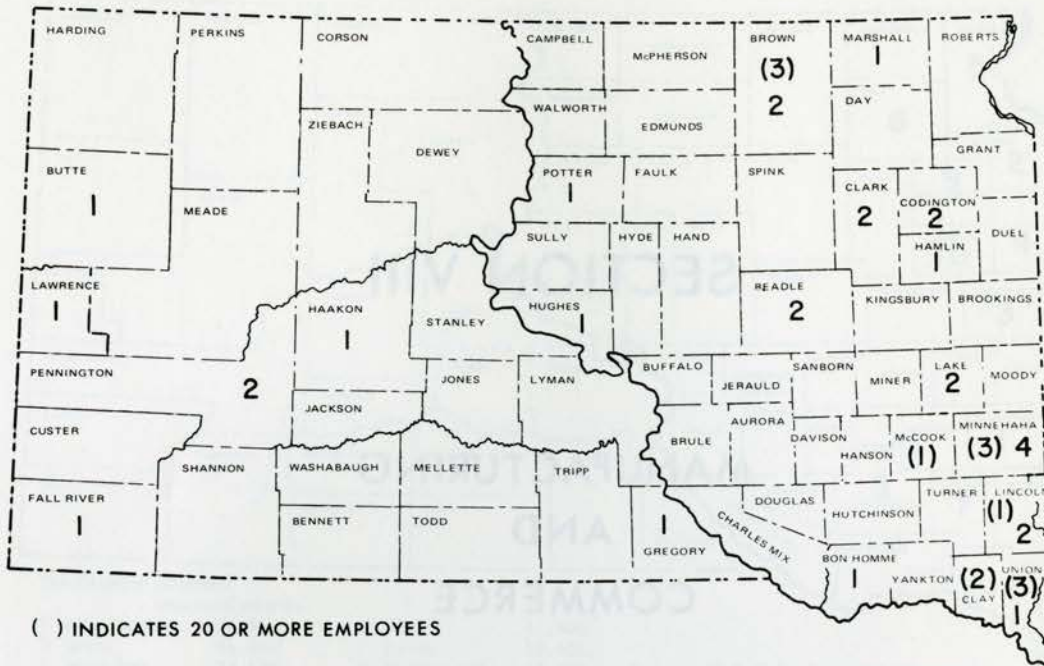

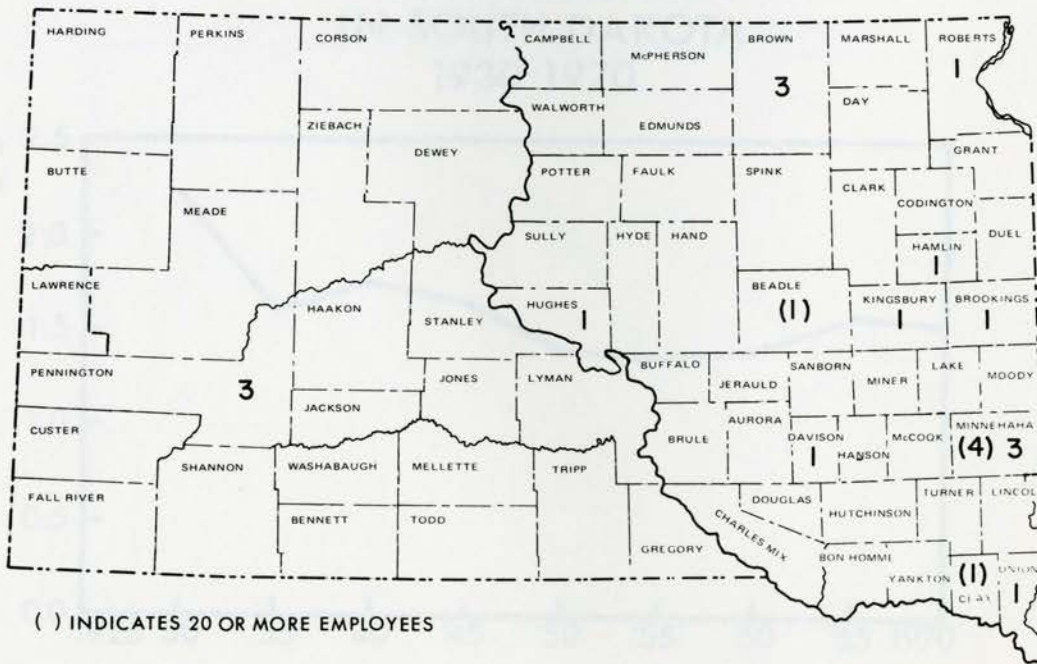
NUMBER OF MACHINERY MANUFACTURERS

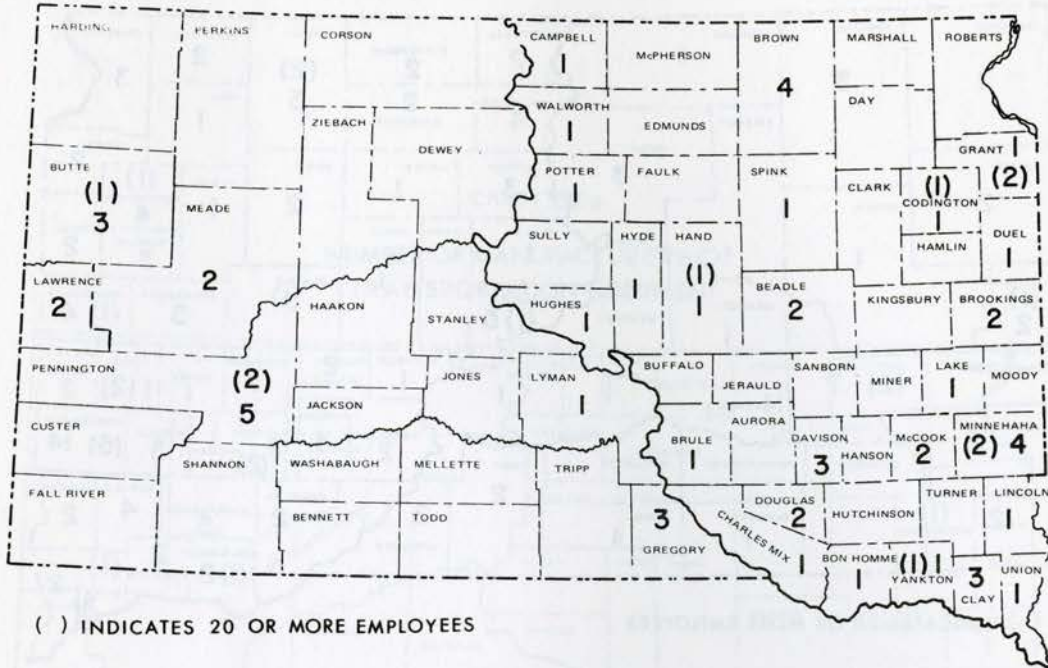
NUMBER OF MANUFACTURERS OF

STONE, CLAY, AND GLASS PRODUCTS

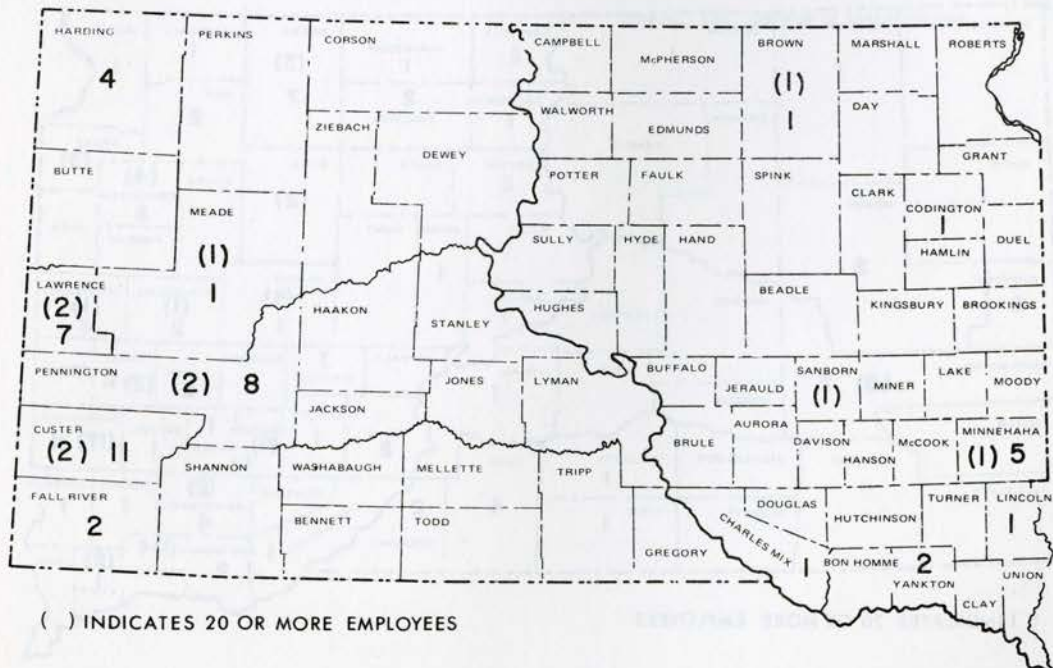

LUMBER AND WOOD PRODUCTS

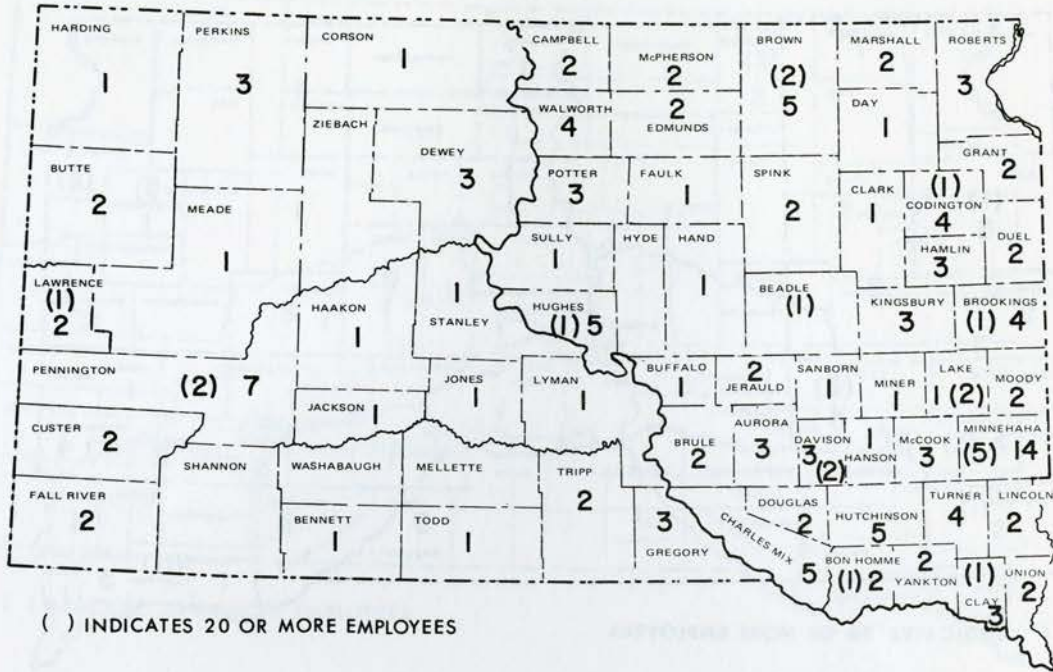

NUMBER OF PRINTERS AND PUBLISHERS

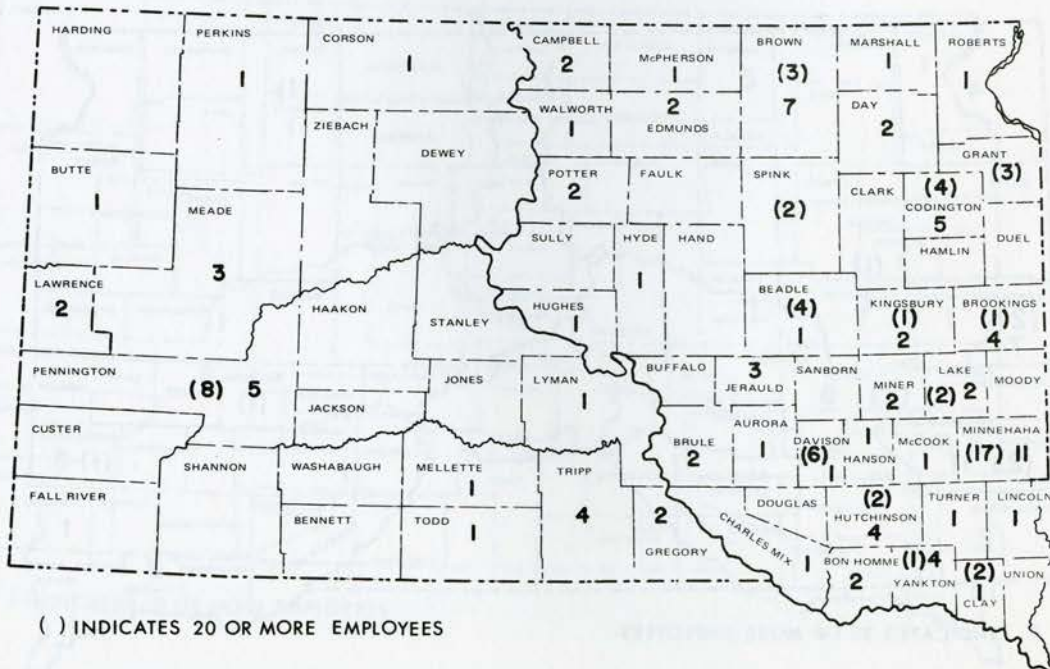

NUMBER OF PRODUCERS OF FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

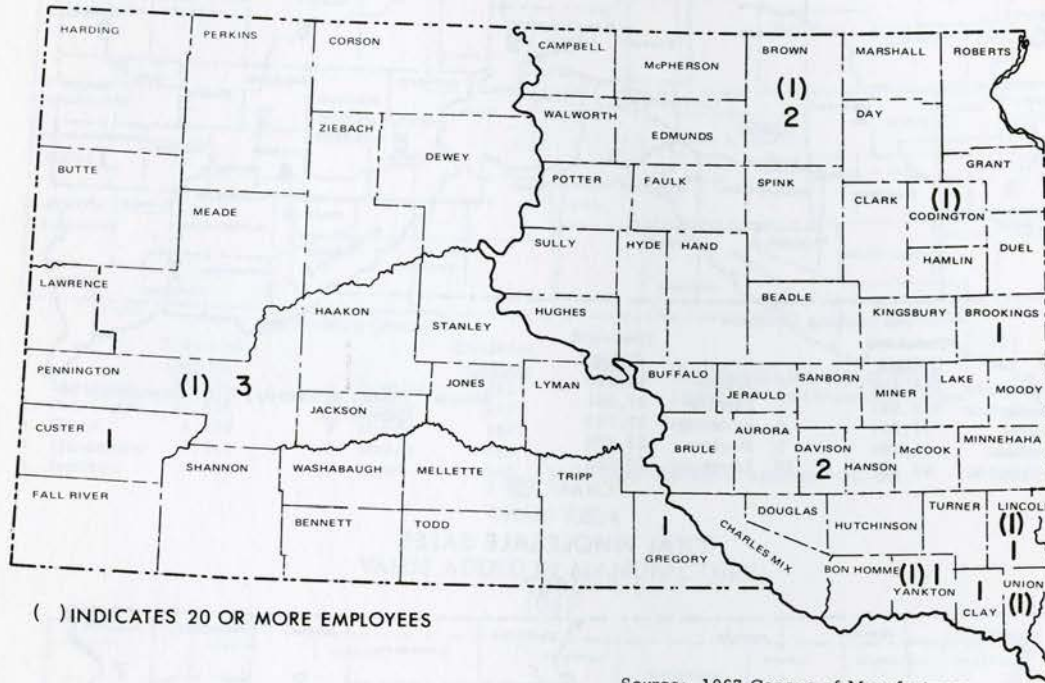

TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT



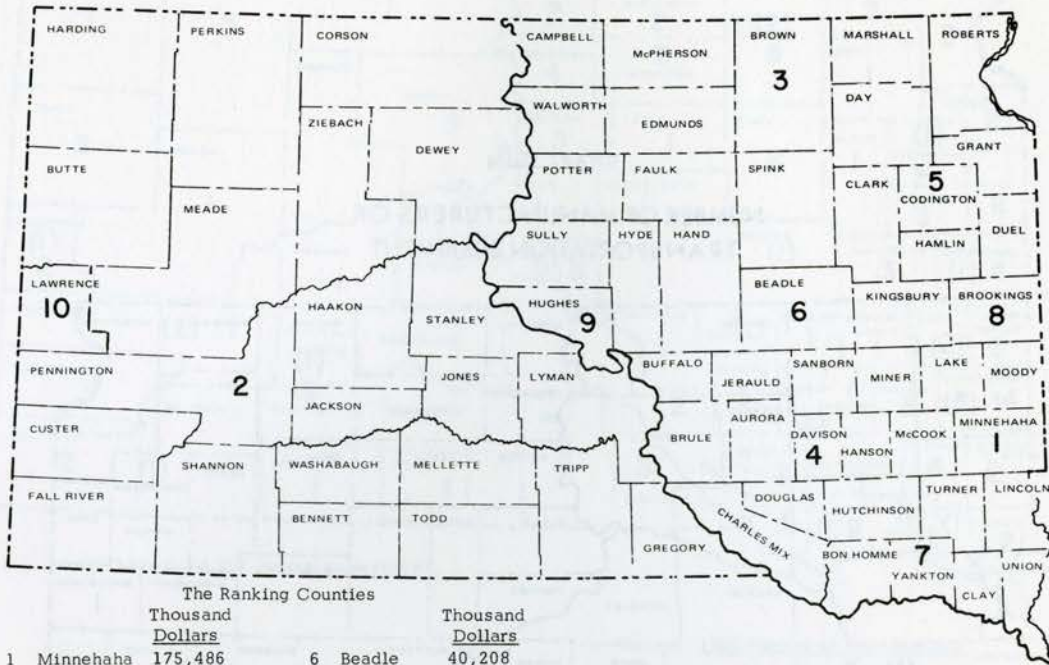

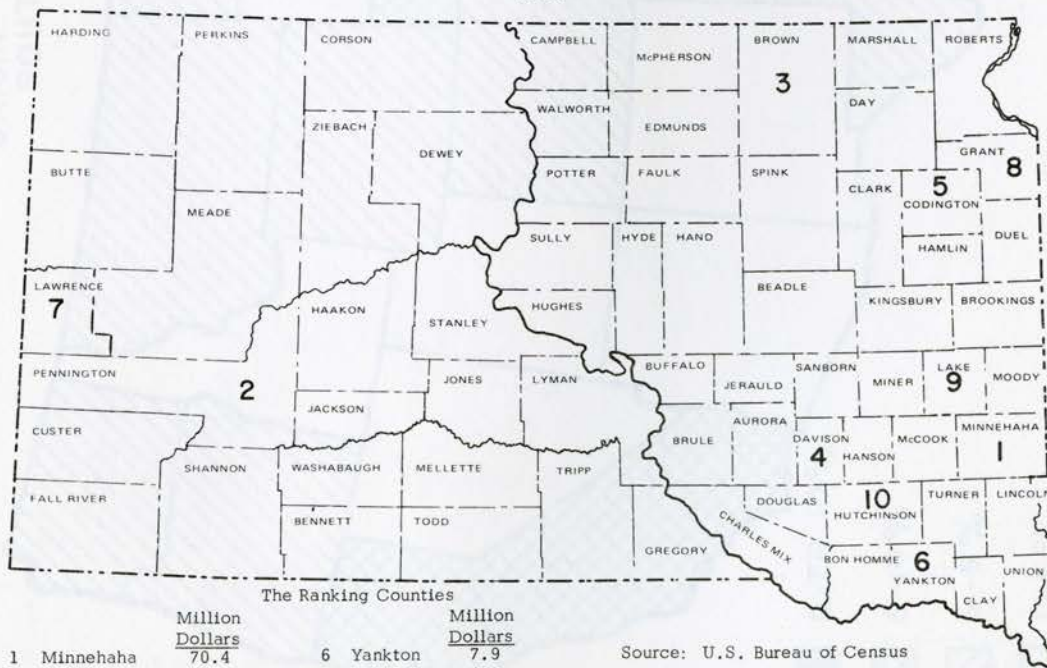

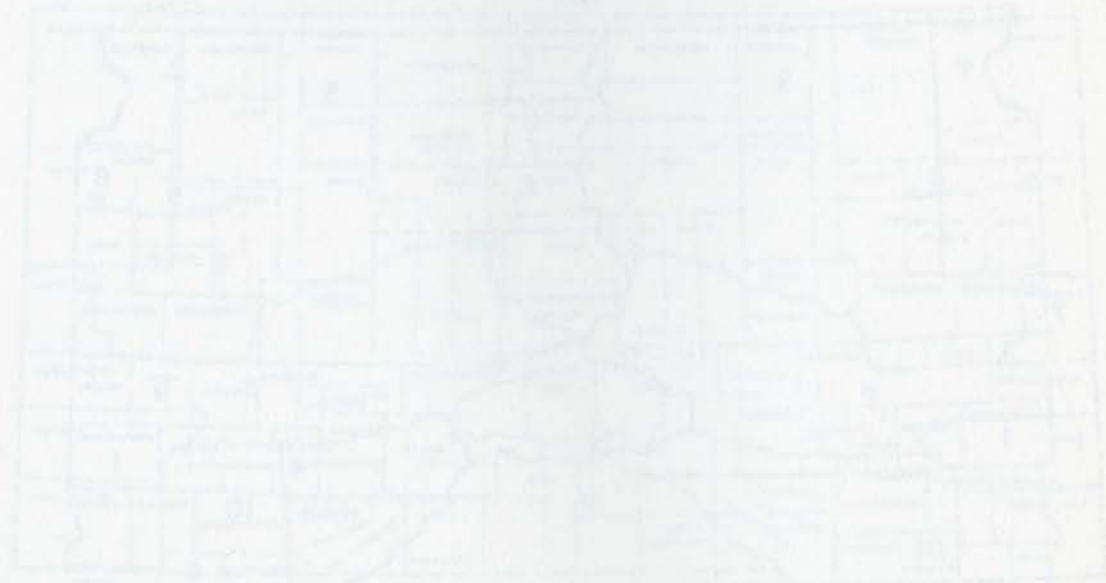

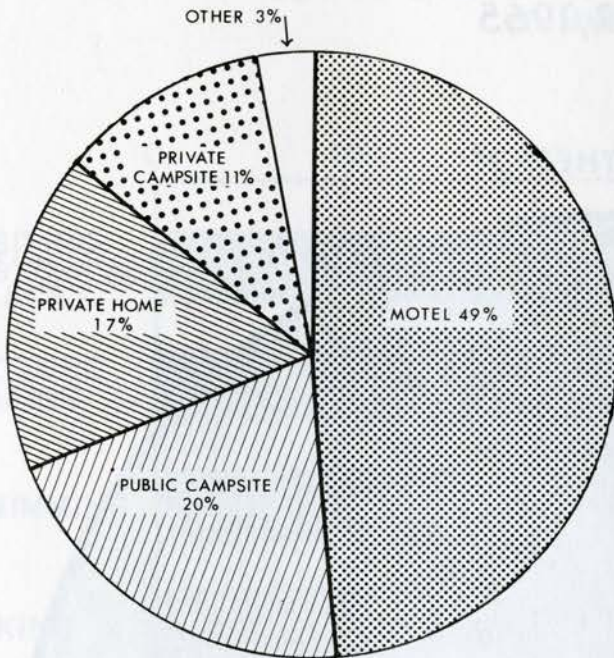
STATE PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS

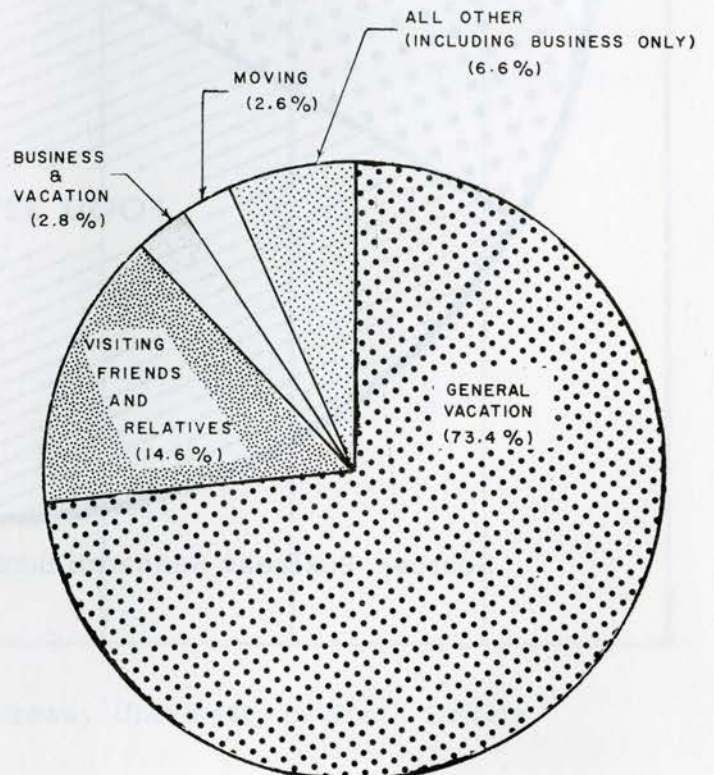

SUMMER, 1965



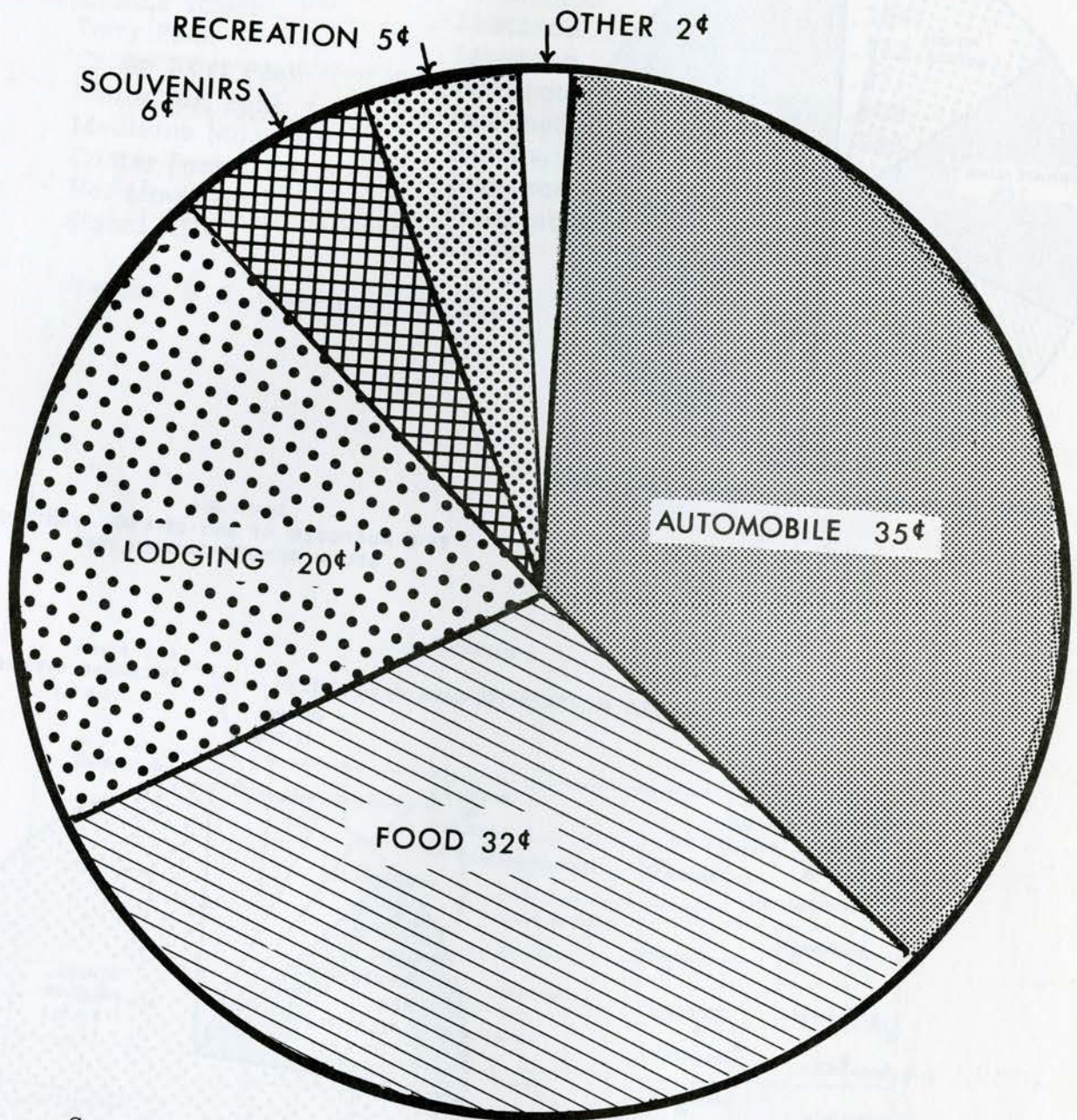

SOUTH DAKOTA-SUMMER, 1965



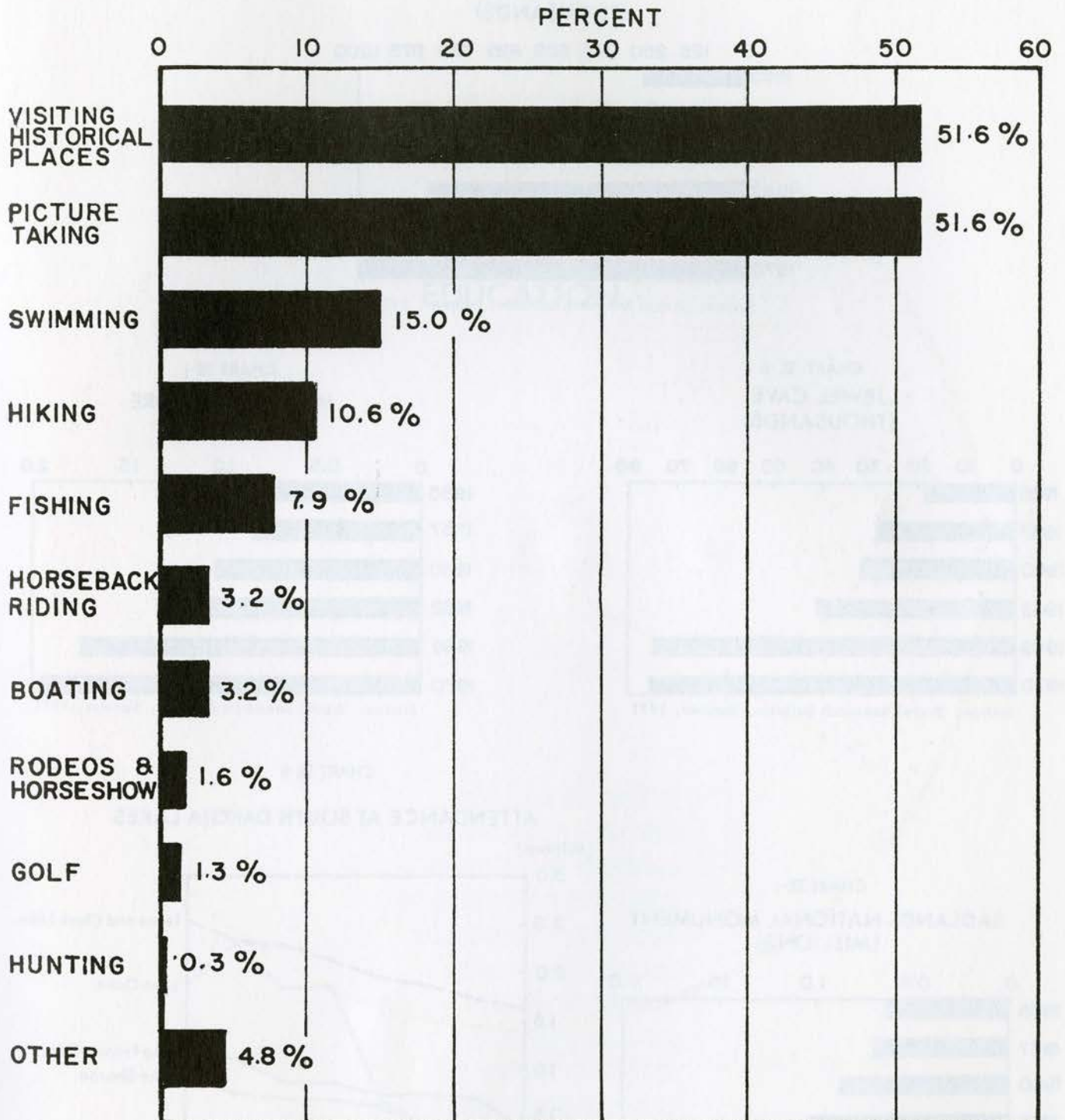

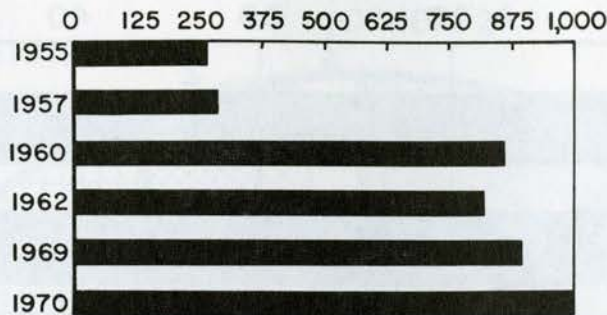
CHART IX-f

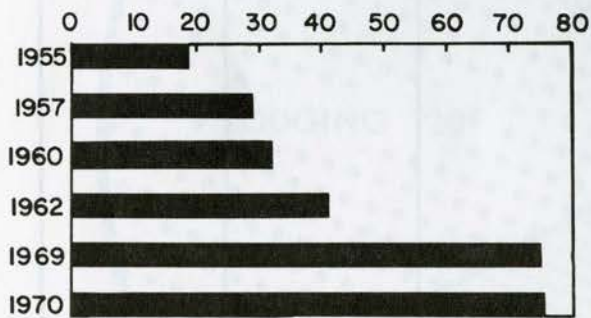
NUMBER OF VISITORS TO SOUTH DAKOTA'S NATIONAL PARKS AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS

(THOUSANDS)



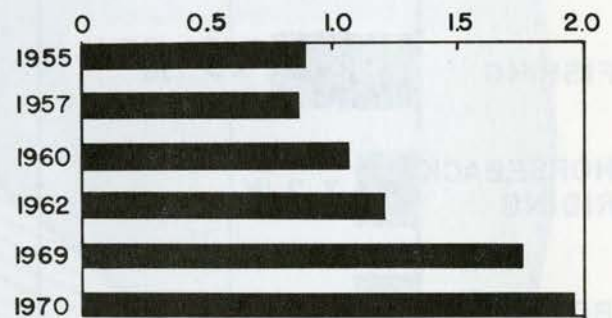

(THOUSANDS)



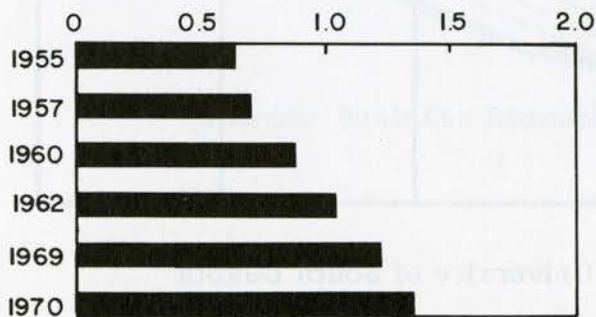

(MILLIONS)



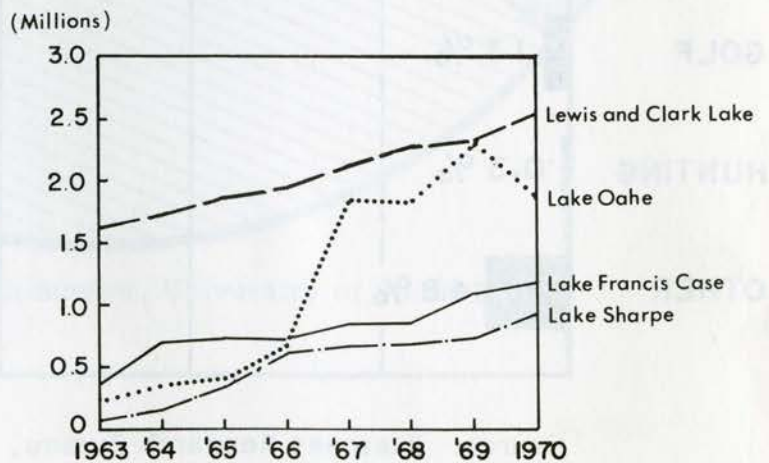

(MILLIONS)



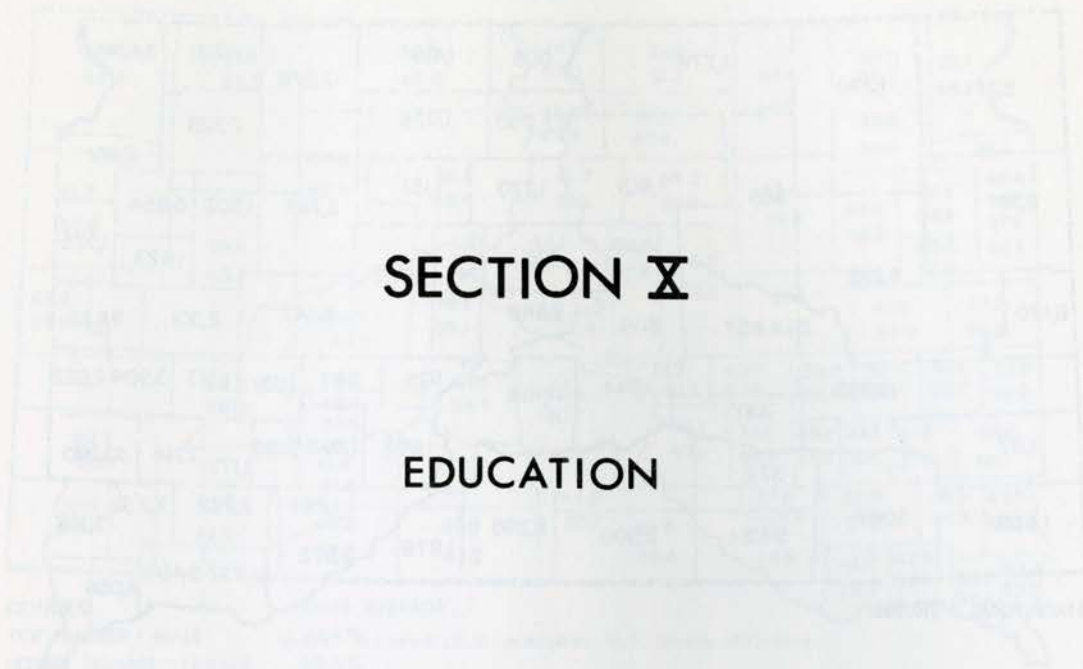

AGES; 3 - 33

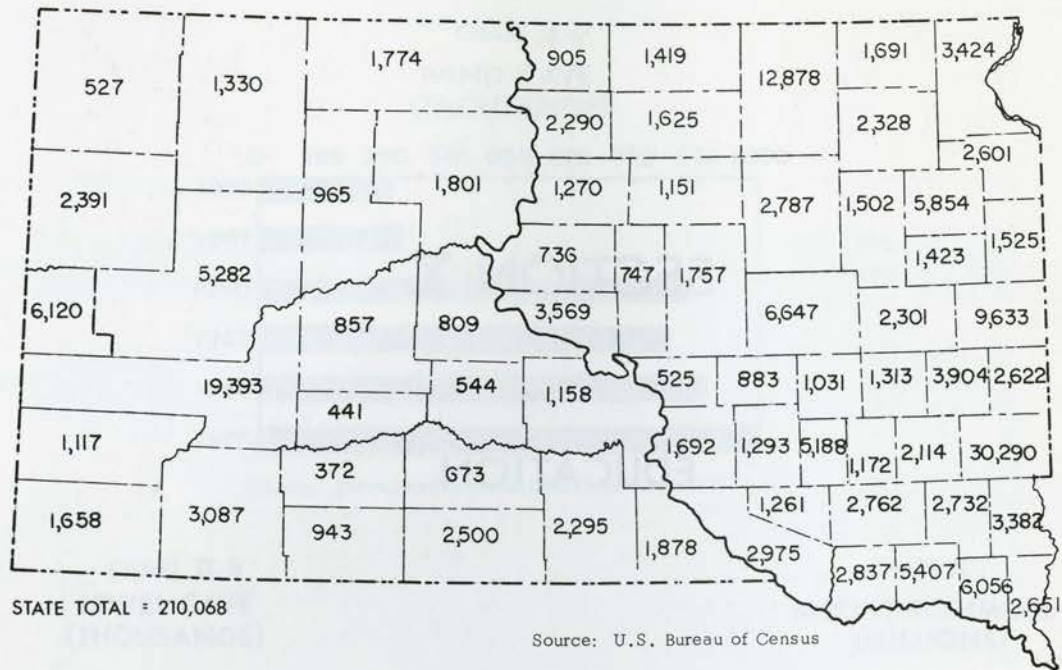
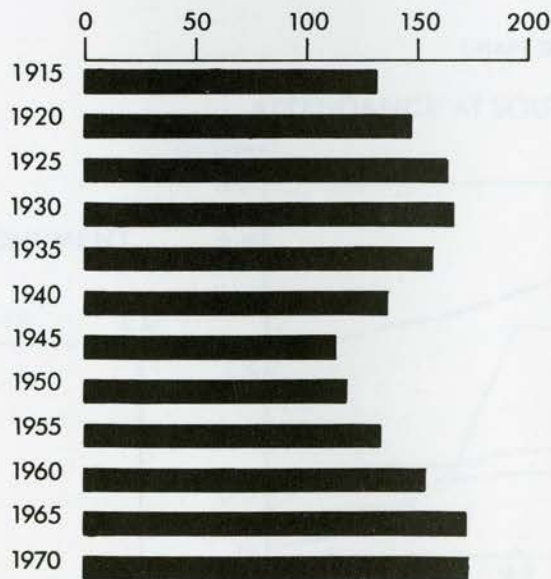

1970

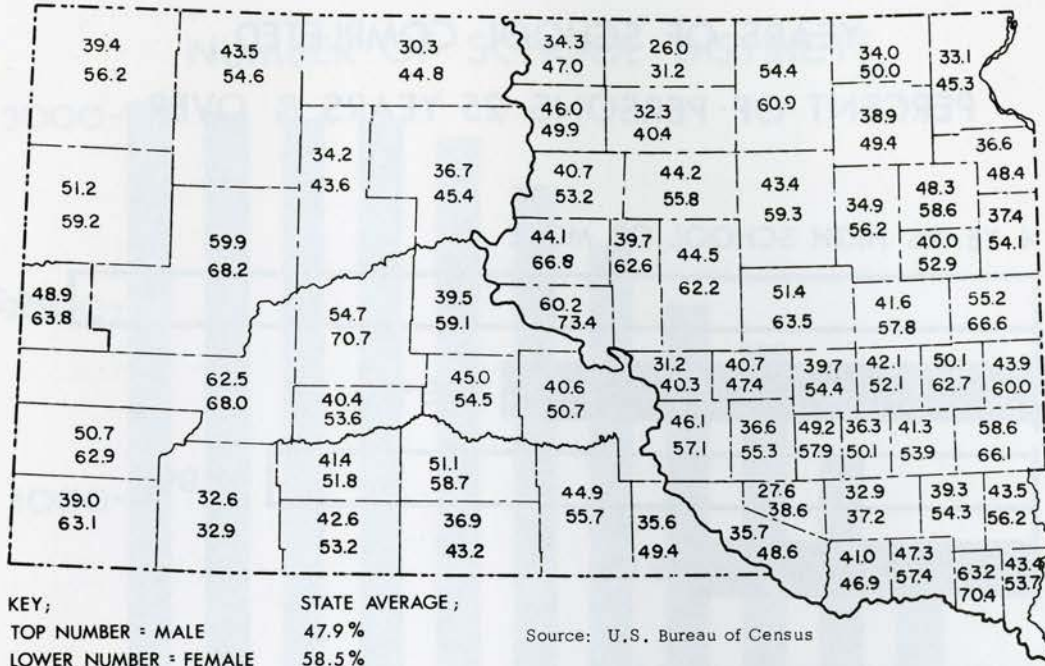

MEDIAN OF THOSE 25 YEARS OLD & OVER

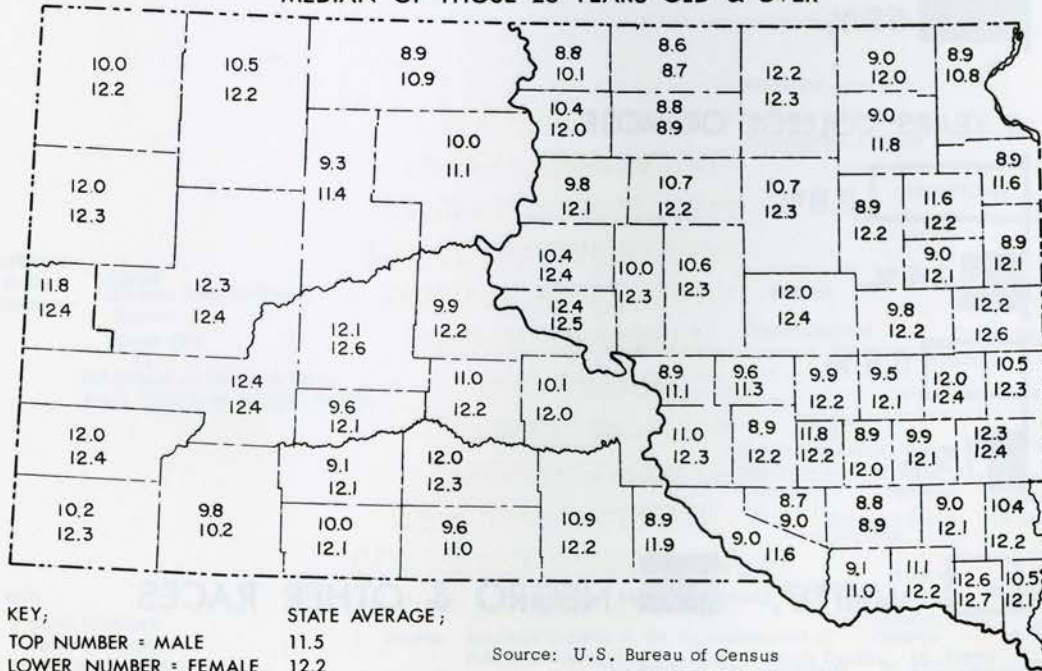
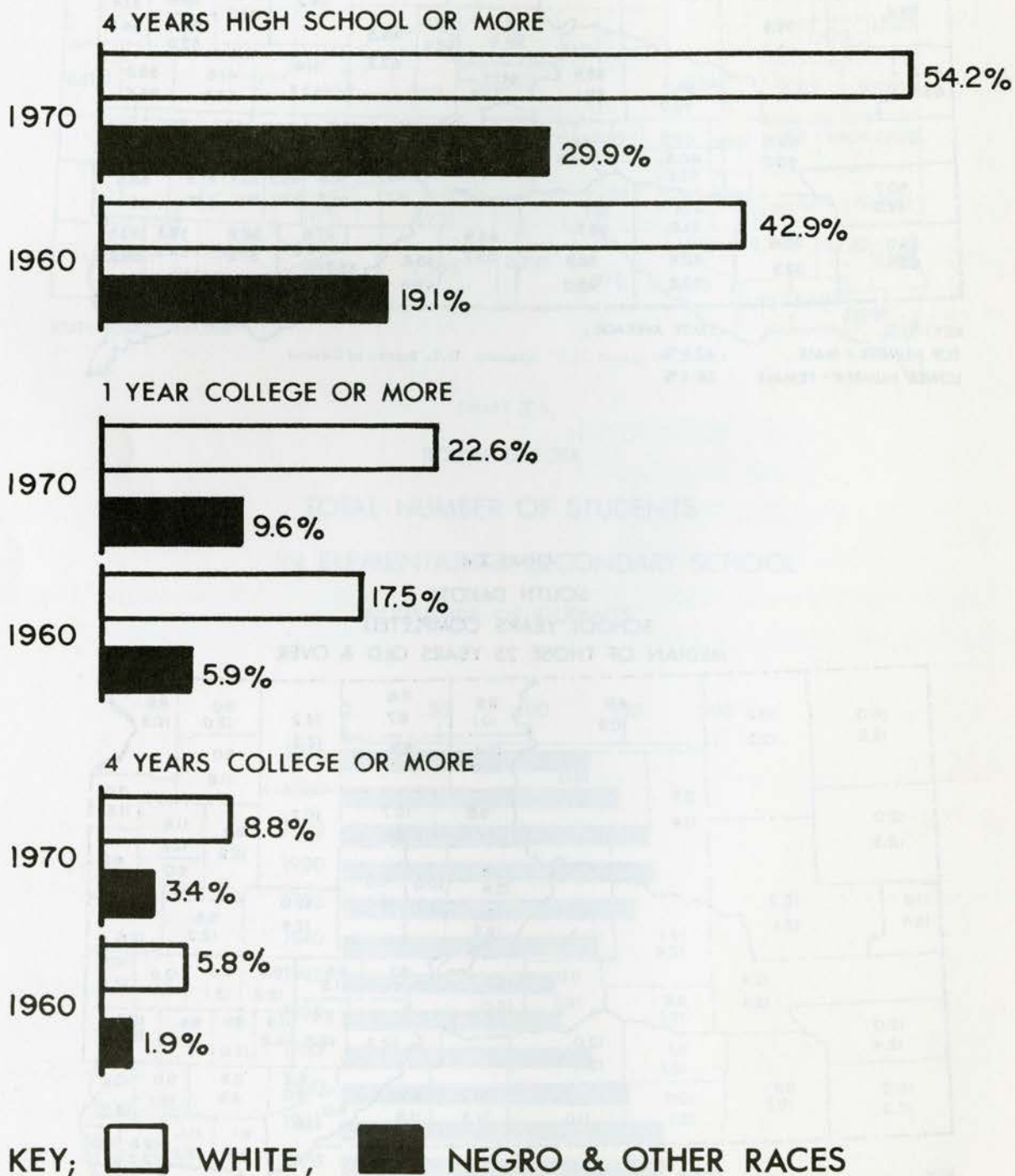

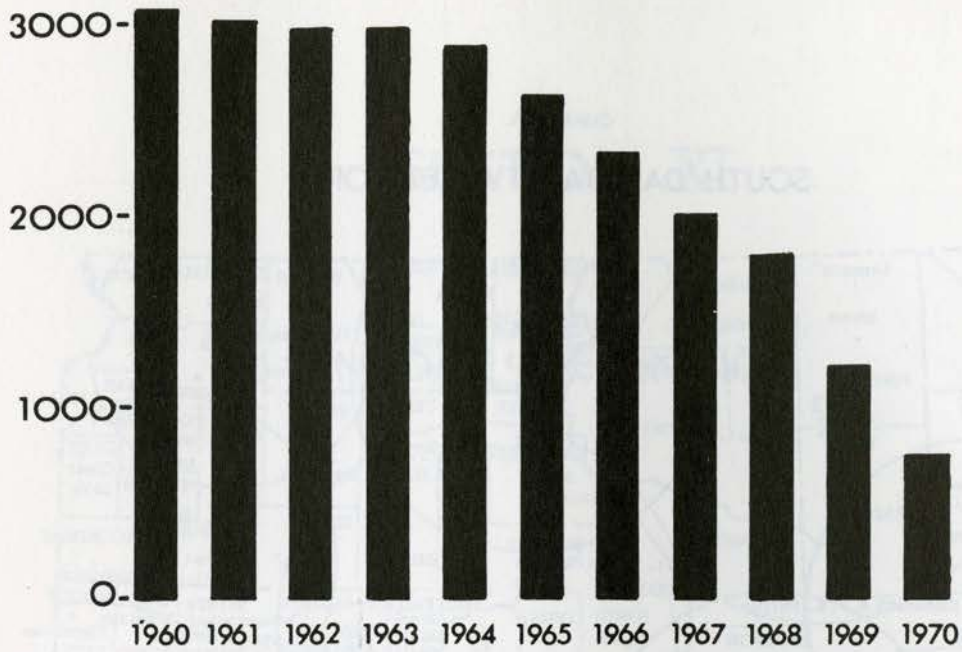
SOUTH DAKOTA; 1970 & 1960

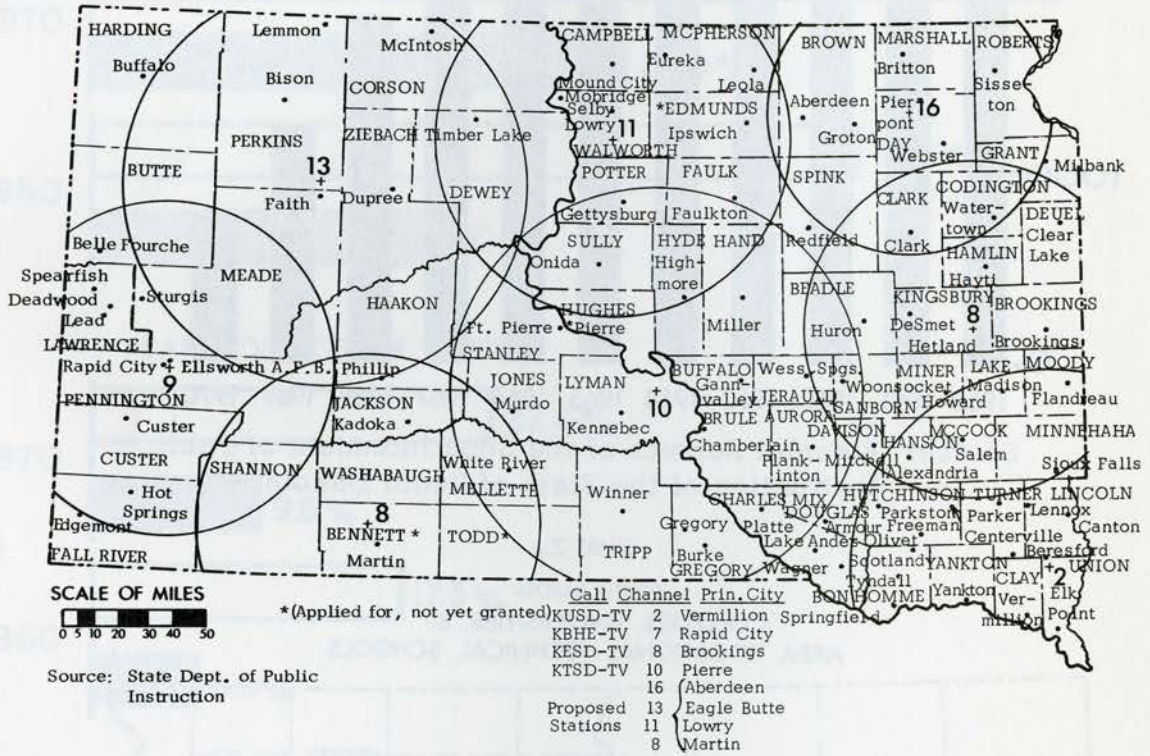

BY OCCUPATIONAL GROUP, 1947-1957

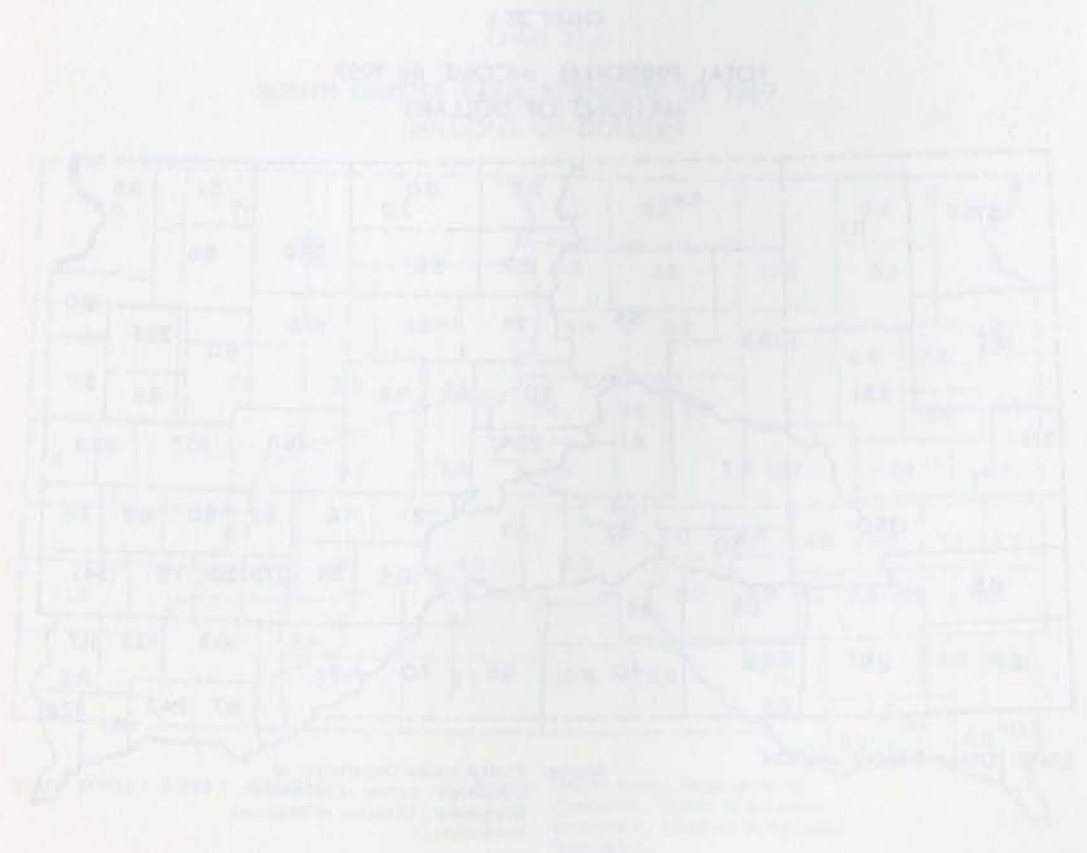
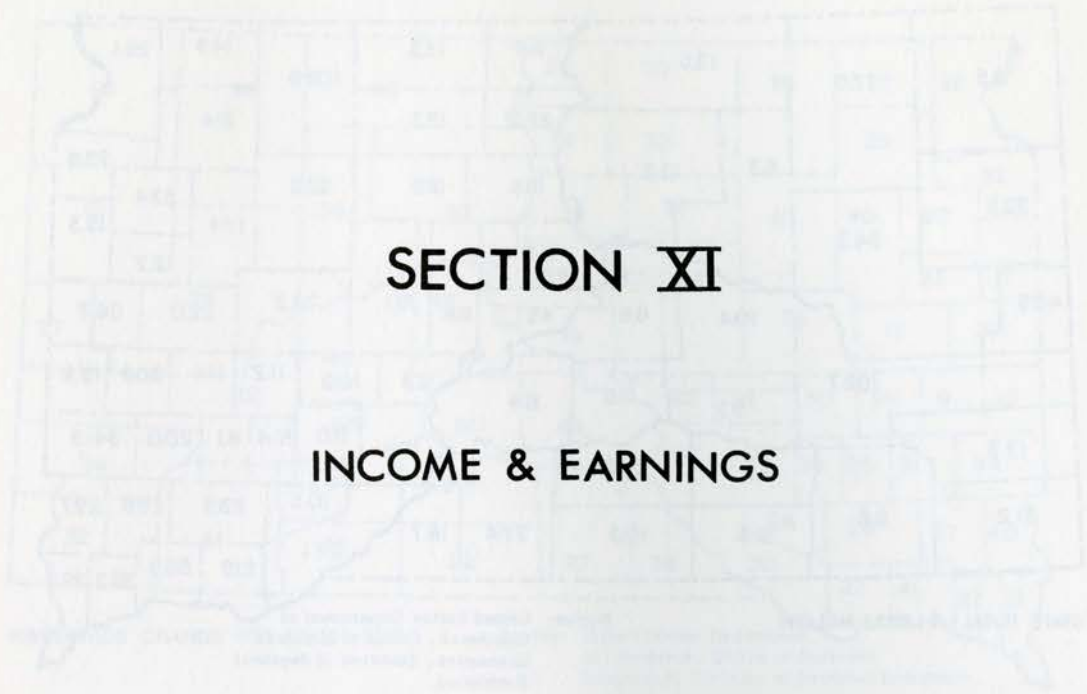

MILLIONS OF DOLLARS

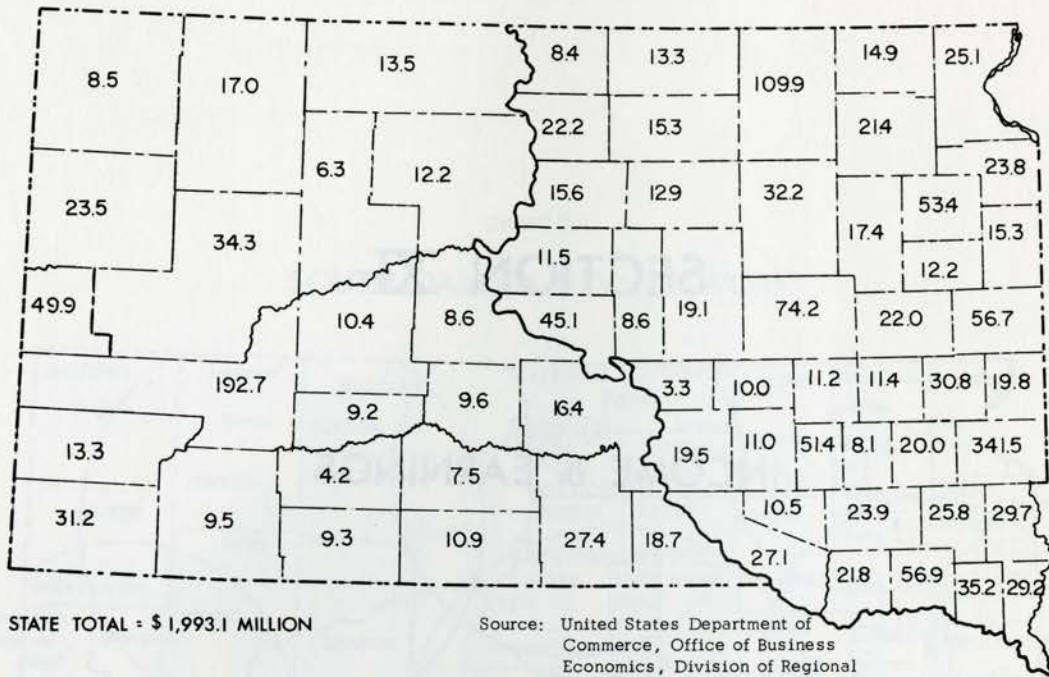

MILLIONS OF DOLLARS

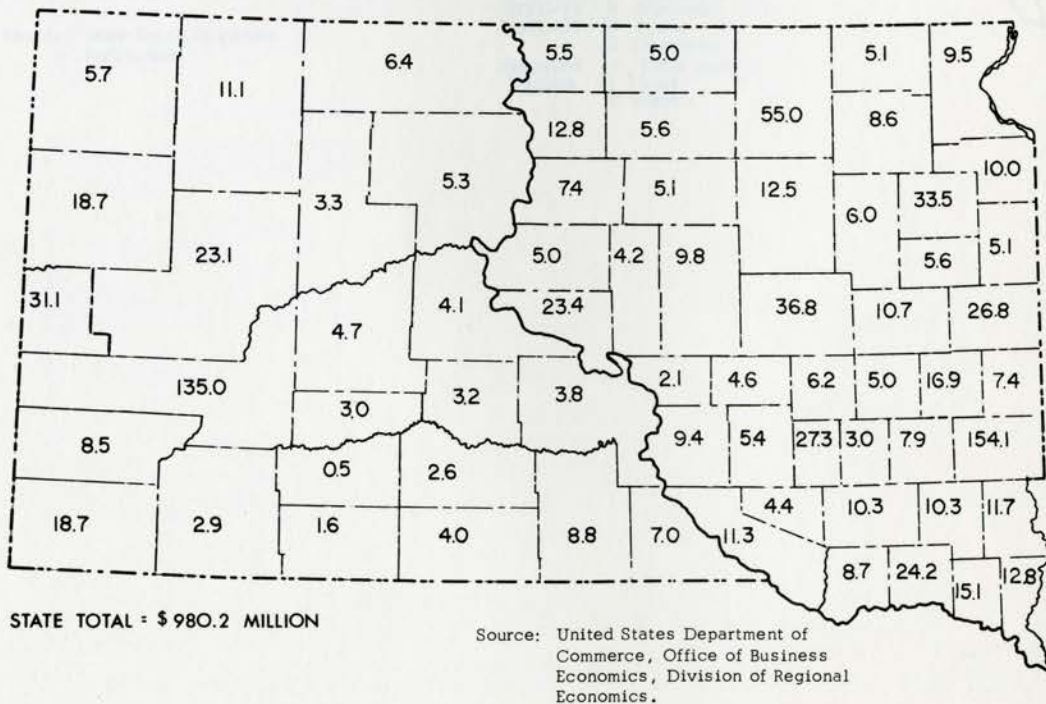

IN SOUTH DAKOTA, 1965 - 1969

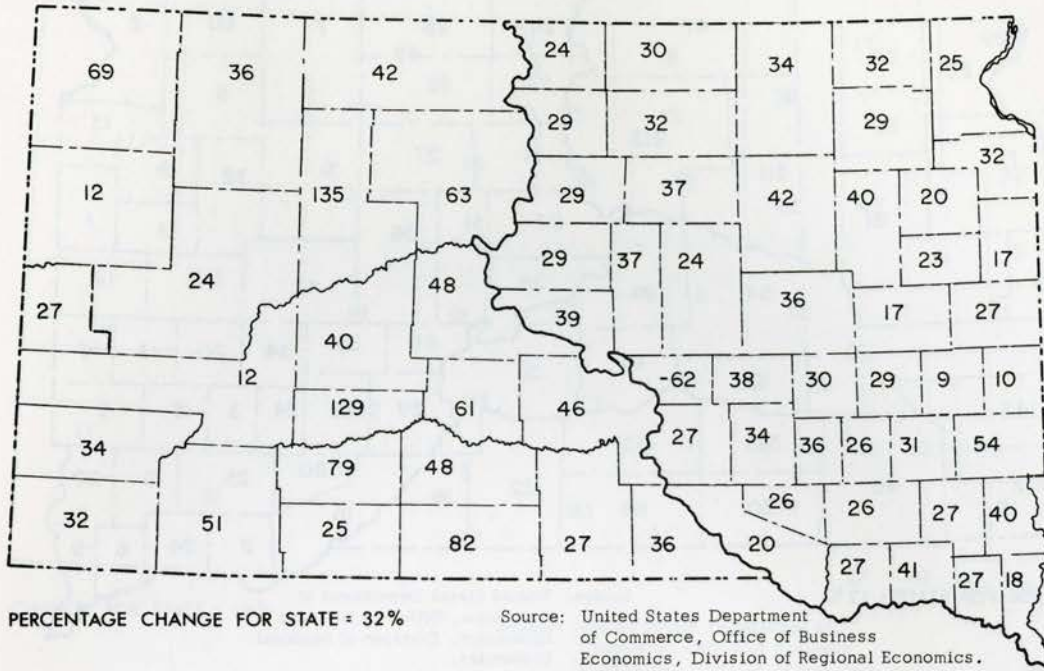

MILLIONS OF DOLLARS

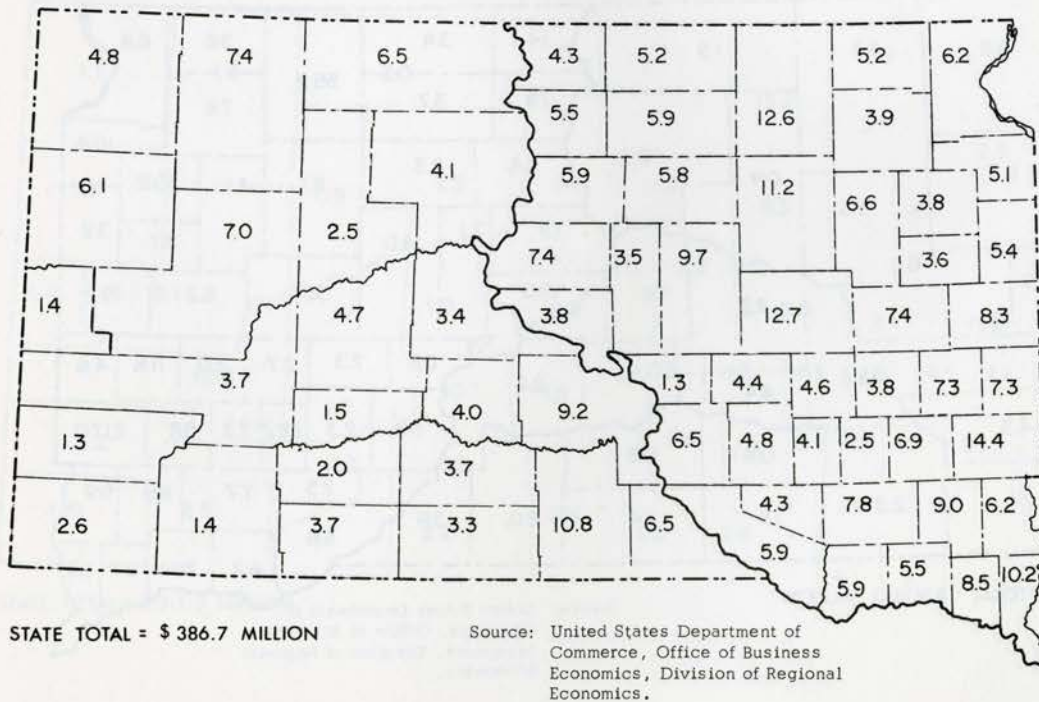
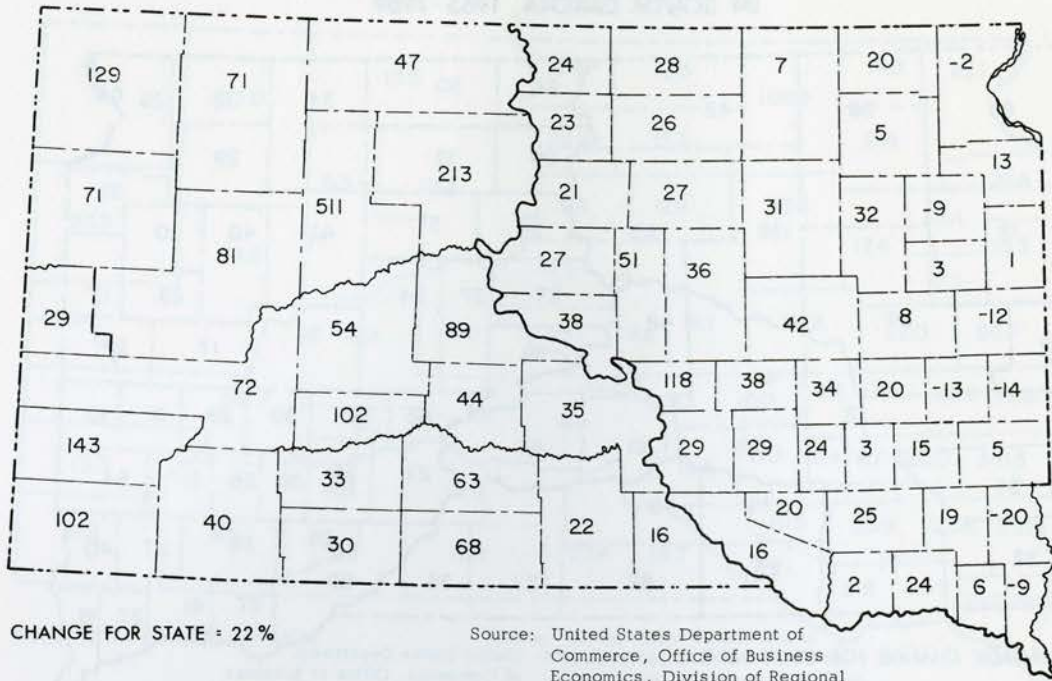

IN SOUTH DAKOTA, 1965-1969

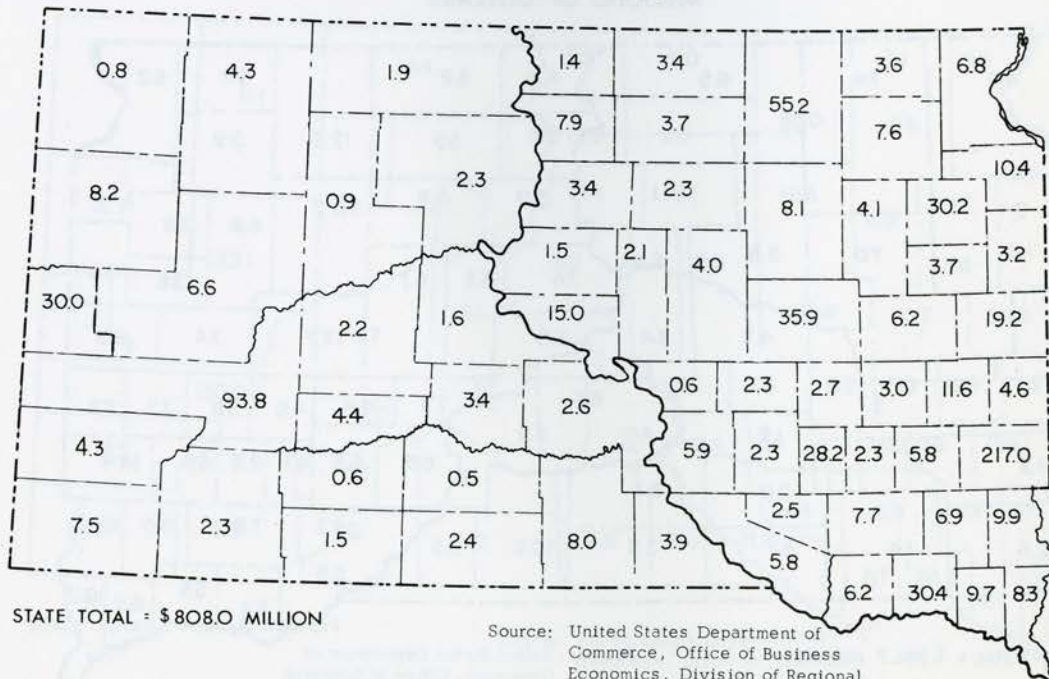

IN SOUTH DAKOTA, 1965-1969

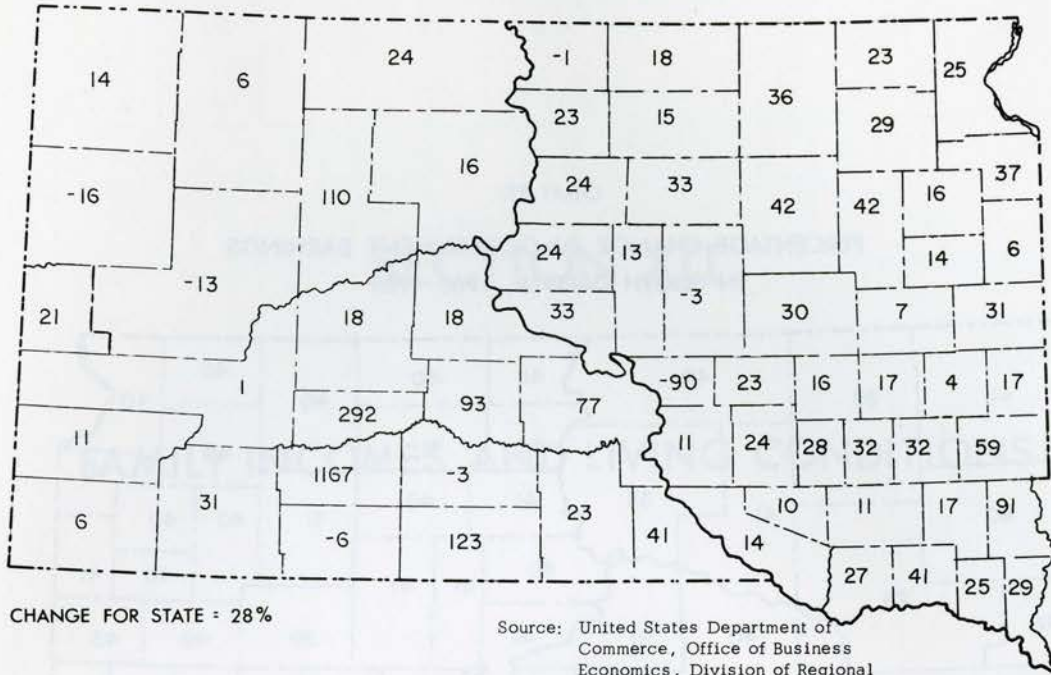
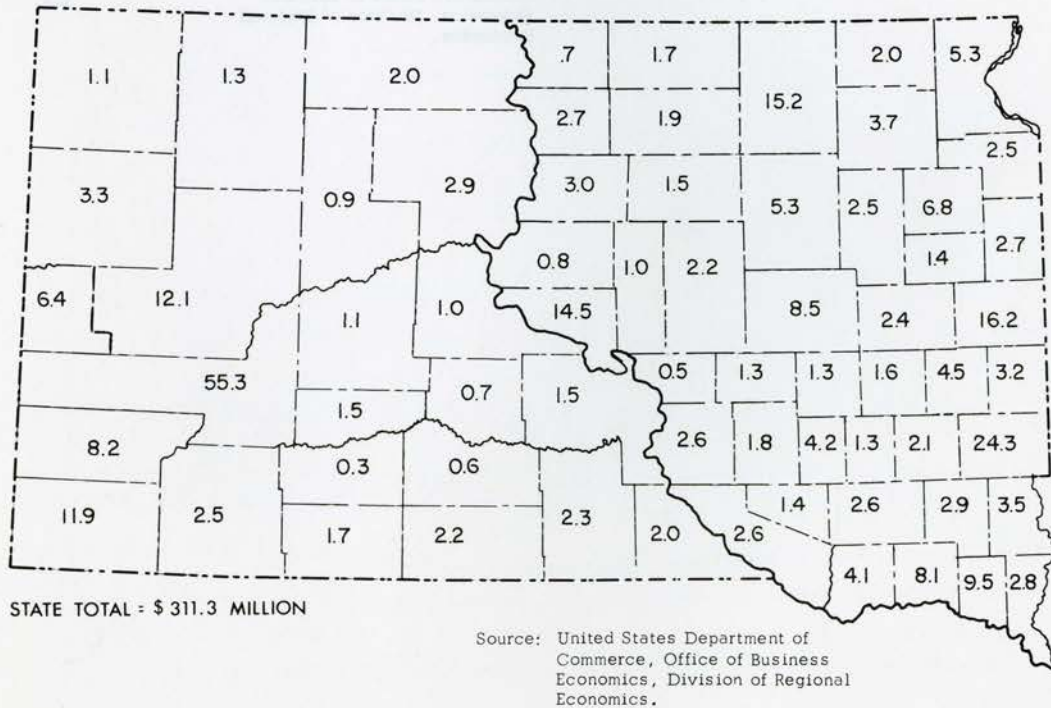

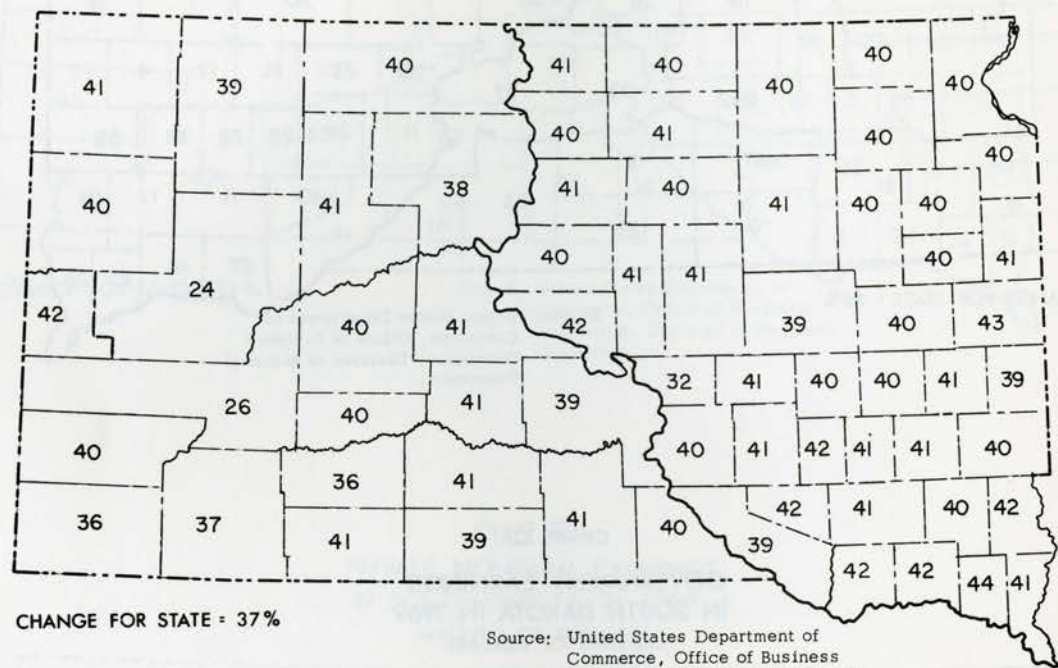
GOVERNMENT EARNINGS

PER CAPITA INCOME BY COUNTY (DOLLARS) 1970

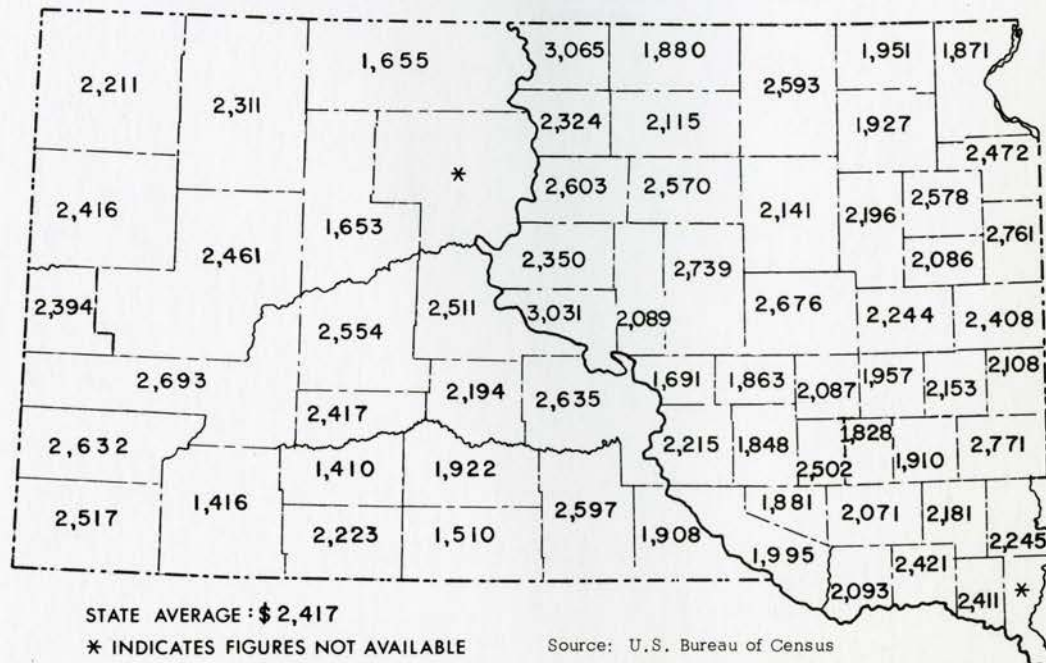

1970

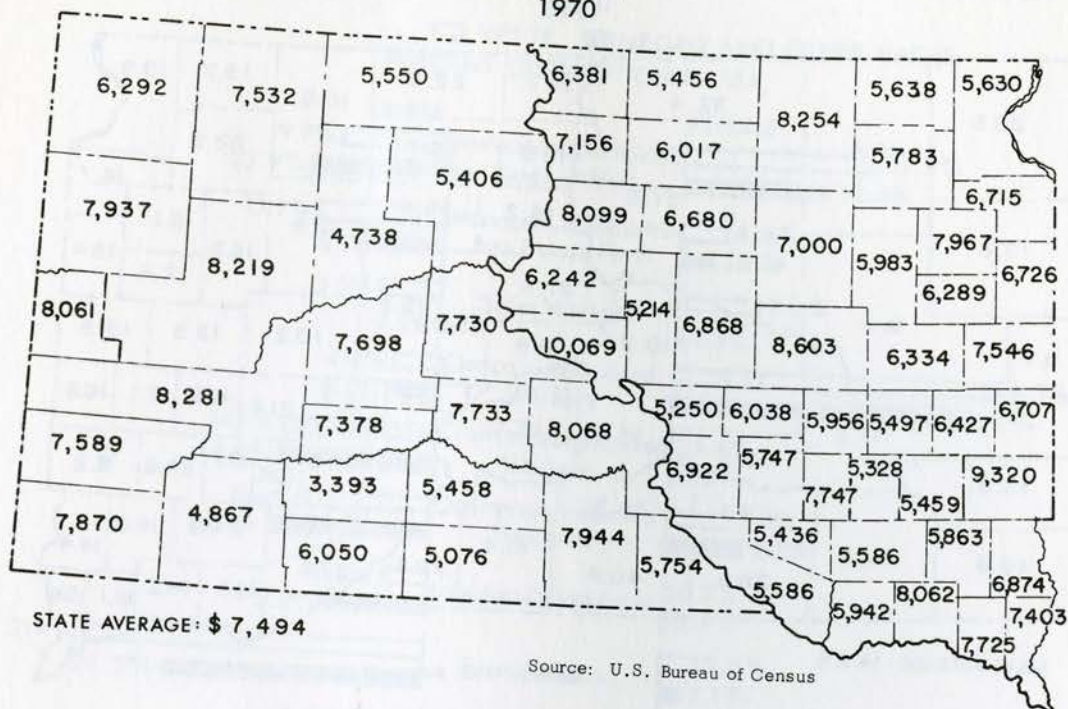

1970

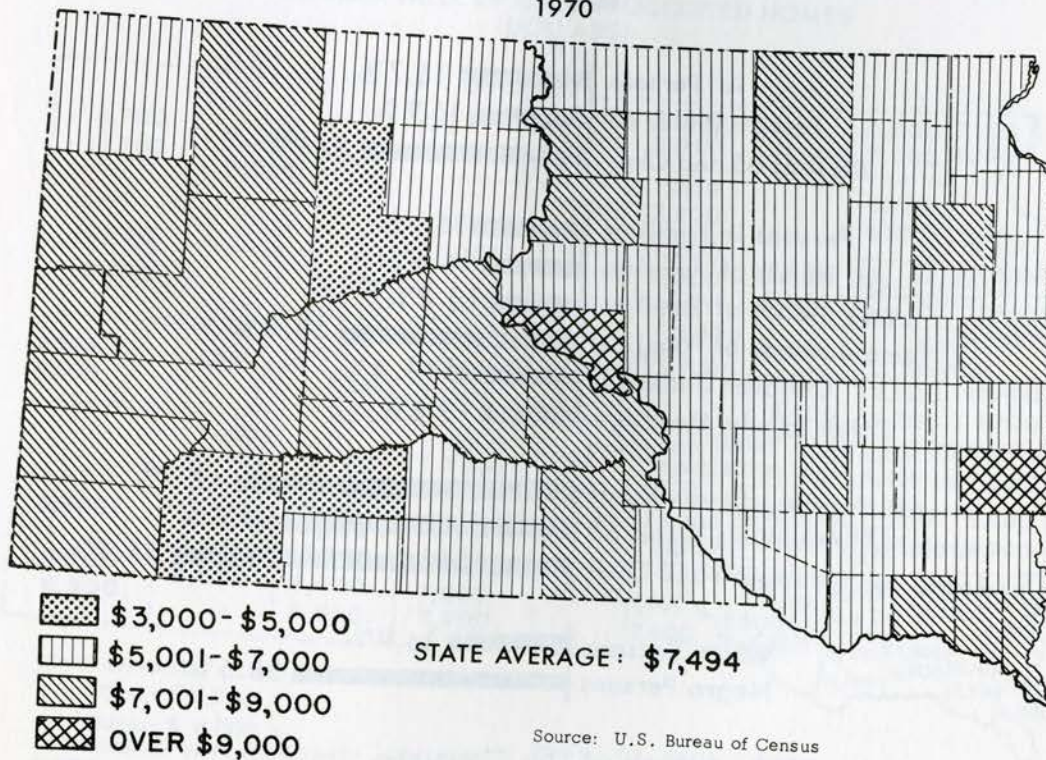

1970

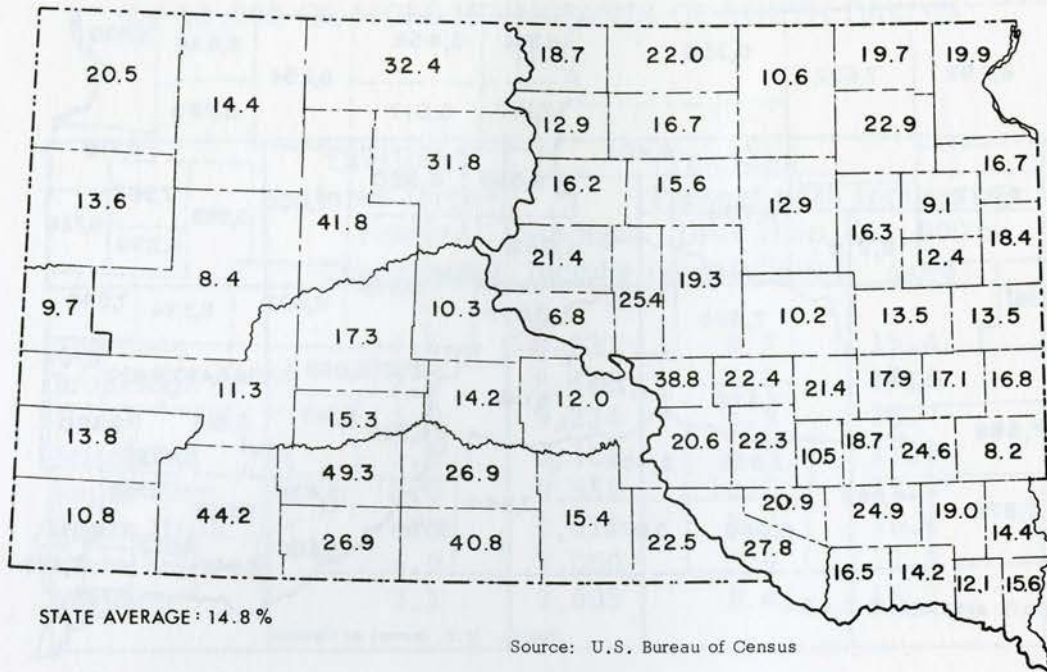
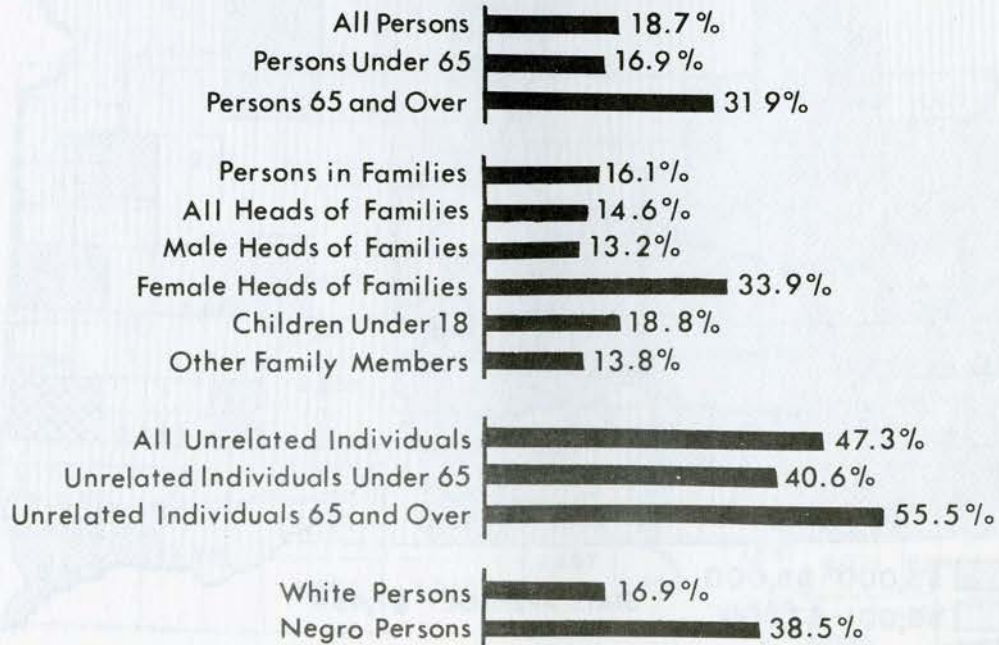


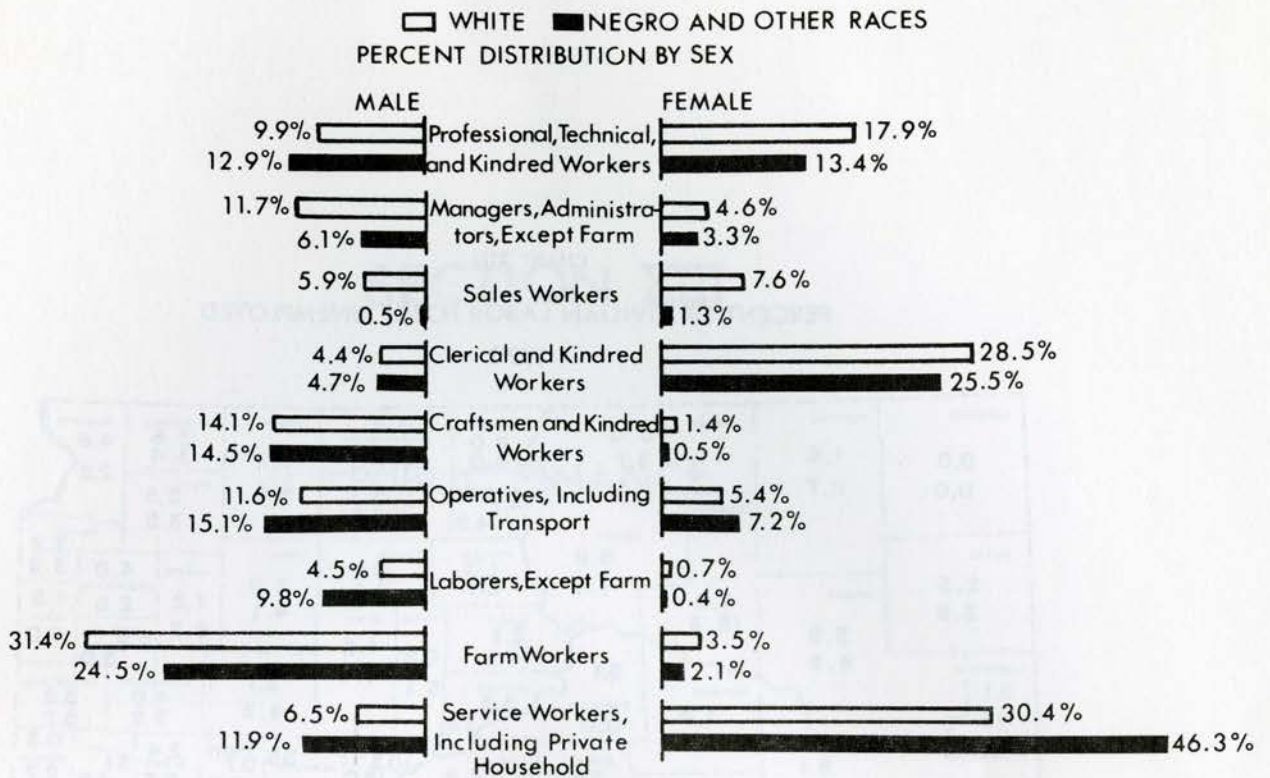

1969



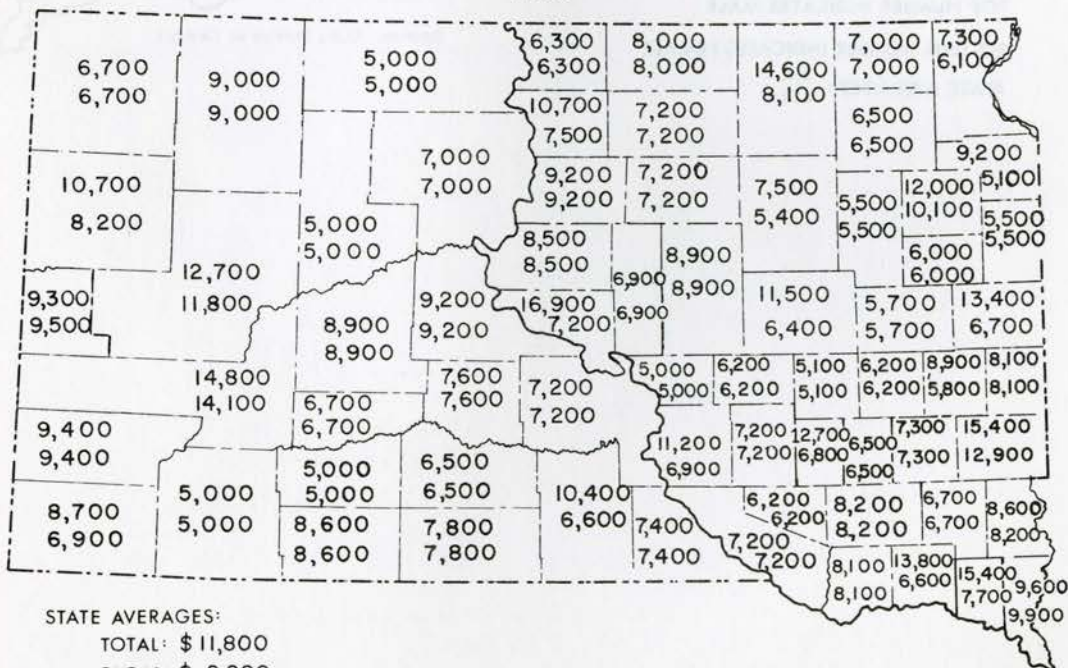

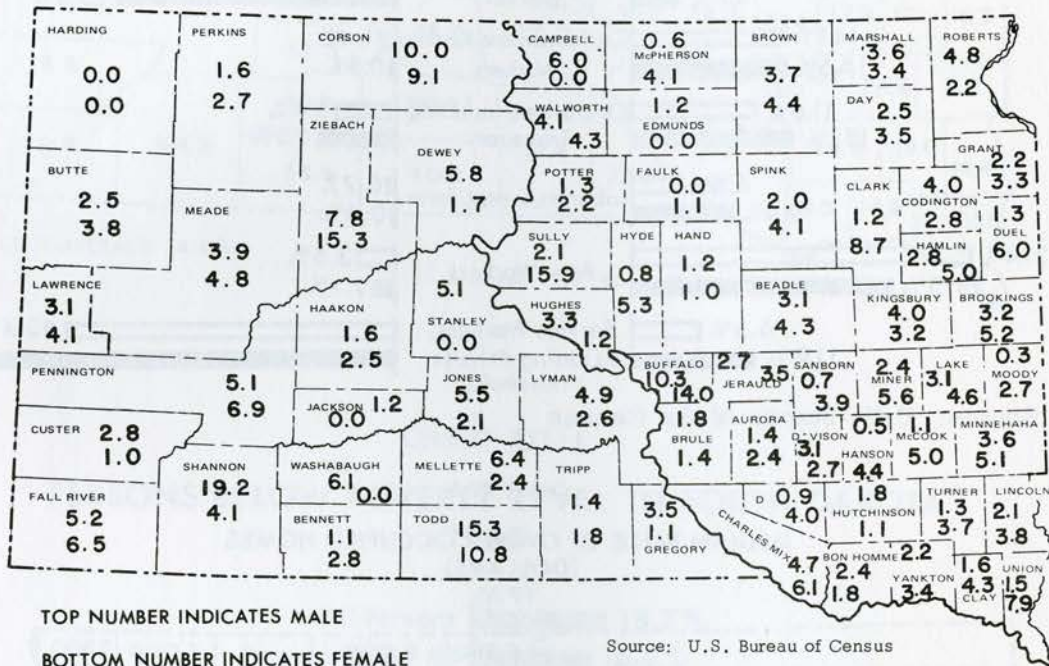

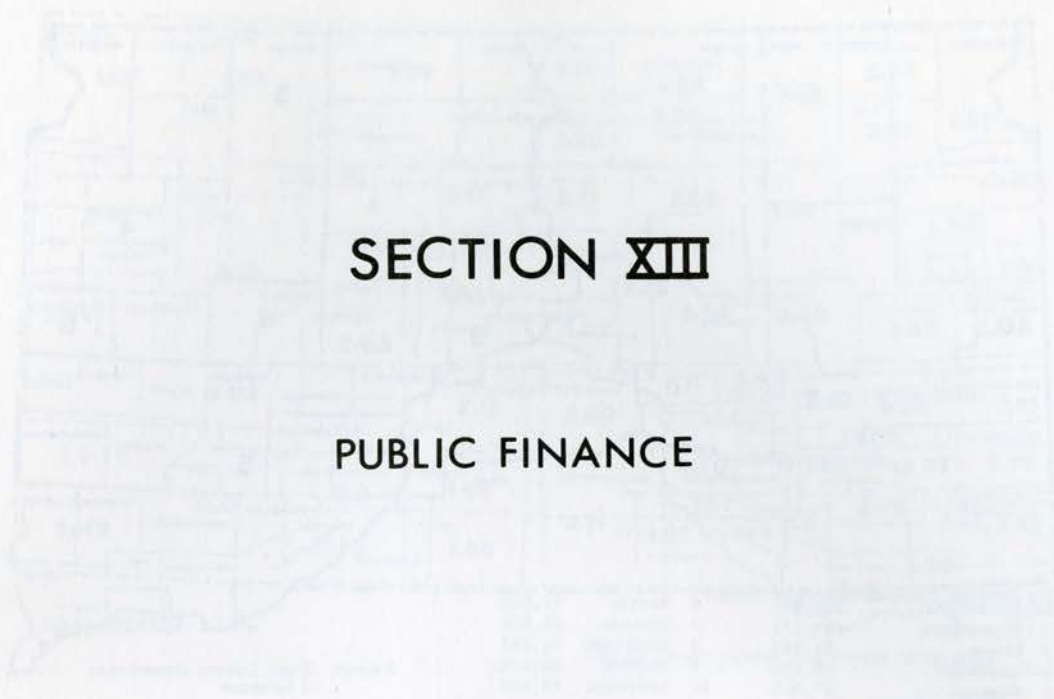

TRENDS IN TAXABLE RETAIL SALES IN SOUTH DAKOTA

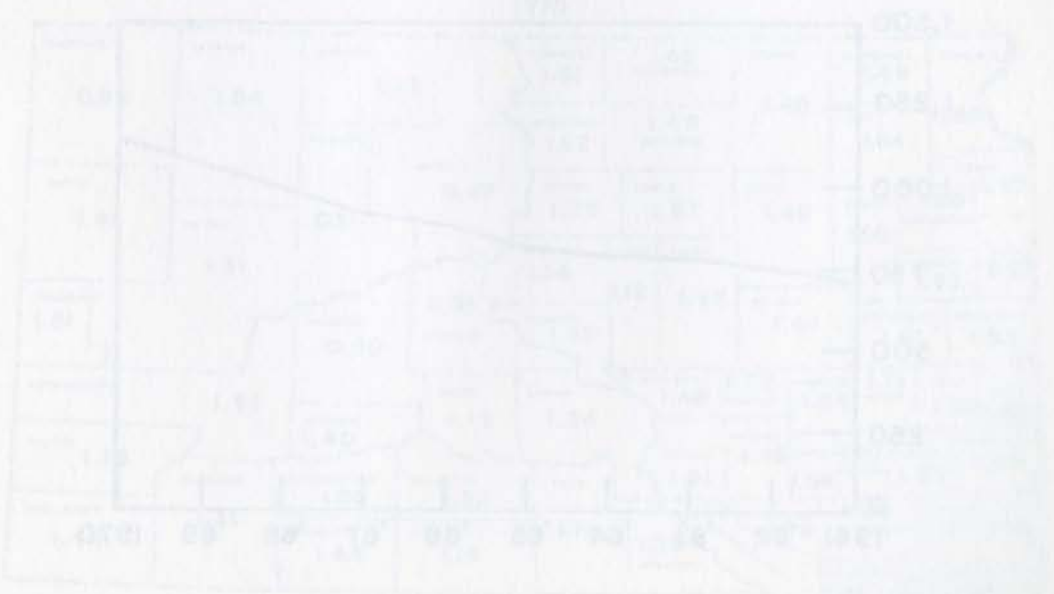

 1970

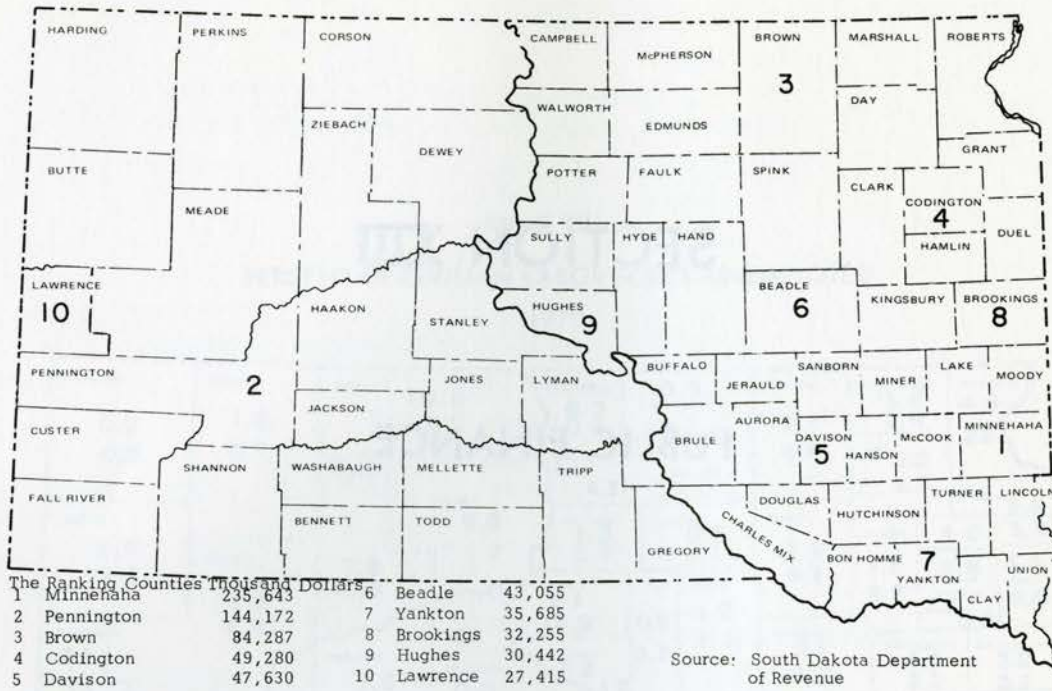
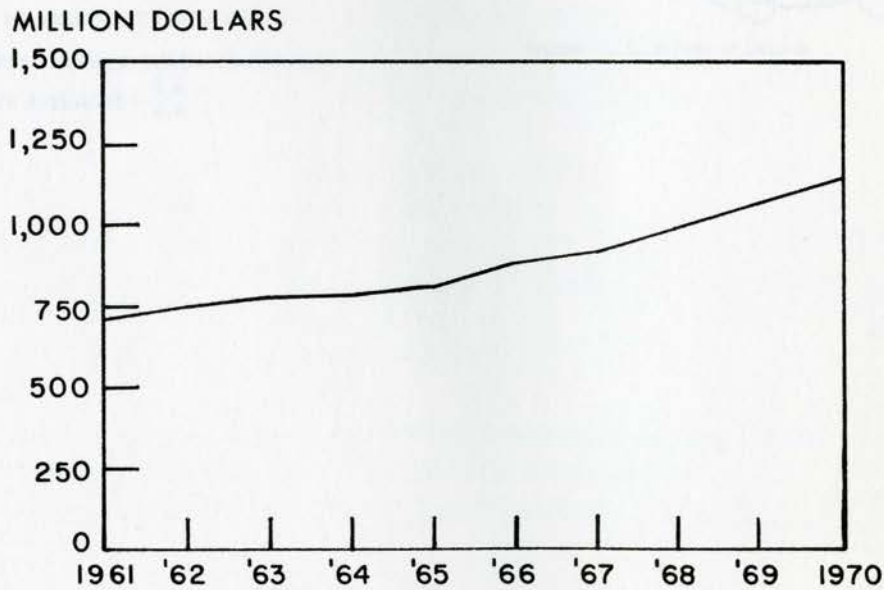


CHART XIII-b

 1970

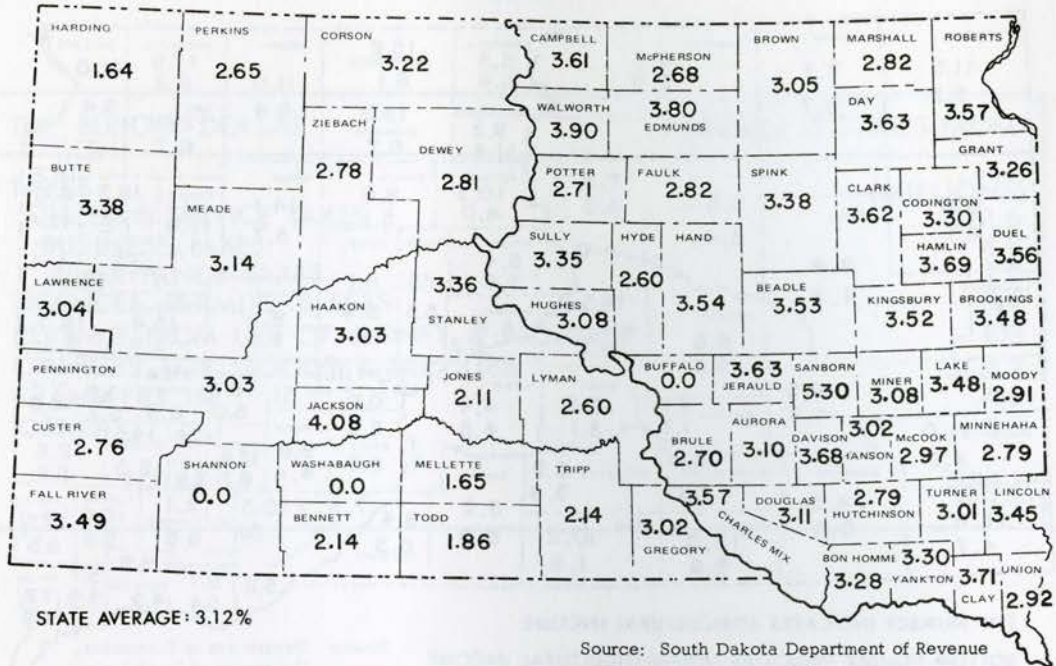

 1970

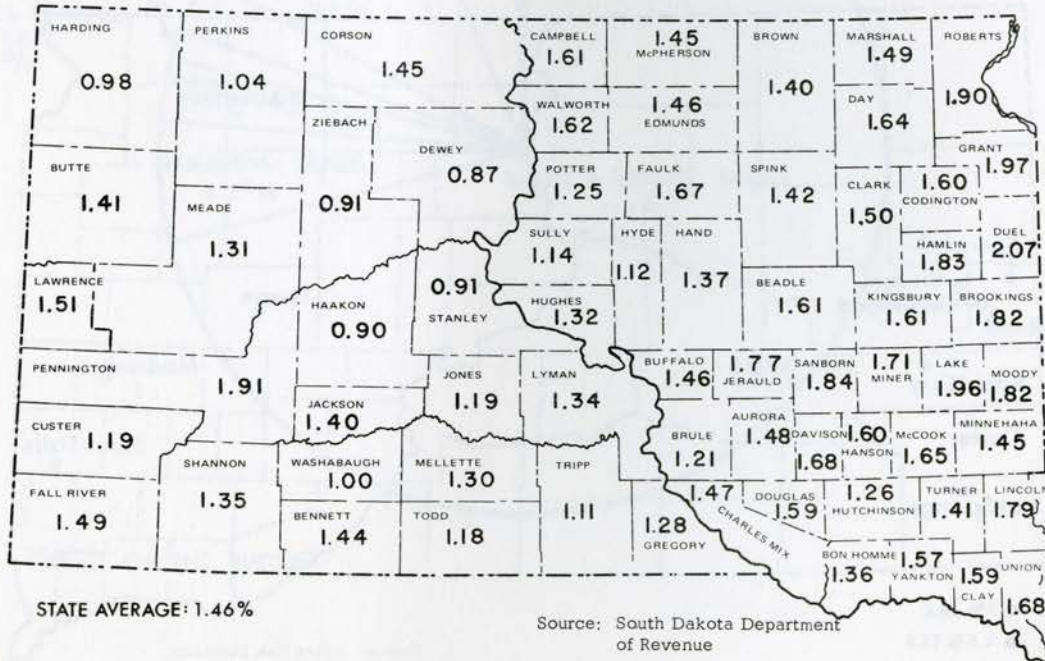

1969

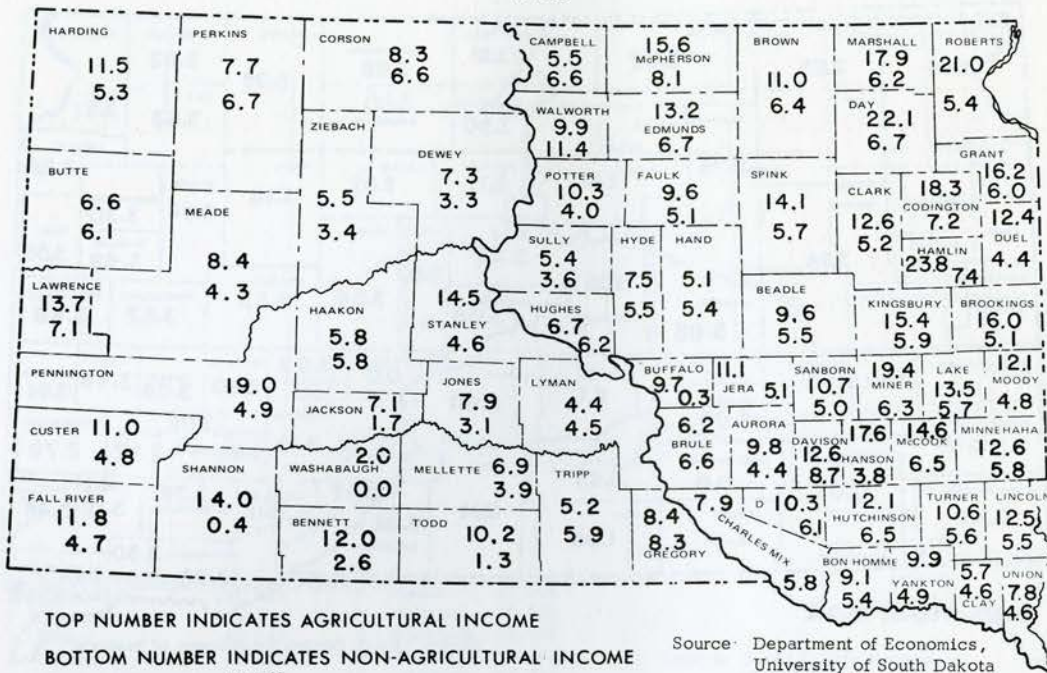

OCTOBER 1, 1972

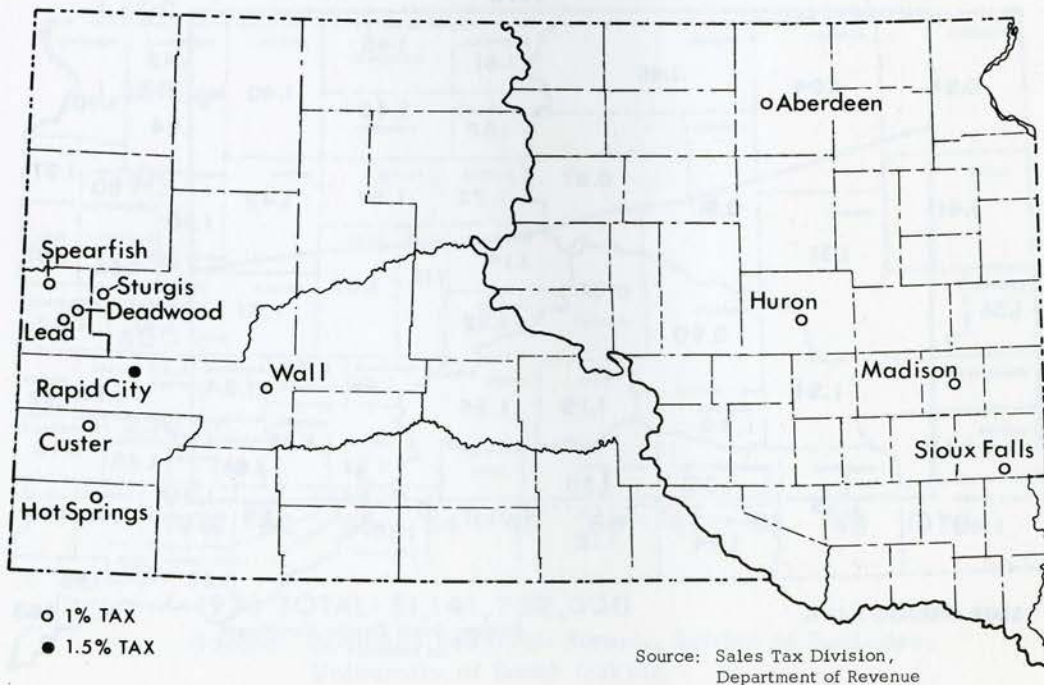
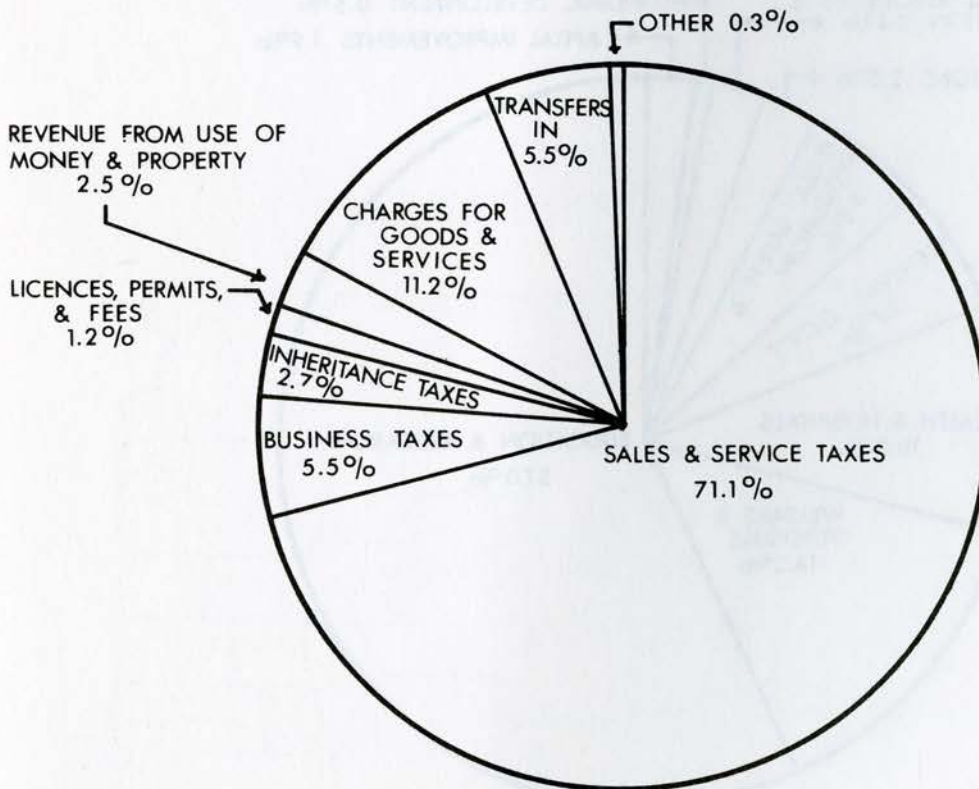

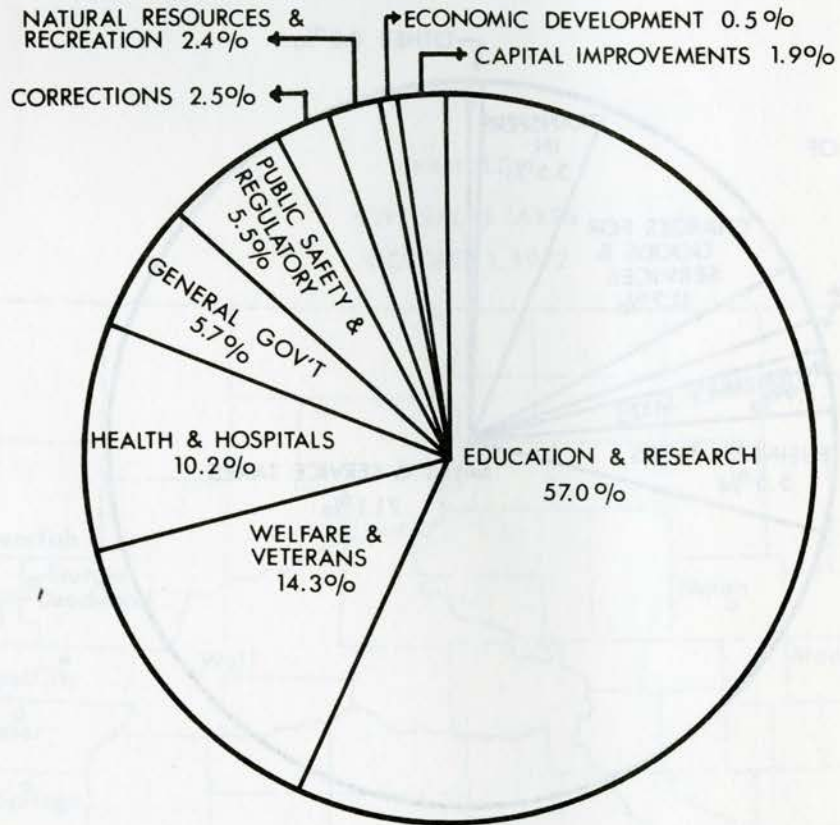

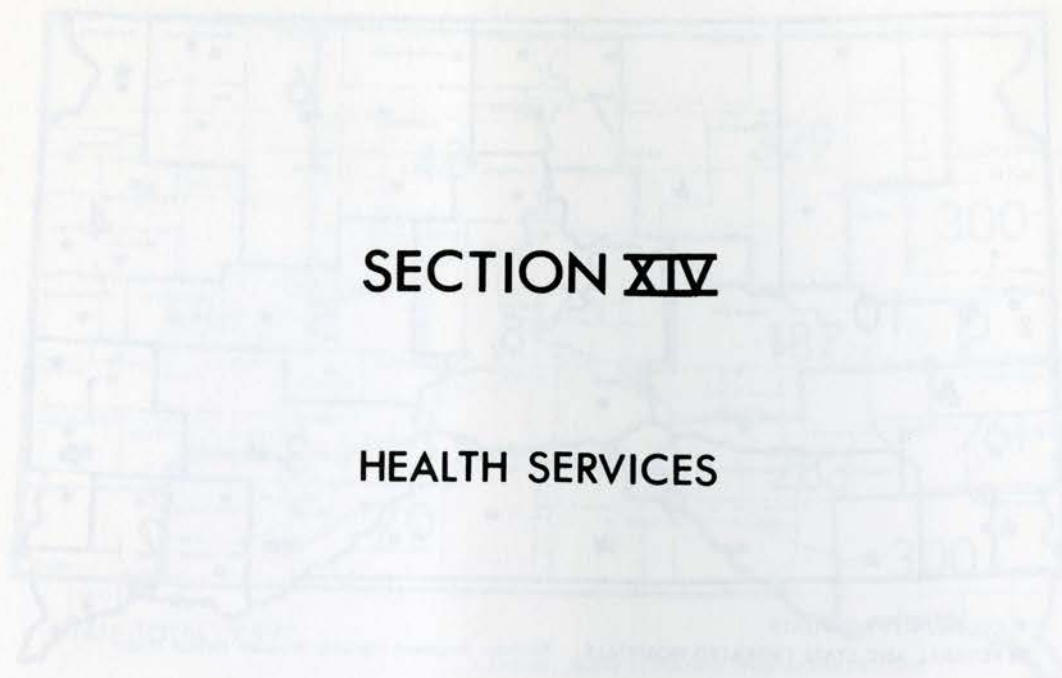

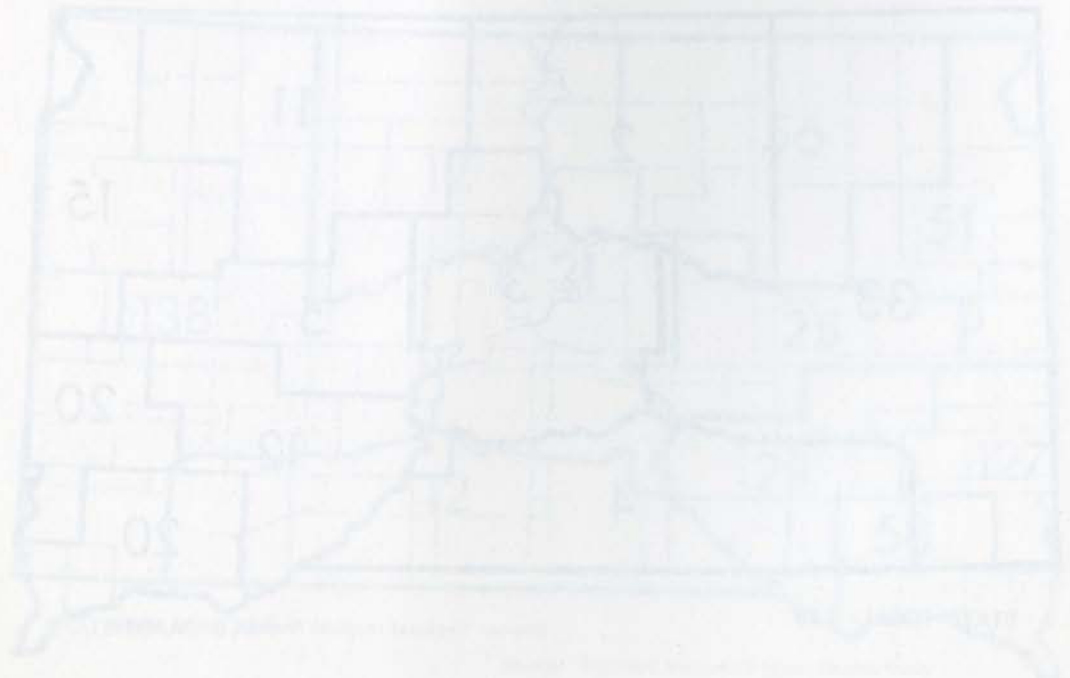

1967

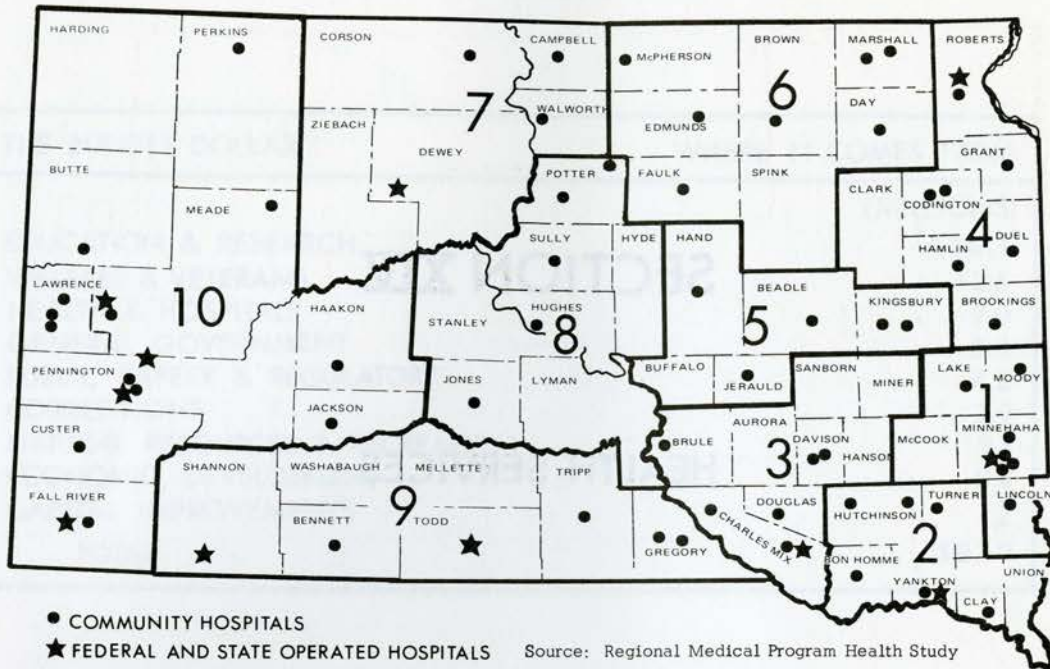

1967

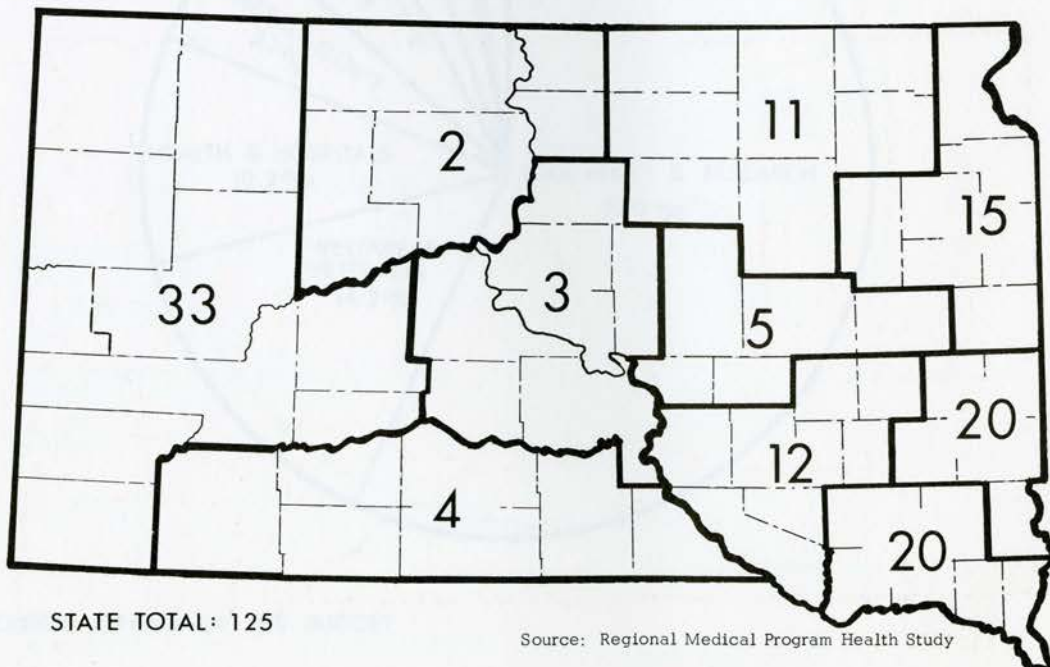

 1967

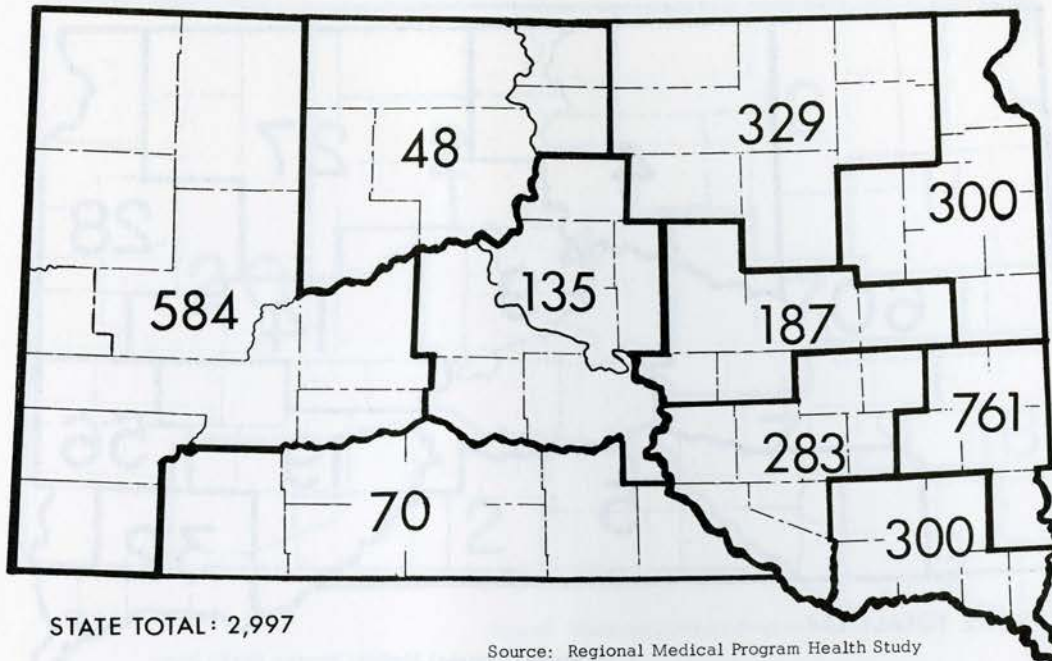


CHART XIV-d

 1967

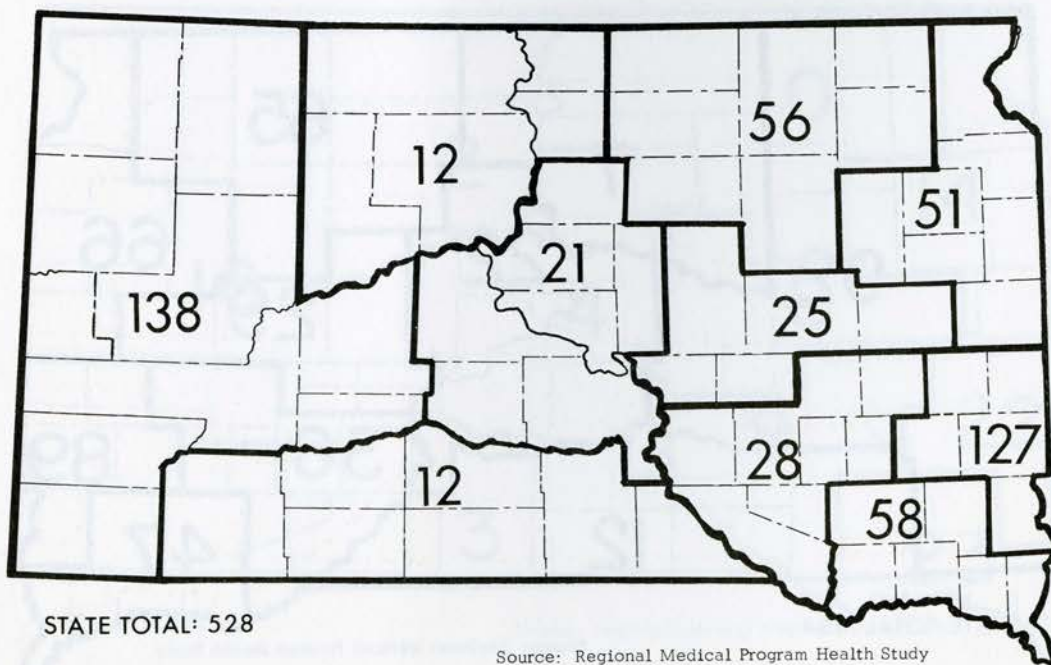

1967

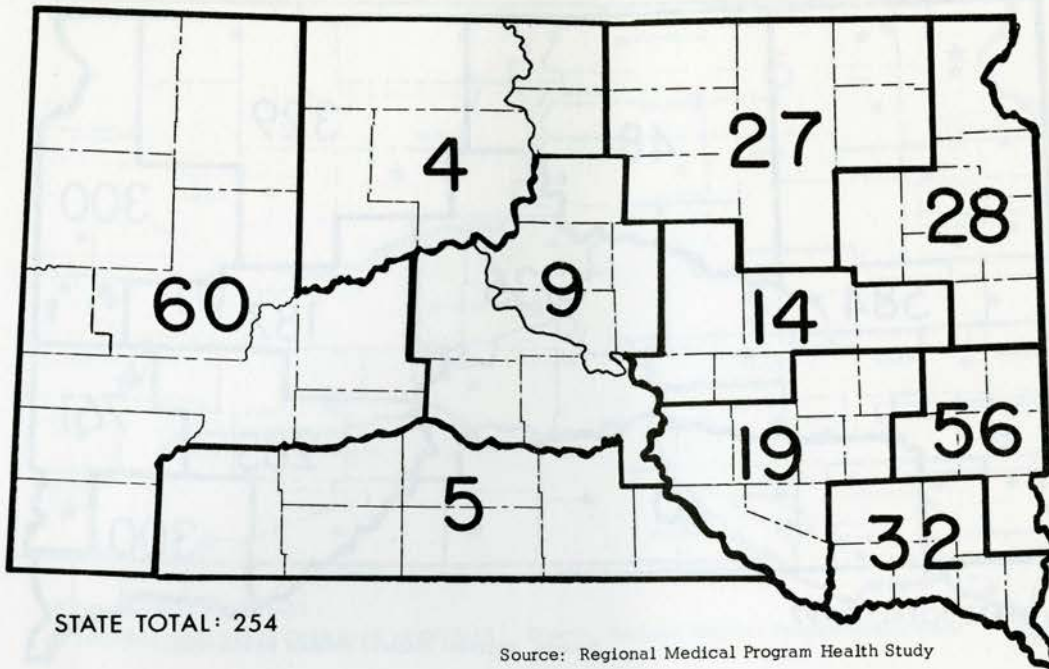

1967

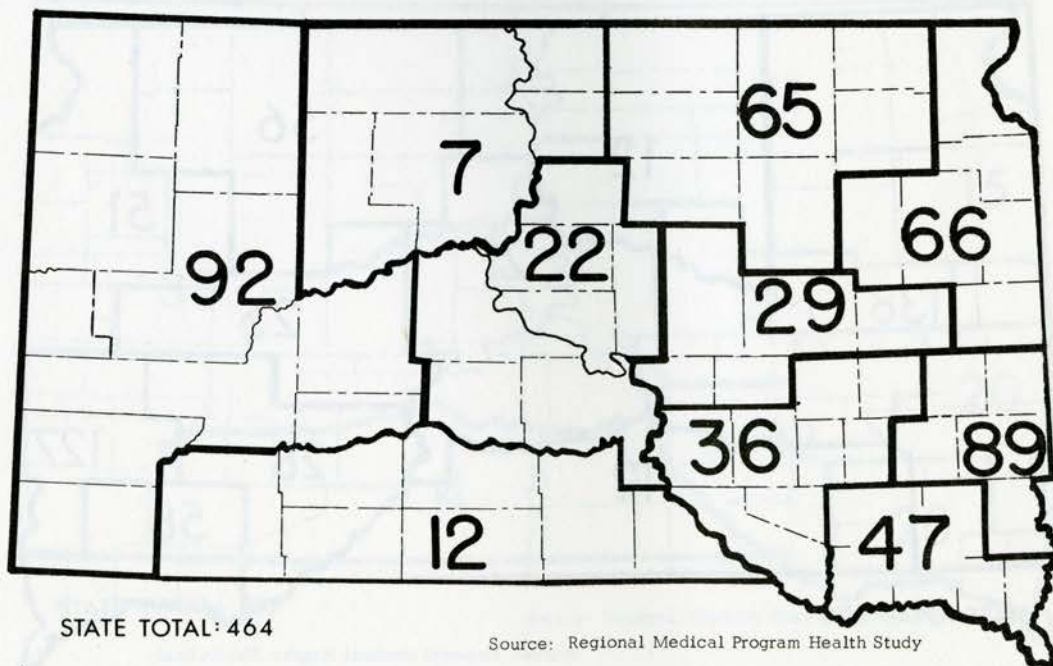

 1967

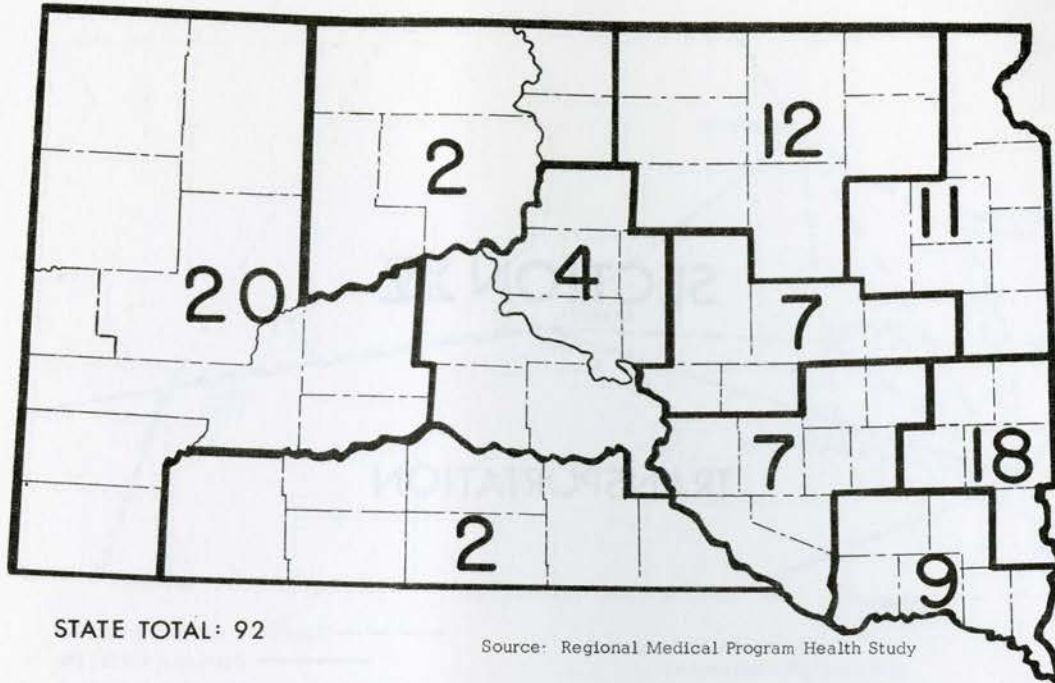
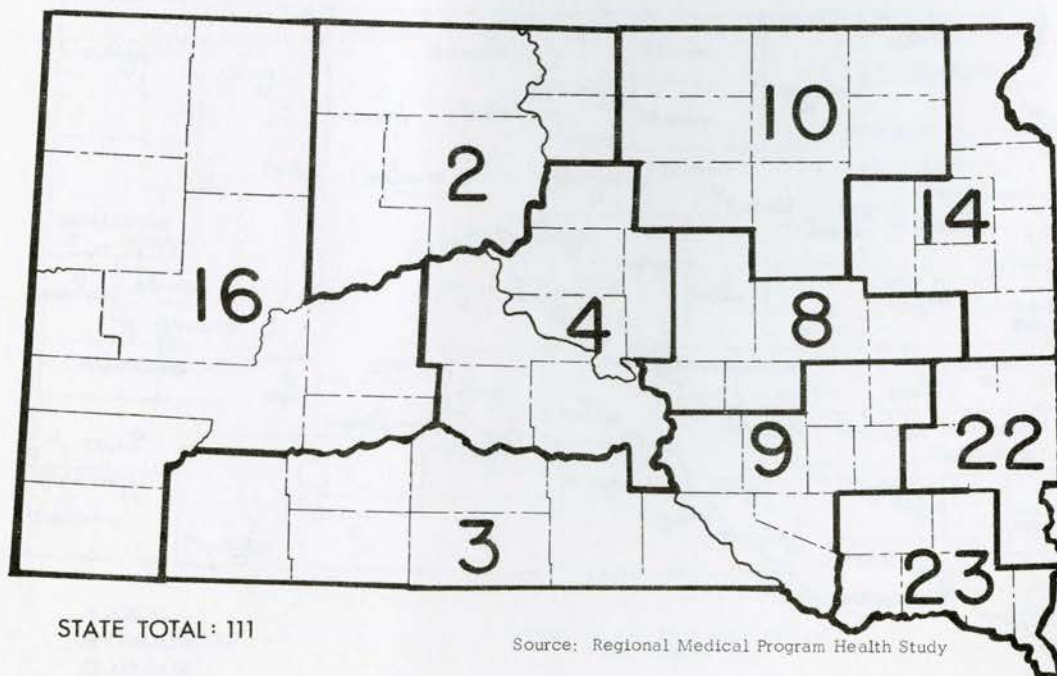


CHART XIV-h

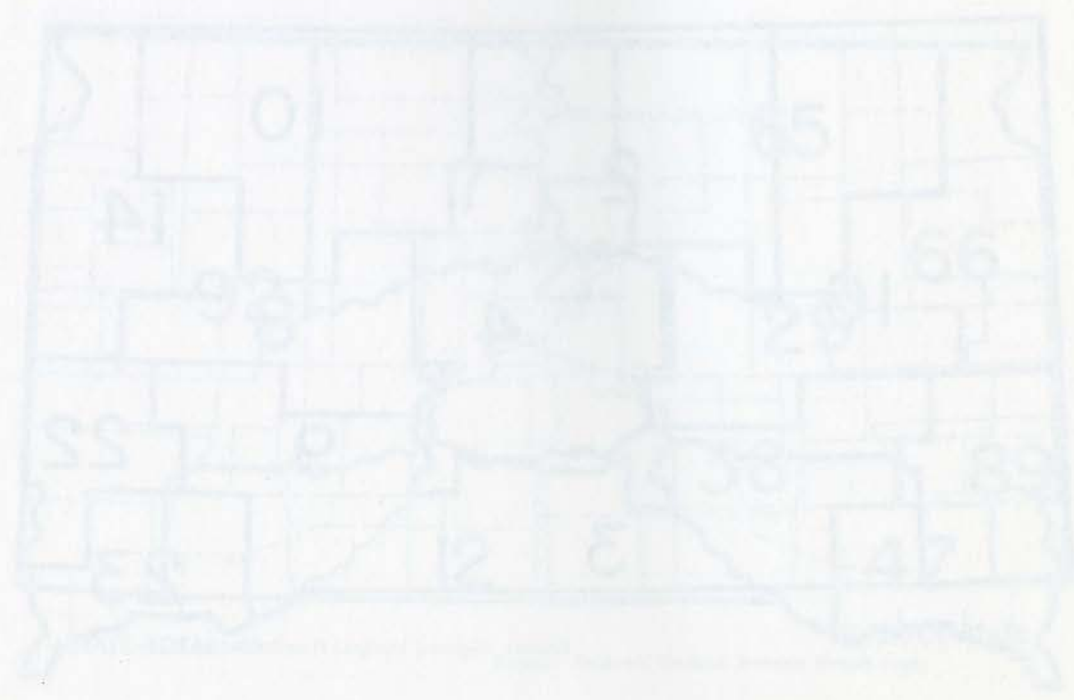

1972

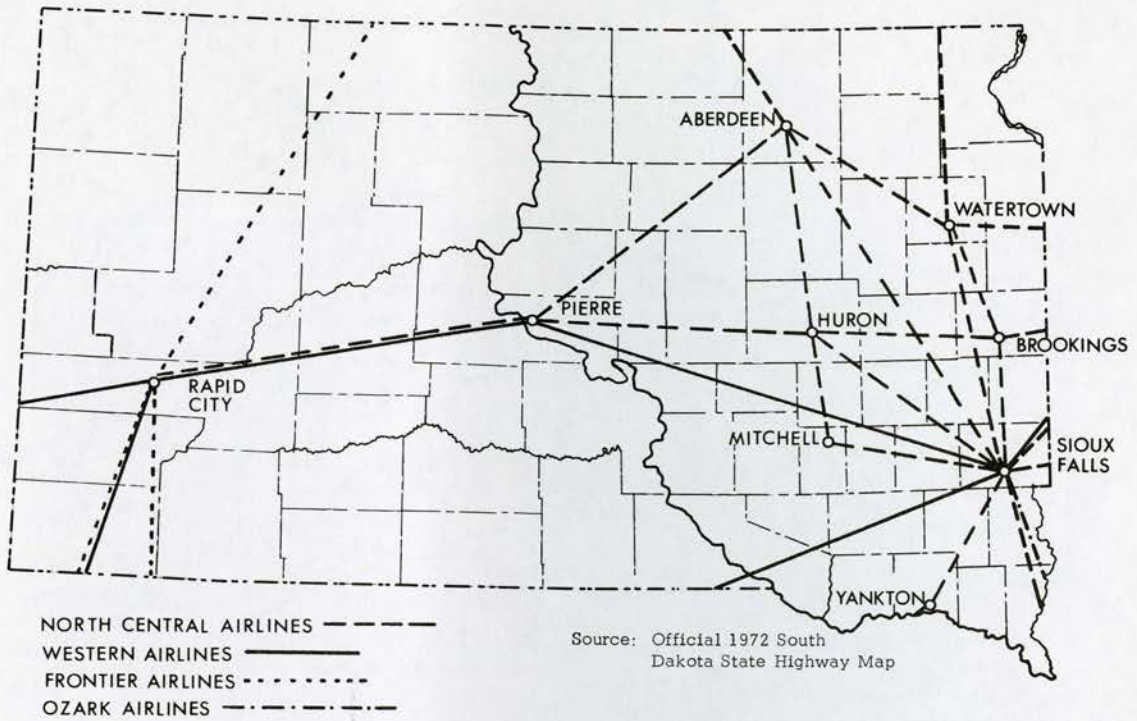

1971

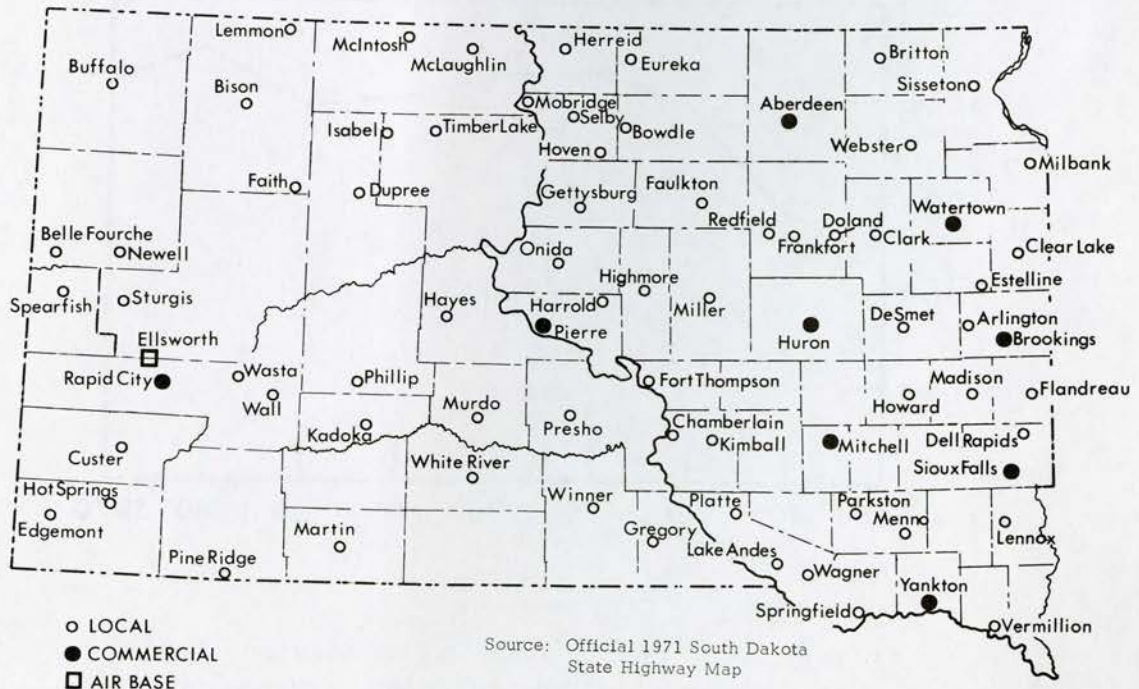

1971

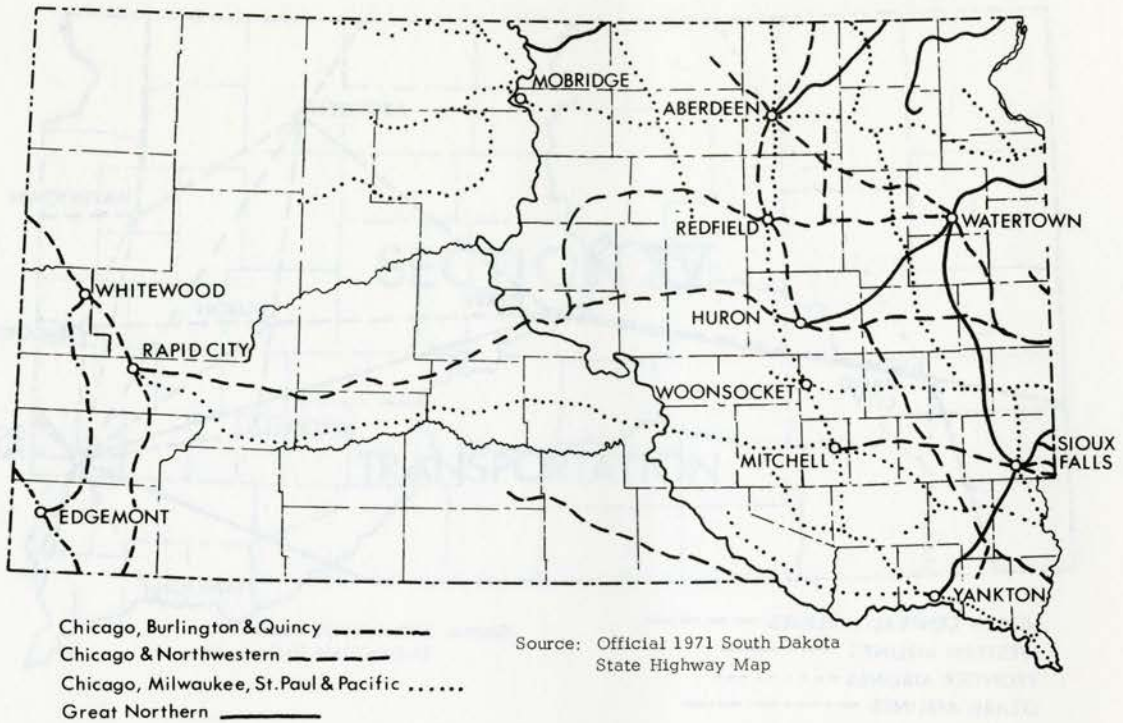
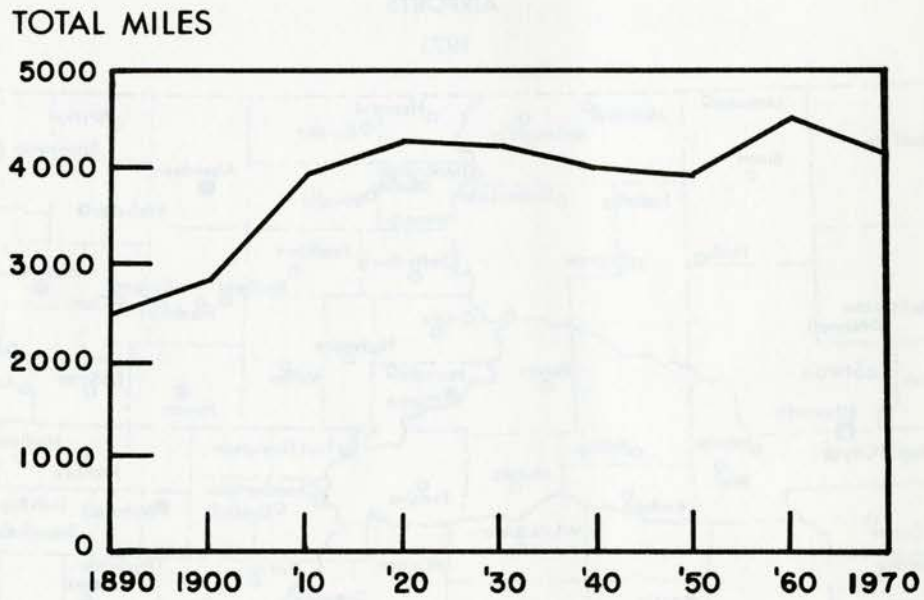

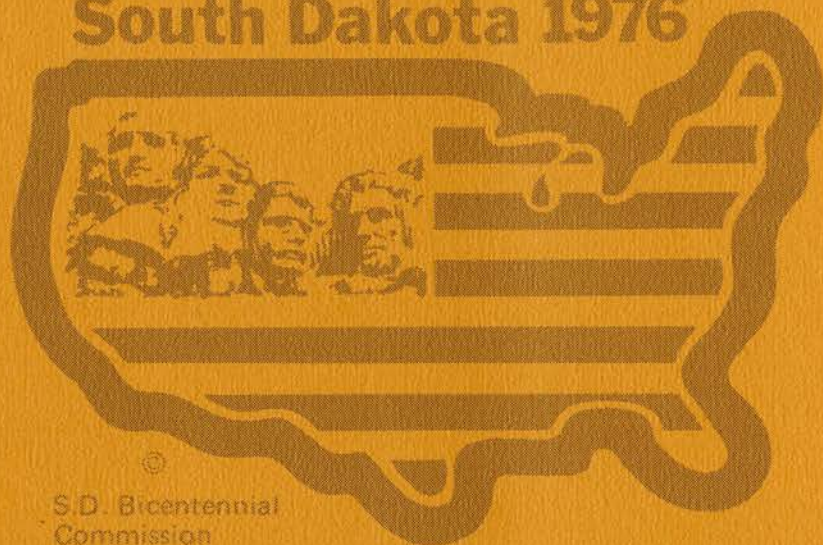
RAILROAD MILES IN SOUTH DAKOTA
